

volcanic activity and sculpted by the elemental forces of wind and water, the Canary Islands were once thought to be the remnants of the lost continent of Atlantis, poised on the edge of the world. The bustling cities of Morocco showcase the intersection of the country's multicultural origins and its modern progression, from its



famous *souks* to its spectacular mosques. The majestic wonder and history of this captivating region await.







Culinary Fusion

When the Spanish began to colonize the Canary Islands in the 15th century, the archipelago's location along historic Silk Road maritime trading routes placed it in the epicenter of evolving global cuisine. Exotic spices from Africa and Asia found their way to the kitchens of the Canaries. Spanish explorers were also known to pass through the islands on their way back from the Americas, introducing such staples as potatoes

and beans. Fragrant spices like cumin, paprika, saffron, and coriander became part of the daily diet, adding zest to traditional dishes like the salty fish dish sancocho Canario, thick stews known as potajes, and the signature Canarian mojo sauce. Moroccan food today is equally diverse in its heritage with influences from the various traders and conquerors who passed through over thousands of years—a fusion of Mediterranean cuisine with Middle Eastern touches, such as the savory chicken tajine with almonds and prunes that's very popular in Marrakech. Our tour of this captivating



region will include opportunities to sample these culinary delights throughout the cruise and shop for spices at the legendary souk open-air marketplaces in Marrakech—the ultimate way to experience the islands' rich history and cultural traditions.

Depart Home City April 20

Depart your home city for an overnight flight.

Las Palmas, Gran Canaria, Canary Islands, Spain April 21

Arrive in Las Palmas, an attractive town founded by Spanish conquistadors that served as a port for ships sailing around the African continent in 1478. The largest town in the Canary Island chain and a cultural haven in the Atlantic, this lush island also produces grapes, avocados, and tobacco used for cigars said to rival those from Cuba. Check in to the historical, 5-star HOTEL SANTA CATALINA and enjoy an evening at leisure.

Las Palmas/Embark Ship April 22

Spend the morning exploring the island on your own. Embark the intimate WORLD TRAVELLER yacht

in the afternoon and have dinner on board as you cruise to La Palma. (B,D)

Santa Cruz de la Palma April 23

Known as La Isla Bonita, "the beautiful island," for its lushly forested mountain slopes set against a backdrop of bright blue skies and the azure Atlantic waters, La Palma holds an abundance of cultural and natural treasures. Explore the old quarter of Santa Cruz and see its pilarimage center and shrine of La Virgen de las Nieves (Madonna of the Snow), the island's patron saint. Behold sweeping vistas of Santa Cruz from Mirador de La Concepción in Breña Alta and discover La Palma's geologic past with a visit to Mirador de La Cumbrecita, which provides dramatic views of the Caldera de Taburiente. Enjoy time at leisure in Santa Cruz and later,


attend the Captain's Welcome Reception on board. (B,L,R,D)

Santa Cruz de Tenerife April 24

Travel to the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Teide National Park, a wilderness of mineral-tinted rock, ancient lava flows, and distinctive vegetation not found anywhere else. Gaze across the vast caldera of Las Cañadas (dormant since 1909) to the snowy summit of Mount Teide and enjoy a panoramic view of the Roques de Garcia. After lunch at a local restaurant, visit the UNESCO-designated San Cristóbal de la Laguna, a beautiful university town established in 1496 that boasts rich history and extravagant architectural styles. Walk back in time as you stroll through the Moorish 17th-century Canarian courtyards. (B,L,D)







Day at Sea April 25

Enjoy luxury amenities and attend guest lectures on this relaxing day at sea. (B,L,D)

Safi, Morocco, for Marrakech April 26

Head to Marrakech for a full-day excursion into the storied city that blossomed into the hub of the great Berber Empire. Visit masterpieces of Moorish architecture, including the 12th-century Koutoubia Mosque, one of the most impressive sights in ancient Marrakech; and the exquisite Bahia Palace. Enjoy lunch at Palais Gharnata and spend the afternooon exploring Marrakech's markets, or souks, designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and the dramatic Jemaa el Fnaa, "Square of the Dead." (B,L,D)

Casablanca April 27

Take a panoramic drive alona the fashionable Boulevard de la Corniche on an excursion to the cosmopolitan city of Casablanca, Morroco's thriving cultural and commercial center. Visit the impressive Hassan II Mosque—the largest in Morocco and the only one non-Muslims can visit, built on a promontory over the ocean. See elaborate Moorish architecture and landmarks through the city, including the Mohammed V Square and the Arab League Garden. Enjoy an afternoon at leisure to experience the captivating sights and sounds evocative of Humphrey Bogart and Ingrid Bergman's Casablanca. (B,L,D)

Casablanca for Rabat April 28

Gaze in awe at King Mohamed VI's Royal Palace grounds during a scenic drive past the Parliament, the Chellah, and the new opera house. Tour Mohamed V's Mausoleum and the 12th-century Hassan Tower, followed by lunch at La Tour Hassan. You will have free time that afternoon in the walled old town in the medina of the Rabat, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and the neighboring Kasbah des Oudayas—a maze of narrow lanes lined with traditional whitewashed houses. Enjoy dinner on board and attend the Captain's Farewell Reception this evening. (B,L,R,D)

Casablanca/Disembark Ship/Return to Home City April 29

Disembark the ship and fly home or continue your journey with the Post-Program Option in Fez. Morocco. (B)

Las Palmas April 18 to 21, 2024 (Tour Begins: April 19)

Explore historical Las Palmas, the capital city of Gran Canaria, where cobblestone streets and 15th-century colonial architecture tell stories of its iconic past. Walk in the path of Christopher Columbus in Las Palmas' old town of Vegueta with a visit to Casa de Colón, the house where the Spanish explorer is believed to have stayed in 1492 while repairing La Pinta before crossing the Atlantic. Experience some of the Canary Islands' rarely visited sites, including the magnificent Viera y Clavijo Botanical Gardens, the Gardens of the Duchess in Arucas, and Teror's Neoclassical basilica, Our Lady of the Pine—which honors the legend that the Virgin Mary appeared on a pine tree in the center of the village. Spend two nights at the 5-star HOTEL SANTA CATALINA.

Fez

April 29 to May 2, 2024 (Tour Ends: May 2)

Experience the sights and sounds of Fez, the oldest of Morocco's imperial cities, on this three-night tour extension. Travel from Casablanca through Morocco's fortified city of Mekenes before arriving in Fez, a carefully preserved imperial city which embodies the essence of the country. Ancient embattlements still partially enclose the ninth-century, UNESCO-designated Medina of Fez, known as the "Athens of Africa" for its university—the oldest in the world. Visit the Bab Boujloud (the blue gate), the $14^{\rm th}$ century El Bouanania Medersa, and stop by the religious shrine of Moulay Idress II, founder of the city. Accommodations are for two nights in Fez at the 5-star HOTEL SAHRAI and one night in an ideally located hotel in Casablanca.
