
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The lands surrounding the glittering Rhine, Saar, and Moselle rivers are home to many wine regions, each offering a little something different for wine lovers, connoisseurs, and sommeliers alike. UNESCO-inscribed Domaine Croix Duplex offers 31 wines to taste from the Lavaux region, one of the largest wine-growing areas in Switzerland. Traverse along the Moselle River's wine valley, which prides itself in producing quality white wine—among which is the well-known Riesling variety—in some of the coldest climates used for commercial winemaking. Be inspired by the spectacular vineyards surrounding Traben-Trarbach, one of the world's largest wine-trading hubs and home to special celebrations like the Mosel Wine Festival and the Mosel Wine Night Market. In the heart of the Mosel wine region, visit one of many wine cellars in famed wine town Bernkastel-Kues and enjoy a beautiful vineyard-surrounded stroll through Saarburg. Finally, sayor the tastes of Alsacian wine from a local winery.





Rebuilding for Greatness

Many of the architectural wonders that grace the areas near the Rhine, Saar, and Moselle rivers—once completely decimated—rose from their own ashes into the majestic sites they are known as today. Cologne Cathedral, also known as the Kölner Dom and the largest Gothic church in northern Europe, was out of commission for centuries following a 13th-century fire—however, restoration work for the church began in the 1820s and was spurred by a proponent of the Gothic Revival movement, with construction finishing up by 1880. The cathedral was damaged by Allied air raids in 1944 but was restored completely and back in regular use by 1956. Koblenz's Romanesque architecture takes you back to its beginnings in 9 B.C.—most of the city

was destroyed during World War II, though many of its historic buildings were restored and gave the city a more modern look. The Reichsburg Castle in Cochem, which was restored in a neo-Gothic style in the 19th century, was first built in 1000 by the Palatinate Empire and destroyed in the 17th century after French troops took over the town, with the castle still known for its iconic Renaissance and Baroque furniture. Traben-Trarbach's Art Nouveau architecture was born partially due to the once



independent communities joining together as one, thus the need for a bridge uniting the two towns. Transport back in time while admiring the Roman ruins in Trier and be enchanted by Saarburg's "Little Venice" half-timbered and Baroque architecture—along with Vianden Castle, a feudal residence from the Roman and Gothic periods.

12-DAY/10-NIGHT ITINERARY

Depart Home City/ Frankfurt, Germany/ Cologne/Embark May 16 and 17

Depart your home city (5/16) and arrive in Frankfurt (5/17) after an overnight flight. Transfer to Cologne. Embark on the AMADEUS BRILLIANT and enjoy lunch on board before exploring Cologne's Old Town and seeing the UNESCO World Heritage-designated Kölner Dom. Return to the ship for the Captain's Welcome Reception and dinner onboard. (L,R,D)

Lorelei Passage/ Boppard/Koblenz May 18

Admire the splendid Rhine River while cruising the Lorelei Passage and see the quaint villages and castle-dotted hilltops. Stop in UNESCO-inscribed Boppard and see its ancient Roman remains at the Archaeological Park. Stroll through the town and see its storied past and modern-day present come together with its medieval Bingen Gate and current cozy cafés and shopping. See the Ritter Schwalbach Haus, one of the oldest houses in Boppard,

and walk the narrow lanes and the Bingergasse, formerly occupied by wine merchants. Later, take a stroll within Koblenz, positioned at the confluence of the Rhine and Moselle Rivers, and see its impressive Romanesque architecture. Join your fellow passengers for the Captain's Welcome Dinner onboard the ship. (B,L,D)

Cochem May 19

Cruise the romantic Moselle River, the largest tributary of the Rhine River and known for its abundance of vineyards clinging to the steep sides. Enjoy a walking tour of charming Cochem with a visit to the Imperial Reichsburg castle. From the castle, take in the impressive view of its surrounding dreamy forests and vineyards before returning to the ship for lunch and dinner. (B,L,D)

Traben-Trarbach/ Bernkastel-Kues May 20

Lovers of Art Nouveau architecture will rejoice as they take in the beauty of Traben-Trarbach through a walking tour of the town. See splendid mansions once belonging to wealthy wine merchants before returning for lunch onboard the ship. Later, stroll through charming Bernkastel-Kues, known for its medieval marketplace and gabled houses including the *Spitzhäuschen* (Pointed House). Enjoy a wine tasting in one of the town's many wine cellars before returning to the ship for dinner. (B,L,D)

Trier May 21

Saunter through the UNESCO-inscribed Roman sights of Trier, the oldest city in Germany. Admire the Porta Nigra (Black Gate), dating back to the second century, and the Basilica of Roman Emperor Constantine—the largest single-room structure to survive from Roman times. See the 16th-century St. Peter's Fountain, the ornate Rococo Prince Bishop's Palace, and the Imperial Baths before enjoying lunch and dinner onboard. (B.L.D).

Saarlouis/Saarburg May 22

Explore Saarburg—an idyllic town surrounded by forests and Saar Valley wine vineyards that







remained after the Saar Castle above it fell to ruin from the Thirty Years' War. See the town's waterfall in the center of its "Little Venice" and stroll through this picturesque burgh before returning to the ship for dinner onboard. (B,L,D).

Grevenmacher, Luxembourg/ Luxembourg City May 23

Built between the 11th and 14th centuries. Vianden Castle is one of the largest and most astounding feudal residences of the Roman and Gothic periods. Visit the castle once occupied by the ancestors of the current Dutch and Luxembourg royal families and explore its beautiful grounds. Later, head over to Luxembourg City for lunch and discover its historic center. Take in its many stunning views on the Corniche—otherwise known as the "most beautiful balcony of Europe"—and at Constitution Square. Among the many amazing sights of this city tour include the Place d'Armes and the Neumünster Abbey. Join the Captain's Farewell Reception and Dinner onboard. (B,L,R,D)

Grevenmacher/ Disembark/ Strasbourg, France May 24

Disembark the ship at Grevenmacher and transfer via coach to Saarbrücken. Explore the city and its landmarks, including the Baroque Ludwig's Church, along with the restored Saarbrücken Castle's mélange of Baroque, Classicist, and modern architectural styles. After lunch, transfer to Strasbourg, France, and check into the SOFITEL STRASBOURG HOTEL before enjoying dinner on your own. (B,L)

Strasbourg May 25

Explore Alsace's capital city
Strasbourg, situated right on
the Franco-German border.
See Strasbourg's jaw-dropping
Notre-Dame Cathedral, which
survived the French Revolution, the
Franco-Prussian War, and both
World Wars. Walk through the
UNESCO-designated La Petite
France, where medieval houses line
cobblestone lanes and 13th-century
bridges span serene canals. Enjoy

the afternoon at your leisure and lunch and dinner on your own. (B)

Strasbourg/Colmar May 26

Spend the first half of the day exploring the Alsatian wine route and immerse yourself in the region's renowned vineyards. Visit a local winery where grapes are only handpicked and feet-crushed. Following lunch and an Alsacian wine tasting, venture into Colmar to follow the steps of "Statue of Liberty" creator Frédéric Auguste Bartholdi and discover the city's hidden wonders. Join your fellow travelers later for a farewell reception at the hotel before enjoying dinner on your own. (B,L,R)

Strasbourg/Return to Home City May 27

After enjoying breakfast at the hotel, transfer to Frankfurt Airport and board your overnight return flight to your home city. (B)

The English-speaking, international crew provides warm hospitality. The AMADEUS fleet has earned the "Green Globe Certificate" of environmental sustainability. Suites include a private balcony, and select staterooms feature a unique floor-to-ceiling window that lowers to French-balcony height at the touch of a button.
