

I INVITE YOU TO JOIN National Trust Tours Study Leader David Brown, on a captivating journey through the rich history and vibrant culture of tropical Indochina on our luxurious tour of Vietnam and Cambodia along the majestic Mekong River.

Spend two nights in the bustling metropolis of **Ho Chi Minh City** (still known as Saigon), a dynamic hub that exudes energy, before embarking the **exquisite, 14-suite Mekong Princess**, a riverboat that embodies the gracious heritage and beauty of Southeast Asia, combined with a romantic French colonial style and all the modern comforts. Her small size and ultra-shallow draft allow us to experience this mighty river from an intimate perspective. Throughout the journey, your expert will offer a **series of lectures**, share insights into what you are seeing, and encourage discussions. **Local guides** will accompany you on all excursions.

Cruise the Mekong for seven nights, from Ho Chi Minh City to Siem Reap. The Mekong takes us into the fascinating but seldom-visited world of one of Asia's great waterways. Marvel at floating villages whose residents literally live on the water—working, shopping, and even attending school and church. Tour a family-owned orchard, visit a noodle factory and a coconut candy maker, and experiment with typical Vietnamese ingredients during a cooking demonstration. Conclude the program with three nights in **Siem Reap**, where you can immerse yourself in the world-famous Khmer temples of Angkor, designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Marvel at the remains of different capitals of the Khmer Empire, including the iconic **Angkor Wat** and the Bayon Temple at **Angkor Thom**.

An **optional pre-trip extension** to Hanoi and Ha Long Bay is also available.



Few names over the past twenty-plus years have been as synonymous with the National Trust for Historic Preservation as **DAVID J. BROWN**. David served as EVP and the organization's founding Chief Preservation Officer, where he led the Trust's advocacy, educational, eldwork, research, and historic sites programs. A national leader, speaker, and author with a four-decade record of achievement in saving historic places and supporting thriving communities, David is the founder of Bearden Brown LLC, which works to build nonprofit leadership and grow organizational impact. An affiliate fellow at the American Academy in Rome and a founding board member of the International National Trusts Organization, David brings an international perspective to his discussions of preservation, history, and architecture.

A co-sponsoring expert from the Archaeological Institute of America will also offer lectures throughout the program.

Stay five nights in **exceptional hotels** before and after your cruise, including two nights at the vibrant *Park Hyatt* in Ho Chi Minh City and three nights at the elegant *Raffles Grand Hotel* in Siem Reap.

Benefit from the expertise of **outstanding local guides**, with the added bonus of continuity within each country for a richer, more connected experience.

Travel by sampan, traditional wooden boats, through mangrove channels to visit local coconut candy maker and orchard.

Attend **local cultural performances** such as the children's orphanage dance troupe.

Explore the **UNESCO World Heritage temples of Angkor**, including sunrise views of Angkor Wat from the peaceful surroundings of Ba Kheng Temple.

Experience authentic village life during visits to floating markets, farms and rural villages.

Optional Pre-Tour Extension

FEBRUARY 26 - MARCH 2, 2027

Hanoi and Ha Long Bay

Begin your journey with two nights in Hanoi, including a city tour featuring the Temple of Literature, Hoan Kiem Lake, the "Hanoi Hilton," Ho Chi Minh's mausoleum and stilt house, and a cyclo ride through the Old Quarter, followed by a traditional water puppet performance. Then travel to Ha Long Bay for an overnight cruise aboard the *Paradise Elegance*, featuring a visit to Me Cung Cave, a pearl farm or kayaking, afternoon tea, and a Vietnamese cooking demonstration. Conclude with a morning visit to Ti Top Island before flying to Ho Chi Minh City.

FRIDAY-SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 26 AND 27

Home / Hanoi, Vietnam

Depart home on overnight flights to Hanoi, Vietnam. Upon arrival on February 27th, you will be warmly welcomed at the airport and transferred to the elegant *Apricot Hotel*, ideally located overlooking Hanoi's iconic Hoan Kiem Lake. This refined property blends local art and contemporary design. Check in and enjoy the evening at your leisure to rest and recover from your journey. *APRICOT HOTEL*

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 28

Hanoi

Enjoy a panoramic tour of Hanoi, including key cultural and historical landmarks such as the Confucius Temple of Literature, scenic Hoan Kiem Lake, the infamous "Hanoi Hilton" prison, the mausoleum of Ho Chi Minh, and his humble "House on Stilts." Then, experience the charm of the Old Quarter with an electric cart ride through its narrow, bustling alleyways. Conclude the day with a traditional water puppet performance, an art form unique to northern Vietnam. *APRICOT HOTEL (B,L,D)*

MONDAY, MARCH 1

Ha Long Bay / Embarkation

Drive approximately four hours to Ha Long Bay and board the *Paradise Elegance* for an overnight cruise. In the afternoon, visit a pearl farm or opt for a kayaking adventure. Later, your second stop is Ti Top Island, where you can climb to the top for panoramic views of the surrounding area or relax on the beach. Return to the ship for tea and a cooking demonstration. *PARADISE ELEGANCE (B,L,D)*

TUESDAY, MARCH 2

Ho Chi Minh City / Main Tour

Your excursion this morning is to the enchanting Me Cung Cave, where you can explore its winding passageways, admire the striking rock formations, and take in views of the shimmering lake hidden within this ancient grotto. Disembark in late morning and transfer to Hanoi airport for a two-hour flight to Ho Chi Minh City. Spend the remainder of the evening at leisure. The main group arrives in Ho Chi Minh City today, with the main tour program beginning tomorrow morning. *PARK HYATT HOTEL (B)*

MONDAY-TUESDAY, MARCH 1-2

Home / Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam

Depart home on overnight flights to Ho Chi Minh City. Upon arrival on March 2nd, you will be welcomed at the airport and transferred to the luxurious *Park Hyatt Saigon*, an elegant five-star hotel that blends French colonial architecture with modern sophistication. Nestled in the heart of the city, the hotel offers serene gardens, refined accommodations, and exceptional service. After a brief welcome orientation, spend the remainder of the evening unwinding at your leisure. Dinner this evening will be on your own.

PARK HYATT HOTEL

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 3 Ho Chi Minh City

Today experience an insightful tour of the War Remnants Museum, followed by a panoramic city tour showcasing Ho Chi Minh City's vibrant energy and architectural heritage. After returning to the hotel, enjoy the afternoon at leisure. This evening, gather for a welcome dinner at a nearby restaurant.

THURSDAY, MARCH 4

Ho Chi Minh City / Embarkation

After checkout, enjoy a guided visit to the bustling Ben Thanh Market, a cultural landmark known for its rich array of local goods. Later, transfer to the port and board the *Mekong Princess*, your home for the coming week. Once onboard, you will gather for the first lecture of the program.

MEKONG PRINCESS (B,L,D)

FRIDAY, MARCH 5

Ben Tre / Can Tho

Enjoy a peaceful *sampan* ride through narrow mangrove channels, followed by a visit to a traditional coconut candy workshop and a local orchard. Travel by small boat through winding creeks framed with lush Nipah palms, offering a glimpse into daily life along the Mekong Delta. In the afternoon, cruise onward to Can Tho. Visit the serene Zihuang Pagoda and enjoy a colorful welcome performance featuring a traditional unicorn dance.

MEKONG PRINCESS (B,L,D)

SATURDAY, MARCH 6

Can Tho / Hoa An

Glide on a *sampan* through the floating market in Can Tho, where merchants trade fresh produce from boat to boat. Visit a noodle factory and then a family orchard to see exotic fruits before continuing to Hoa An to explore its flourishing flower gardens and meet craftspeople skilled in traditional mat- and hat-making.

MEKONG PRINCESS (B,L,D)

SUNDAY, MARCH 7

Gieng Island / Hong Ngu

Visit a traditional *sampan*-making village on Gieng Island to observe skilled craftsmen at work. Travel along rural canals, then explore a historic Franciscan monastery. In Hong Ngu, visit a vibrant women's weaving cooperative and a colorful temple dedicated to the Hoa Hao faith. Later in the day, cruise across the border into Cambodia as your journey continues upstream.

MONDAY, MARCH 8

Phnom Penh, Cambodia

Take an authentic cyclo ride through the city to visit the Royal Palace and the Silver Pagoda, followed by a guided tour of the National Museum, home to an impressive collection of Khmer art and artifacts. Enjoy the afternoon and evening at your leisure to explore Phnom Penh independently. Guests may choose to dine ashore and/or experience the city's vibrant nightlife.

TUESDAY, MARCH 9

Phnom Penh

In the morning, visit the Choeung Ek Killing Fields and the Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum, the former Khmer Rouge prison known as S-21. These powerful historical sites offer deep insight into Cambodia's resilient spirit and complex past, providing an opportunity for reflection on the country's journey toward healing and recovery. The afternoon is at leisure to relax or explore at your own pace. This evening, be uplifted by a vibrant performance from children at a local orphanage, showcasing their talents and joy. *MEKONG PRINCESS (B,L,D)*

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 10

Angkor Ban

Start your day with a visit to Angkor Ban village, one of the few communities that was not destroyed during the Khmer Rouge era. Its centuries-old stilted homes stand as a testament to the village's resilience and enduring spirit. Meet local children at a nearby primary school and experience the warmth of rural life along the river. In the afternoon, unwind with a scenic cruise and enjoy a final gourmet dinner aboard the *Mekong Princess*. *MEKONG PRINCESS (B,L,D)*

THURSDAY, MARCH 11

Kampong Cham / Siem Reap

Disembark the *Mekong Princess* in Kampong Cham and journey to Siem Reap. Discover the fascinating history of the Angkor Empire at the Angkor National Museum, home to a remarkable collection of artifacts that bring the region's ancient past to life. Upon arrival, check in at the *Raffles Grand Hotel* for a relaxing evening at leisure. Enjoy some time to unwind or explore the vibrant streets of Siem Reap. *RAFFLES GRAND HOTEL (B,L)*

FRIDAY, MARCH 12

Angkor / Siem Reap

Start the day at Angkor Wat, where the early morning light gently illuminates the temple's majestic silhouette. Then, take a tuk tuk tour through Siem Reap, visiting peaceful monasteries, the Tlai Tno art school, and local artisan workshops. Enjoy the remainder of the evening at your leisure. *RAFFLES GRAND HOTEL (B,L)*

SATURDAY, MARCH 13

Angkor / Siem Reap

Begin the day with a breathtaking sunrise view over Angkor Wat from Ba Kheng Temple. Then enjoy a traditional Khmer gondola ride to Bayon, known for its serene stone faces. Explore the Terrace of the Elephants, part of an ongoing archaeological dig, and visit the atmospheric Ta Prohm, where jungle roots intertwine with ancient stone. Conclude your journey with a festive farewell dinner, savoring the rich flavors of Cambodian cuisine. *RAFFLES GRAND HOTEL (B,L,D)*

SUNDAY, MARCH 14

Siem Reap / Home

Transfer to the airport for your return flight, crossing the International Date Line and arriving home the same day. (B)



The *Mekong Princess* offers 14 luxurious suites combining the elegance of French Colonial style with the peacefulness and comfort of a Southeast Asian spa. All suites have sliding glass doors that open to a French balcony (railing); Angkor Suites also feature a private veranda with seating area. Suites have either twin beds that can be joined as a queen bed, or a king bed; a spacious seating area; en suite facilities with shower (plus separate soaking tub in the Tonle and Angkor Suites), hair dryer, spa robes, and slippers; individual climate control; daily butler service and housekeeping with nightly turndown; in-room safe; and televisions with satellite service.

Breakfast and lunch may be served on deck, and single-seating dinners offer sumptuous French Indochine and gourmet Spa Cuisine featuring locally sourced fresh produce. Public spaces include open-air lounges with comfortable chaises, spa, and small fitness center. The small size and ultra-shallow draft of this elegant riverboat allow for visits to villages and tributaries not accessible to larger vessels, and the one-to-one guest-to-staff ratio ensures an unparalleled river cruise experience.

What to Expect This is a moderately strenuous itinerary that includes physical activity and busy days with considerable walking at certain sites. You may walk up to three miles a day on cobbled streets and uneven surfaces. Elevators may not be available, and stairs may not have handrails. Participants should be in good health and physically active. The average temperature in Vietnam and Cambodia during March is in the mid-80s to low 90s°F, with high humidity and occasional light rain. While the riverboat, hotels, and motorcoaches are air-conditioned, local transport such as cyclos, sampans, and some venues may not be. Travelers should be able to climb in and out of small boats and local vehicles with assistance. The *Mekong Princess* does not have an elevator, so stairs will need to be navigated. Onboard medical facilities are limited.

Air Arrangements

U.S. domestic and international airfare is not included in the program rates. You are also welcome to book your air transportation through your local travel agent, an online travel site, or the airline of your choice. A deposit of \$1,000 per person is required to reserve space on this program.
