

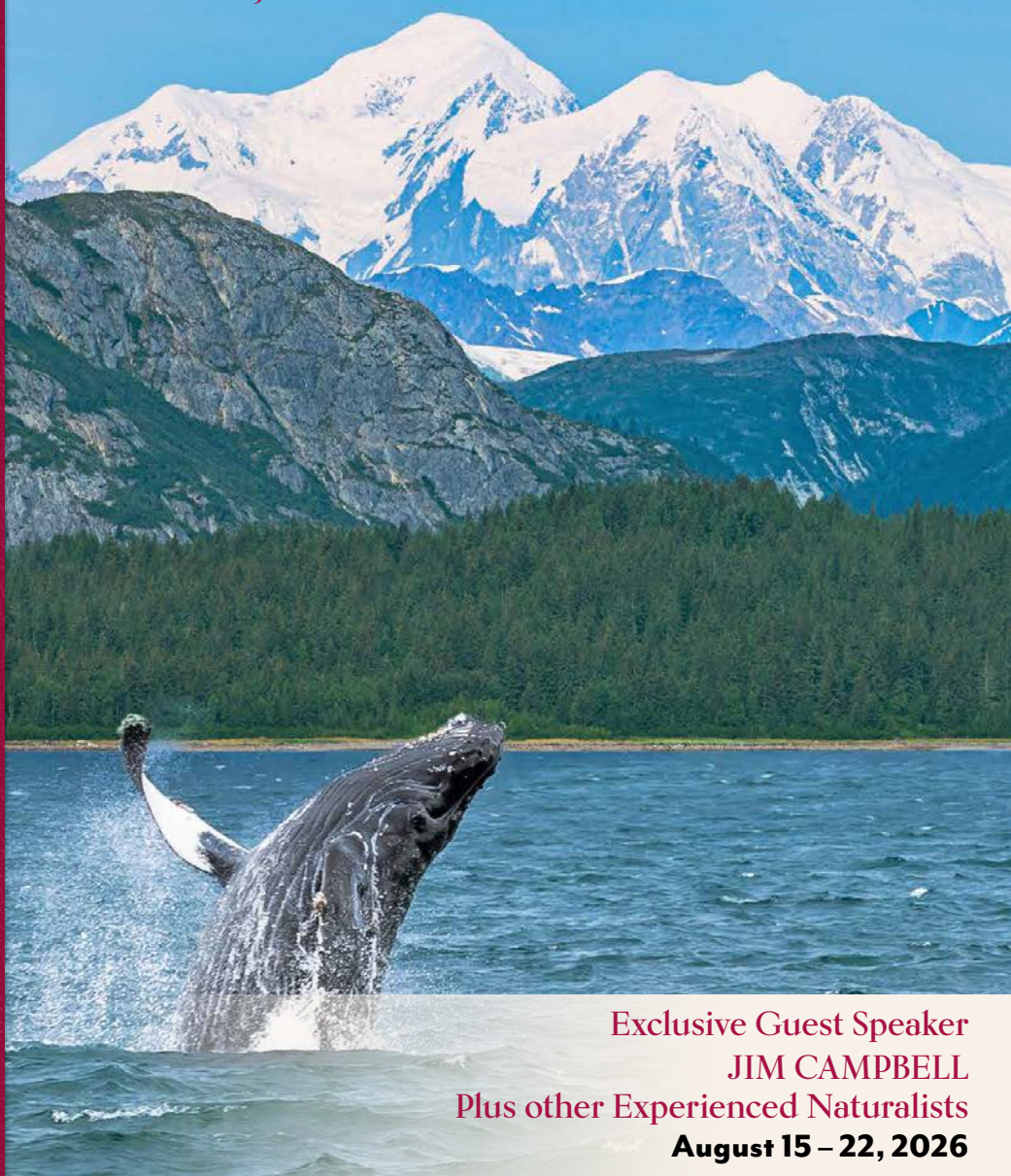

**Day 1 | August 15** L-D

Depart Home City | Juneau, Alaska, U.S. | Embark
Arrive in Juneau, Alaska.
Transfer to the pier to embark the *WindStar Star Seeker*. Settle in and explore the ship. This evening, attend a Welcome Briefing and lifeboat drill, followed by a dinner on board.

Day 2 | August 16 B-L-R-D

Cruising Tracy Arm

As we sail through Tracy Arm, a narrow fjord, notice the sheer cliffs, hundreds of waterfalls, and, of course, the massive blue Sawyer Glaciers. Look for floating icebergs and “growlers” (smaller ice chunks) — these often support harbor seals who perch aboard and cruise the fjord. Tracy Arm hosts an incredible variety of wildlife — mountain goats perched on the cliffs, black and brown bears, whales, bald eagles and much more. This evening, join your fellow travelers for a Welcome Reception and Dinner on board.

Day 3 | August 17 B-L-D

Elfin Cove | Point Adolphus
Visit this unique, vibrant fishing community of only 25 year-round residents. Located across from Glacier Bay National Park and surrounded by Tongass National Forest, this area is loaded with natural beauty and stunning wildlife. In summer, Elfin Cove’s population swells to 200 people or more, lured in by the amazing fishing, hiking and kayaking. The village has a scenic boardwalk that serves as the main highway, since there are no roads or motorized vehicles. Point Adolphus boasts some

of the best whale-watching in North America. The cold, nutrient- dense waters appeal to humpbacks and other species, who come here with their young to feed. You may also see sea lions and sea otters in the water; brown bears fishing or playing on nearby beaches; and a plethora of sea birds overhead.

Day 4 | August 18 B-L-D

Sitka

This fascinating city was part of Russia until 1867, and uniquely blends Russian and native Alaskan culture. Discover pieces of Alaska’s history and culture at the Sitka National Historic Park.

Walk along the lush forest trail, spy the famous totems and watch demonstrations by native Alaskan artisans. Next, learn about the Alaska Raptor Center — and the eagles, hawks, falcons and owls they care for. Return to the ship for a tasty lunch, and spend the afternoon at leisure onboard.

Day 5 | August 19 **B-L-D**

Wrangell

Discover the captivating culture of Wrangell, which has been home to the Tlingit people for thousands of years. Choose an included excursion: Begin at the Wrangell Museum and explore the town's fascinating history as a gold-rush supply town with a blend of Tlingit,

Russian and other cultural influences. Learn about the area's fishing, mining and logging history. Pass through the town and view historic churches, a traditional Tlingit tribal house, the busy boatyard and lovely harbors. Wrap up with a guided walk to Petroglyph Beach State Historic Park, home to rock carvings that are some 8,000 years old. Look for birds, fish, whales, faces and abstract shapes. Alternately, go for a trail walk in the Tongass National Forest. On this guided gentle hike, traverse meadows, forest and distinctive muskeg peatland; learn about the flora and

fauna native to this lush rainforest. Tongass is known for its large population of bald eagles; perhaps you will see some today!

Day 6 | August 20 **B-L-D**

Prince Rupert, British Columbia, Canada

Wake this morning to stunning views as you arrive in Prince Rupert. This charming city is perched on a rugged coastline, surrounded by forests and incredible wildlife. Often called the "City of Rainbows," Prince Rupert is a diverse community with a rich cultural heritage, vibrant arts scene and natural

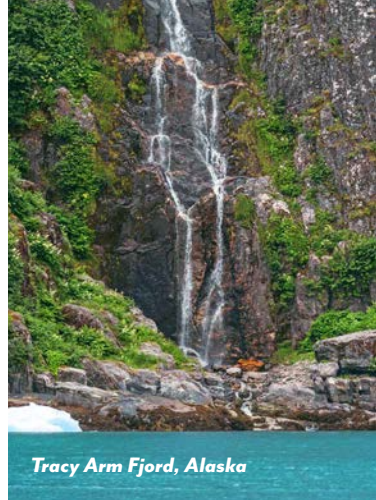

beauty. The waterfront of Cow's Bay is dotted with shops, restaurants, galleries and museums. Nearby is a bear sanctuary, and the waters offshore are filled with porpoises, seals and humpback and orca whales. Choose an included excursion: Take a city tour and visit the Museum of Northern British Columbia, known for its First Nations collection. Alternately, take a tour by vintage trolley, wrapping up at the charming City Sunken Gardens. Return to the ship for a delectable lunch. This afternoon, the ship enters the Inside Passage and cruises Grenville Channel.

Take in the gorgeous views of the surrounding mountains, which are thick with forests, dotted with waterfalls and sometimes tipped in fog. Keep watch for otters, seals, whales, porpoises, sea birds and even bears and moose on shore.

Day 7 | August 21 B-L-R-D

Cruising the Inside Passage
Spend the full day at sea taking in the scenery as we sail the Inside Passage. Carved by the movement of massive glaciers millions of years ago, the Inside Passage stretches 500 miles along the Pacific coast and has been called one of the world's most spectacular waterways. Immerse yourself in views

of the lush coastal forests, icy seas and snow-capped mountains. Today you may also take in onboard lectures and mingle with fellow passengers. Later, gather for a Captain's Farewell Reception and Dinner.

Day 8 | August 22 B

Vancouver |
Return to Home City
Enjoy breakfast on board this morning as the ship arrives in Vancouver, where you will disembark. Transfer from the pier to Vancouver International Airport and take your return flight to your home city.

Denali National Park

August 10 to 15 (Program Begins: August 10)

After a specially arranged stern-wheeler cruise of the Chena and Tanana Rivers, take a scenic journey from Fairbanks to Denali aboard a deluxe dome rail car. On a Tundra Wilderness Tour inside Denali National Park, look for grizzly bears, moose, caribou, Dall sheep, bald eagles and more. Make stops at Talkeetna, base camp for mountaineers climbing Denali, and the Iditarod Headquarters, to learn about Alaska's Last Great Race. Includes an internal flight between Anchorage and Juneau, two nights at *Pike's Waterfront Lodge*, two nights at the *Grande Denali Lodge*, and one night at the *Marriott Anchorage*, inclusive of taxes and service.

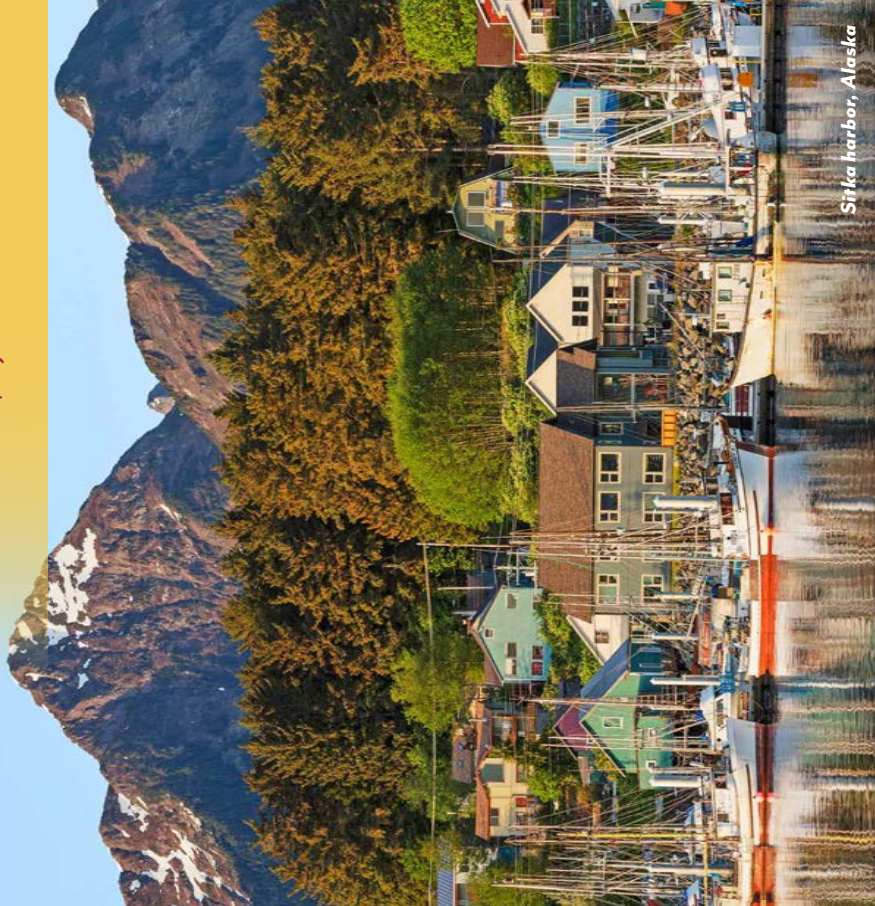
