Join us for a cruise down the mighty Mississippi River from Memphis to New Orleans aboard the 185-berth *American Splendor*. Built in 2016 in the classic paddle-wheeler style, *American Splendor* offers modern amenities alongside 19th-century riverboat opulence and features stylish cabins, fine cuisine, and lively performances by onboard musicians.

Begin in Memphis, Tennessee, home to Elvis' Graceland, and uncover its diverse heritage while strolling iconic Beale Street or exploring notable sites such as the Stax Museum of American Soul Music or the National Civil Rights Museum. Embark American Splendor and cruise downriver visiting sugar plantations, Creole cottages, and lush landscapes of Bayou country. In Cleveland, Mississippi, choose to visit the Grammy Museum, take a guided tour of the Mississippi Blues Trail, or venture to Mound Bayou, an all-Black community considered an oasis during the turbulent beginnings of the Civil Rights Movement. See where the Battle of Vicksburg raged for 47-days before Union forces secured control of the Mississippi River. Continue to Natchez and discover how its architectural grandeur reflects the prosperous Steamboat Era of the early 1800s. Downriver in St. Francisville and Vacherie, Louisiana, investigate magnificent mansions and historic plantations, including Oak Alley and Creole Laura Plantation. The journey concludes in New Orleans in the architecturally distinct French Quarter. On optional tours, admire the gorgeous homes and landscapes of the Garden District and visit the renowned National World War II Museum.

An incredibly rich educational program makes this Mississippi River cruise an experience like no other. Begin with a keynote address in Memphis by Presidential Historian and Pulitzer Prize-winning author, **Doris Kearns Goodwin**, and throughout the voyage, enjoy panel discussions and opportunities for direct engagement with an outstanding lineup of lecturers including historian and study leader **John Meffert**. This unique journey along one of North America's great waterways is expected to sell out, so we encourage you to reserve your space today!

Special Guest Lecturer



DORIS KEARNS GOODWIN is a world-renowned presidential historian, public speaker, Pulitzer Prize-winning and #1 New York Times best-selling author, and a partner in Pastimes Productions. Goodwin is often called upon by the news media, late-night TV hosts, and hundreds of companies, educational institutions, government agencies, and nonprofits to share her

vast knowledge of leadership and provide historical context for current-day events.

Her eighth book, *An Unfinished Love Story: A Personal History of the 1960s*, was published in Spring 2024 and became an instant #1 New York Times bestseller. Artfully weaving together biography, memoir, and history, this new book takes readers on the emotional journey Doris and her husband, Richard (Dick) Goodwin, embarked upon in the last years of his life as they delved into more than 300 boxes of letters, diaries, documents, and memorabilia that Dick had saved for more than fifty years. The Goodwins quickly realized they had before them an unparalleled personal time capsule of the 1960s — the events and pivotal figures of the decade: John Kennedy, Jacqueline Kennedy, Martin Luther King Jr., Robert Kennedy, Eugene McCarthy, and especially Lyndon Johnson, who greatly impacted both their lives.

Goodwin previously authored six critically acclaimed and New York Times bestselling books, including the Carnegie Medal-winner, The Bully Pulpit: Theodore Roosevelt, William Howard Taft, and the Golden Age of Journalism and Team of Rivals: The Political Genius of Abraham Lincoln. Team of Rivals is often cited as an inspiration for business and political leaders, including President Barack Obama, and was awarded the prestigious Lincoln Prize, the inaugural Book Prize for American History, and Goodwin in 2016 was the first historian to receive the Lincoln Leadership Prize from the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library Foundation. Goodwin was awarded the Pulitzer Prize in History for No Ordinary Time: Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt.

Doris Kearns Goodwin has served as a consultant and has been interviewed extensively for PBS and the HISTORY Channel's documentaries on Presidents Johnson, both Roosevelts and Lincoln, the Kennedy family, and for Ken Burns' "The History of Baseball" and "The Roosevelts." Goodwin has received numerous awards for her books and career, including the inaugural American History Book Prize from the New-York Historical Society, the Gold Medal for biography from the American Academy of Arts and Letters, and most recently the Washington Irving Medal for Literary Excellence from the Saint Nicholas Society of the City of New York for An Unfinished Love Story. Goodwin graduated magna cum laude from Colby College and was invited to deliver the commencement address there in 2024. She earned a Doctor of Philosophy degree in Government from Harvard University, where she taught Government, including a course on the American Presidency.







ITINERARY

TUESDAY, MARCH 3 **Home/Memphis, Tennessee**

Depart home and arrive in Memphis independently and check into the Guest House at Graceland. Just steps away from Elvis' Graceland, this property reflects Elvis' iconic style combined with the Southern charm of Memphis. This evening, meet fellow travelers at a festive welcome reception and dinner, featuring a keynote address by eminent Pulitzer-winning historian Doris Kearns Goodwin. The Guest House at Graceland (R,D)

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 4 **Memphis, Tennessee**

Following an opening lecture, spend the morning exploring Memphis' diverse heritage. Choose between three optional tours: 1) Stroll down Beale Street, the home of the blues and the birthplace of rock 'n' roll; 2) Visit the Stax Museum of American Soul Music, which has preserved a multitude of soul music artifacts within vibrant and interactive exhibits; or 3) Tour the National Civil

Rights Museum, a moving and historically significant museum built on the site of the former Lorraine Motel. where Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated in 1968. In the afternoon, board the American Splendor and begin the journey down the mighty Mississippi River.

THURSDAY, MARCH 5 Cleveland, Mississippi

Today the American Splendor arrives in Cleveland, Mississippi. Choose between a visit to the Grammy Museum, a guided tour along the Mississippi Blues Trail, or an excursion to the nearby town of Mound Bayou, an all-Black community known as an oasis during the turbulent beginnings of the Civil Rights movement. American Splendor (B,L,D)

FRIDAY, MARCH 6 Vicksburg, Mississippi

During the Civil War, Vicksburg served as a key to Union victory as General Grant's successful 47-day siege in the summer of 1863 brought control of the Mississippi River. Today visit the National Military Park, considered the best-preserved battlefield in the United States; the ironclad gunboat Cairo; and the Lower Mississippi River Museum, with exhibits depicting life in historical Vicksburg and an aquarium featuring local fish species. Later, explore Vicksburg's historic downtown area independently.

SATURDAY, MARCH 7 Natchez, Mississippi

Having suffered little destruction during the Civil War, Natchez is home to the largest concentrations of restored pre-Civil War properties in the United States. Today visit your choice of three of these historic homes: Longwood, with its unique octagonal design; Rosalie, which served as Union headquarters during the Civil War: and Stanton Hall, constructed in 1851 and regarded today as one of the most opulent historic mansions in the country. There will also be an opportunity for free time in central Natchez with an optional lunch ashore. American Splendor (B,L,D)

SUNDAY, MARCH 8 St. Francisville, Louisiana

Today visit the once-thriving cotton port of St. Francisville to learn about the town's rich legacy. In the Historic District, take optional excursions to magnificent mansions and plantation homes including a walking tour of historic St. Francisville: Rosedown Estate and Garden, one of the few privately maintained formal gardens of the 19th century;

Myrtles Plantation, reputed to be one of the most haunted homes in America; the Oakley Plantation, the home of John James Audubon: and Port Hudson Historic Site. where you will learn about the culminating battle and Campaign to open the Mississippi River. American Splendor (B,L,D)

MONDAY, MARCH 9 Vacherie, Louisiana

Disembark on the west bank of the Mississippi River to explore historic Oak Alley, a grand Greek Revival plantation home famous for its namesake double row of 18th-century canopy oak trees lining the approaching path. Nearby Laura Plantation, a restored Creole plantation, is a fascinating contrast to Oak Alley, illuminating the personal stories and culture of its inhabitants and boasting twelve buildings on the National Register of Historic Places, including slave quarters. For those that feel adventurous, embark on a swamp tour through the ecologically rich Louisiana Bayou and navigate through cypress and pine for an upclose look at waterfowl and

other Bayou creatures. Arrive late this evening in New Orleans, where American Splendor will remain docked for the next two nights. American Splendor (B,L,D)

TUESDAY, MARCH 10 New Orleans, Louisiana

Spend the day exploring New Orleans with optional tours of the extravagantly styled and landscaped Garden District and the highly acclaimed National World War II Museum. Here immersive galleries tell the story of American courage and sacrifice in the war that changed the world. American Splendor will remain docked overnight, allowing for time to enjoy all that New Orleans has to offer. American Splendor (B,L,D)

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 11 **New Orleans, Louisiana/** Home

After breakfast disembark and transfer to the airport for afternoon flights home.






AMERICAN SPLENDOR

WHAT TO EXPECT

We consider this to be a moderately active program, with considerable walking at some destinations. Daily activities can involve up to two miles of walking, unaided, over varied terrain (e.g., uneven walkways, steep and sandy trails, dirt streets and paths in some locations). Participants must be physically fit, in good health, and capable of undertaking this level of activity without assistance from tour staff. In March, the weather is generally mild and comfortable, with high temperatures usually in the mid-70s, and rain is always a possibility.

GROUP SIZE

This program can accommodate 160 participants and is co-sponsored with other organizations.
