



Shakespeare, The Cotswolds & The Welsh Marches

September 23 to October 4, 2026  From \$7,300 per person

Starting with the iconic Globe Theater along the south bank of the River Thames, we trace William Shakespeare’s journey back to his beginnings in pretty Stratford-upon-Avon, exploring his fascinating birthplace and Anne Hathaway’s idyllic cottage. Continuing to the nearby Cotswolds, we discover how its medieval heritage, rolling countryside, ancient woodland, bubbling rivers and fairytale castles provided the perfect inspiration and setting for the mischief, drama and courtship that the Bard’s plays are so famous for. Our memorable tour is complete with an introduction to the Welsh Marches, a region once dominated by conflict, where spectacular gems such as the Victorian Eastnor Castle and the primarily Tudor Hellens Manor await.

Itinerary

September 23: Depart your home city and arrive the next day in London

September 24: Arrival

Upon arrival at Heathrow Airport, a private transfer will take you to the Hyatt Regency London – The Churchill, where we stay for two nights. In the evening, join the group for a welcome drink and canapés, followed by dinner.

Meals: Dinner

September 25: Globe Theater & the British Library

For our first visit, we head to Shakespeare's Globe on the River Thames, where we enjoy a fascinating tour to learn more about this iconic theater and its most famous playwright; from colourful stories of the original 1599 Globe to the faithful reconstruction process of the 1990s. We then have lunch at riverside pub, boasting wonderful views and fresh seasonal menus, before visiting the British Library, one

of the world’s greatest research libraries. Developed over 250 years, the collections include more than 150 million items in over 400 languages, representing items from every age of written civilisation. From manuscripts and journals to maps and books, there is plenty to discover, including first editions of Romeo and Juliet and Richard III.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

September 26: Banqueting House
After checking out of the hotel, we visit Banqueting House, open once again after an extensive renovation programme. A survivor of the lost royal Palace of Whitehall (the residence of English monarchs from 1530 to 1698), the crowning glory here is the magnificent nine ceiling paintings by Peter Paul Rubens, installed in 1636 and commissioned by Charles I. 13 years later, the Stuart king walked beneath this glorious ceiling to his death after being found guilty of treason, with his execution taking place outside Banqueting House.

Later, we travel to Stratford-upon-Avon and check into Hotel du Vin, where we stay for the next two nights.

Meals: Breakfast

September 27: Shakespeare’s Birthplace, RSC Swan Theater & Shakespeare’s New Place
An exciting day awaits, beginning with Shakespeare’s Birthplace in the heart of Stratford-upon-Avon. We explore the beginning of the Bard’s extraordinary story in the half-timbered house where he was born and grew up in, admiring the treasures of the permanent exhibition and exploring the fascinating room, from the parlour and the bedrooms to the dining room.

Next, we visit the iconic RSC Swan Theater, housed in a Grade II listed building and where Shakespeare’s plays are regularly performed. We are treated to lunch at the rooftop restaurant, with its lovely views and delicious British food.

As part of our Shakespeare’s Story ticket, we also visit Shakespeare’s New Place, the family home from 1597 until Shakespeare’s death in 1616. Although the house was demolished in 1759, a beautiful garden has been designed to commemorate the importance of the site with commissioned artworks plus a sunken Knot Garden and exhibition centre.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch

September 28: Anne Hathaway’s Cottage & Coughton Court
In the afternoon, we travel to Anne Hathaway’s idyllic thatched cottage, the setting of the young Shakespeare’s courtship with his future bride. Here we can see original furniture and rooms, preserved to reflect the 16th-century lifestyle, and uncover the stories of 13 generations of the Hathaway family who lived here. There are also nine acres of beautiful cottage gardens and woodland walks to enjoy.

We continue to the stunning Coughton Court,



where we enjoy an indulgent afternoon tea. Home to the Throckmorton family for 600 years, Coughton is still very much a family home with an intimate feel. While the interior gives us a unique insight into the history of the Catholic faith in this country, the spectacular award-winning gardens feature colourful rose displays in the walled garden, herbaceous borders, a bog garden, orchards and, a lake and a pleasant riverside walk.

Later, we check into the Diglis House Hotel, our base for the next three nights.

Meals: Breakfast, Afternoon Tea, Dinner

September 29: Croft Castle & Newton Court
After breakfast, we head to Croft Castle in Herefordshire, home to the Croft family for almost a thousand years and believed to have been built by a Norman knight (Bernard de Croft). The house’s exterior is an interesting blend of castle and country house, surrounded by historic woodland, farm and parkland, while the interior is a fine example of grand Georgian elegance. We learn more about the captivating history of the family and the house during our guided tour.

Afterward, we head to Newton Court, which sits on a 157-acre Herefordshire farm, for an interesting cider tour to learn about how the Stephens family have been crafting their organic cider here for decades. Be sure to pick up a few treats in the lovely farm shop too!

Meals: Breakfast, Dinner

September 30: Hellens Manor & Eastnor Castle
This morning, we are treated to a private visit to Hellens Manor, a Tudor/Jacobean gem in the Herefordshire village of Much Marcle. Renowned for its spectacular collection of art, discover paintings by the likes of Gainsborough, Van Dyke and Goya, along with the English Renaissance frieze in the panelled Music Room, heirlooms of Anne Boleyn and the supposed haunted bed chamber prepared for Queen Mary Tudor. Outside, the grounds are perfect for a stroll, ranging from ancient Site of Special Interest woodland and wild flower meadows to a rare octagonal dovecote and a knot garden, all framed by the stunning Malvern Hills. We then make our way to Eastnor, a dramatic fairytale castle at the foot of the Malvern Hills, surrounded by a beautiful deer park, arboretum and lake, boasting magnificent views of the rolling countryside. The princely

and imposing fortress (as it was described in 1812 when it was being built to pitch the owner, the 1st Earl Somers, into the aristocracy), continues to be inhabited by the 1st Earl’s descendants; the Hervey-Bathurst family. The State Rooms offer a wonderful dive into this world, adorned with fine art, tapestries and medieval armour.

Meals: Breakfast

October 1: Worcester Cathedral & Hidcote Manor Garden
After checking out of the hotel, we take a guided tour of Worcester Cathedral, which rises majestically above the River Severn. Built between 1084 and 1504, the cathedral represents every style of English architecture, from Norman to Perpendicular Gothic, and boasts royal tombs, medieval cloisters, a Norman crypt and magnificent Victorian stained glass. Next, we head to Hidcote Manor Garden, an exquisite Arts and Crafts garden created by the reclusive American horticulturist, Major Lawrence Johnston. The garden is laid out as a series of colourful and intricately designed ‘rooms’ and features many plants that were collected on Johnston’s trips to far flung places. Afterward, we make our way to Ellenborough Park, where we stay for the next two nights.

Meals: Breakfast,, Dinner

October 2: Sudeley Castle & Snowhill Manor
Today begins with a behind-the-scenes tour of the exquisite Cotswolds gem of Sudeley Castle.

Our next stop is Snowhill Manor, which dates back to the 16th century. This Cotswold manor house was bought by the eccentric Charles Wade for just one purpose; to house the extraordinary treasures he collected over his lifetime.

Meals: Breakfast

October 3: Waddesdon Manor
We make our way to Waddesdon Manor, built by the wealthy Rothschild family in the style of a Renaissance château and one of the National Trust’s most visited properties. Built by Baron Ferdinand de Rothschild in the 1870s, the French-inspired château was lavishly designed to entertain guests and showcase his enthusiastic interest in art. Nestled within 5,000 acres of parkland, the formal gardens are one of the finest examples of late Victorian gardens in England and include a Rococo-style aviary, a Parterre, sculptures and more.

This evening, we stay at Hartwell House & Spa, one of the National Trust’s Historic House Hotels, where we enjoy a farewell dinner together.

Meals: Breakfast, Afternoon Tea, Dinner

October 4: Departure

A private transfer will take you back to Heathrow Airport for your return flight home.

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I make a booking?

Call National Trust Tours at **888-484-8785** to register by phone (preferred method) **Monday - Friday from 9am to 5pm (EST)** or register online at **www.nationaltrusttours.com**.

Please note: featured prices are inclusive of the National Trust membership discount. If you are not a National Trust Member, there is a \$150 increase on the prices shown.

When are payments due?

When you confirm your booking with us, a non-refundable deposit of \$1,000 per person is required to secure your place. The final balance payment must be paid to us no later than 90 days prior to the tour departure date. Of course, full payment can be made at the time of booking if you prefer and for bookings made less than 8 weeks before the tour departs this will be a requirement.

How can I pay?

We accept debit and credit cards for deposits and full payment.

What paperwork will I receive?

When your booking is confirmed, we will email you a booking confirmation document along with a copy of our full Terms and Conditions and the reading list. Approximately 28 days prior to the tour, we will prepare and send you our Travel Pack with your finalized information and tour itinerary details.

Do I need travel insurance?

Yes, this is essential; we can only accept a booking on the basis that you have taken out a full and comprehensive travel insurance policy to cover the full duration of your trip. We will ask you to confirm this to us. If you choose not to take out travel insurance, this is done so against our advice and at your own risk; we will ask you to sign a declination form indemnifying us from any responsibility or cost in the event of medical emergency or repatriation. Information on travel insurance will be sent to you upon tour confirmation. USI Travel Insurance Services offers a plan designed specifically for National Trust Tours travelers. Do I need a passport and visa?

It is your responsibility to ensure you have a full passport and we recommend that it is valid for 6 months after the return date of your trip. At the time of printing, tourist visas are not required for US or Canadian citizens visiting the UK for under 90 days solely for the purpose of tourism. If you are not a US or Canadian citizen or you are combining your visit with business, it is your responsibility to check the requirements for visiting the UK, you can do this by visiting the UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) website to determine whether you need a visa to enter the United Kingdom.

Are there single traveler room supplements?

Yes, you can contact us to enquire about single supplement prices. Please book early as single rooms sell fast.

Are room upgrades available?

All of the hotels on these tours have been hand-picked for their high quality of accommodation and service. However, in some instances room upgrades are available and we would be happy to assist you to arrange these should you be interested. For more information on the hotels please visit our website.

Can you arrange extra hotel nights?

Yes, if you decide to arrive a few days before the start of the tour or leave a few days after the end of the tour, we are happy to arrange extra nights’ accommodation. However, this service is only available at hotels that feature in the tour on which you are traveling and a \$35 administration fee is charged for this service.

Are meals included?

All breakfasts are included on all tours. Certain lunches and dinners are also included and you should study the tour itinerary in this brochure to determine what meals are included on your chosen tour. Meals not mentioned are not included and all beverages are at your own expense throughout the tour.

What do I do about any dietary requirements?

Please inform us at the time of booking, we will pass your information on to the hotel, property or restaurant who will do their best to accommodate your requirements.

How many passengers will be in the Albion Journeys tour group?

Typically, between 10 and 30.

What is the role of the Tour Director?

Our friendly Tour Director will meet you for a welcome dinner at the beginning of each tour. Their role is to facilitate the smooth organization of all operational aspects of the tour. If you have any queries or experience any issues during the tour, they are there to assist you.

Will the excursions change?

Please note that we plan our tours far in advance and the order and availability of excursions may be subject to change. In the event of a property not being available to visit, we will substitute with a similar visit, and you will be informed of the full details.

How much walking will there be on these tours?

As much or as little as you like. Any included guided tours will operate at a fairly relaxed pace, as with many historic houses and gardens, you may experience some uneven flooring and steps along the way. Of course, you will always have the option to explore any venue by yourself at your own pace. If you have any specific concerns, please contact us.

What are the arrangements for luggage?

The standard luggage allowance is one item of hand luggage and one suitcase per person restricted to a maximum weight of 20kgs (44 pounds). We do provide portage at each of the hotels used on our tours where available, however, as with all things of a personal nature, it is your responsibility to ensure your suitcase is loaded onto the vehicles we use throughout the tour.

What clothing should I bring?

Comfortable leisurewear is recommended for the daytime. In the evening many participants prefer to wear smarter dress for dining. While gentlemen may choose to wear a jacket in the restaurant in the evening, at most hotels this is not obligatory, we will of course inform you if any hotel does have a dress code. It is advisable to bring layered clothing and a light waterproof jacket. We recommend sturdy footwear when visiting gardens as the ground may be soft underfoot. Many historic properties request ladies do not wear high heels which may damage flooring.

Can you arrange my flights to the UK?

Albion Journeys do not arrange your air travel for our tours; this is your responsibility and gives you the flexibility to decide on your own routing.

What should I budget for tipping?

While it is not compulsory, it is customary to tip the coach driver and Tour Director as well as offering a small gratuity to the transfer drivers to acknowledge the services they have provided. As a guideline we suggest a rate of £5 (about \$6.50 as of this printing) per day for your coach and transfer drivers and £10 (about \$13 as of this printing) per day for your Tour Director. Gratuities for hotel staff and the tour guides you may meet at properties are at your discretion.

1. VACATION PAYMENT: When you make a booking you must pay a deposit for every person named on the booking. Deposits per person and the balance due date (the period before the departure date on which your full balance normally becomes due) are:

If you cannot make a payment by card at the time of booking, please speak to one of our Reservations staff to discuss other options. You can make payments against your balance anytime between making the booking and the balance due date. For bookings made after the balance due date, the full amount is due at the time of booking.
