In March 2025, you're invited on an unforgettable, once-in-a-lifetime journey to Cuba. Just 90 miles from Florida yet seemingly worlds away, this Caribbean nation weaves a spell with its tropical beauty, faded grandeur, and irrepressible spirit. Travel with National Trust on a six-night, behind-the-scenes journey based in the enchanting city of Havana. Experience a country that has captured the global imagination—a nation frozen in time yet filled with infectious energy, exceptional hospitality, brilliant pastel hues, salsa rhythms, and groundbreaking art.

Go behind the scenes of leading museums and historic treasures guided by Cuban scholars, who will illuminate the country's history and distinctive mix of African, Indigenous, Spanish, and French influences over four centuries. You'll be inspired by Cuba's marvelously preserved historic architecture spanning from Baroque cathedrals to gleaming Art Nouveau confections. Join an architectural historian as you stroll through Havana's UNESCO-listed historical center, following cobblestoned pathways into the roots of this city founded in 1519.

You will also witness aspects of modern Cuba that few visitors see. Attend private receptions with local luminaries and engage with workers at privately owned businesses for enlightening talks about the state of the nation. You'll find joy in seeing Cuban artists pursue their dreams and welcome you into their homes to see their creative works.

From Havana, we'll traverse the countryside, where the Viñales Valley's spectacular *mogotes* (limestone hills) create an otherworldly landscape. Discover Ernest Hemingway's Cuba at his rustic villa, Finca Vigía, along with the charming fishing village of Cojímar, the setting for *The Old Man and the Sea*, which will transport you into the pages of his novels. On an exclusive tour of a tobacco *hacienda*, local farmers will share an insightful look at the cultivation of Cuba's most famous crop.

Your home base will be the boutique La Reserva Vedado hotel, nestled in Havana's historic Vedado district. As the sun sets over Havana each evening, dine at *paladares* (restaurants inside local homes). We hope you can join this unforgettable cultural adventure in March 2025, as Cuba's warm citizens welcome you to Havana.

Cuba: Art, Culture & History In Support of the Cuban People

SUNDAY, MARCH 23: DEPARTURE / HAVANA, CUBA

Upon your independent arrival in Havana, you will be greeted at the José Martí International Airport and transferred to La Reserva Vedado, the boutique hotel that will be our home for six nights. This evening, gather for our welcome dinner at a *paladar*, a privately owned restaurant in the proprietor's home, largely staffed by family members. D

MONDAY, MARCH 24: HAVANA

Founded in 1519, Havana remains the Caribbean's most impressive historical urban center. Join a local architectural historian for a lecture on the history of the city's remarkably well-preserved buildings. Then depart on a walking tour of UNESCO-listed Old Havana and four of its expansive plazas: Plaza de Armas, Plaza Vieja, Plaza de San Francisco, and Plaza de la Catedral. Each plaza features distinctive architecture, including centuries-old cathedrals and colorful colonial houses adorned with arcades and balconies.

Following lunch at a *paladar*, take a private tour inside the splendidly renovated, Neo-Baroque Gran Teatro de La Habana Alicia Alonso, the incredibly ornate home of the Cuban National Ballet. Then explore the homes and studios of some of Havana's leading artists, where there may be an opportunity to purchase paintings and drawings. Dinner is at El Cocinero, followed by an evening of entertainment next door at Fábrica de Arte Cubano (FAC), the city's liveliest multidisciplinary performing and visual arts space.

TUESDAY, MARCH 25: HAVANA / VIÑALES / HAVANA

As a marked change of pace from Havana, set forth on a morning ride aboard a motor coach through the countryside, arriving in the western province of Pinar del Río, known for its lush tobacco *haciendas*. Admire the unique topography and natural beauty of the Viñales Valley. The most striking sights are the region's UNESCO-recognized *mogotes*, distinctive hills towering as high as 1,000 feet, with steep, almost vertical sides. Meet with farmers for a private tour of their tobacco *hacienda* to learn

about the drying and rolling processes, followed by lunch at a privately owned organic farm. Before returning to Havana, visit the studio of a local painter who has charted the history of his community through his work. Tonight, enjoy dinner on your own.

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 26: HAVANA

Take an inside look at the Museo Nacional de Bellas Artes de La Habana (National Museum of Fine Arts of Havana), Cuba's largest museum, with a private morning tour of its Cuban art collection at the Palacio de Bellas Artes. In the company of an independent curator, trace Cuba's history, from the 17th century to the present, through the works of its greatest artists. Highlights include the modern paintings of Raúl Martínez, known as Cuba's answer to Andy Warhol, as well as the avant-garde canvases of 20th-century painter Amelia Peláez, and works by the revered Afro-Cuban surrealist Wilfredo Lam, who was influenced by Picasso.

After lunch, walk down Calle Obispo, Havana's main shopping street; explore a local design shop; and speak to the owners about small business practices in Cuba. In the early evening, drive to The Ludwig Foundation of Cuba, one of only a few Cuban NGOs, for a presentation on Cuban art. The Foundation's President will host a cocktail reception and buffet dinner on the penthouse terrace, where guests will include local Cuban artists. This evening, you may opt to attend a performance at one of Havana's famed music venues, including the legendary Tropicana.

THURSDAY, MARCH 27: HAVANA / SAN FRANCISCO DE PAULA / COJÍMAR / HAVANA

Head outside of the capital to the small, hilltop village of San Francisco de Paula. Here, take an inside look at Finca Vigía (Lookout Farm), Ernest Hemingway's residence for two decades. Initially rented for Hemingway's partner Martha Gellhorn in 1939, Finca Vigía soon became the writer's property after their relationship ended. Hemingway lived at the seaside villa with his last wife Mary, who lovingly tended to the home. His classic works, *For Whom*





the Bell Tolls and The Old Man and the Sea, were written here in its breezy rooms and shady porticos. With its pastel walls, dark wood furnishings, and high ceilings, Finca Vigía exudes an airy timelessness. View the rooms through open windows from the surrounding terraces; see Hemingway's famous fishing boat *Pilar*; and climb the tower to his study.

Our excursion concludes with a brief visit to the village of Cojímar, the setting for *The Old Man and the Sea*. After lunch, return to Havana and gather for a lecture on the island's current realities by a former ambassador who was once Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs. In the early evening, attend a private after-hours tour and reception at the Museo Nacional de la Cerámica Contemporánea Cubana, housed in the 18th-century Casa Aguilera, followed by dinner at a local *paladar*.

FRIDAY, MARCH 28: HAVANA

Delight in exclusive access to an informal morning rehearsal of the Rosario Cárdenas Dance Company, featuring some of Cuba's most gifted contemporary dancers. Afterwards, visit the Colón Cemetery with a local guide. With its ornate tombstones commemorating Cuban heroes, statesmen, and novelists, this cemetery is sometimes called the largest sculpture park in Cuba. Following lunch on your own, visit a private classic car workshop, NostalgiCar, where some of the city's finest vintage cars are repaired and refurbished.

Next, explore the renowned Hotel Nacional de Cuba. Designed by the acclaimed New York firm of McKim, Mead & White, this 1930 architectural masterpiece features a medley of styles, including Sevillian, Roman, Moorish, and Art Deco. Stop in its storied Hall of Fame to see tributes to its many famous guests, including Buster Keaton, Rita Hayworth, Nat King Cole, Sir Winston Churchill, Jean-Paul Sartre, Simone de Beauvoir, and Gabriel García Marquez. Enjoy a *mojito* on a terrace overlooking Havana's harbor before dinner. This evening, celebrate with a festive farewell dinner at one of Havana's excellent *paladares*.

SATURDAY, MARCH 29: HAVANA / RETURN

Depart the hotel this morning for the flight home.
