


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The Galapaguera de Cerro Colorado on San Cristóbal Island is a tortoise reserve, sanctuary and breeding center. Established in the early 2000s by the Galápagos National Park Service, the center is dedicated to the preservation and breeding of the endangered giant tortoise.

In the 18th and 19th centuries, the Galápagos giant tortoises were subject to overexploitation for food by sailors and pirates. Today, their main threats are invasive species, habitat loss, the illegal wildlife trade and poaching. Similar to centers found on Santa Cruz and Isabela islands, the goal of the Galapaguera de Cerro Colorado is to enhance the survival rate of hatchlings in the wild, thus increasing the island's tortoise population.

Resident tortoises and their hatchlings live in the sanctuary's semi-natural habitats. While adults can roam throughout the reserve, free to wallow in mud pools, baby tortoises live in protected breeding enclosures. Once juveniles are large enough to survive, typically at around five years old, they are re-introduced into the wild.

Through enriching exhibits and informative presentations, visitors can learn about the history and biology of the giant tortoises as well as the conservation efforts and challenges faced in protecting them.

The Incomparable Galápagos Islands

An astonishing vision of life without human presence, the Galápagos Islands represent a truly unique environment. Located six hundred miles off the coast of Ecuador, the archipelago's isolation combined with the nutrient-rich waters of the Humboldt Current have created one of the world's richest marine ecosystems. Darwin's "living laboratory," the Galápagos Islands spurred the naturalist's paradigm-shifting work, On the Origin of the Species. Published in 1859, his speculations on natural selection in the role of "aboriginal creations, found nowhere else," inspired one of the most revolutionary scientific theories in history. One of the first and most treasured UNESCO World Heritage Sites, the Galápagos sustains an astounding number of endemic species that continue to thrive with the absence of natural predators.

2025 | 10-DAY/9-NIGHT ITINERARY

Departure/Arrive Quito, Ecuador Day 1 | Feb. 2

Depart your home city, and arrive in Quito, Ecuador.
Transfer to **Swissôtel Quito** and enjoy a day at leisure, with lunch and dinner on your own.

Quito Day 2 | Feb. 3

Begin with a walking tour of Quito, taking in the UNESCO-designated historic city center as well as La Ronda, one of the city's oldest streets. Learn about — and taste! — local chocolate. Visit the Middle of the World equatorial monument and museum. Tonight, meet your fellow guests at a Welcome Reception. (B,R)

Quito/Baltra Island Day 3 | Feb. 4

This morning, transfer to the Quito airport for your included flight to Baltra Island,

Santa Cruz Island Day 4 | Feb. 5

Start the day with a visit to Tortuga Bay, boasting a white coral sand beach, turquoise water and an abundance of wildlife. Look for marine iguanas, green sea turtles and birds such as blue-footed boobies, brown pelicans, Darwin's finches and flamingos. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant, then spend the afternoon at your leisure. (B,L)

Baltra Island/ Embark La Pinta/ South Plaza Island Day 5 | Feb. 6

This morning, transfer to **La Pinta**, a sailing vessel with the

amenities of a large ship but the exclusive feel of a yacht. Settle in and savor a delectable lunch on board as we sail to South Plaza Island. During a guided nature walk on the island, be on the lookout for endemic giant Opuntia cacti, a variety of birds and iguanas. (B,L,D)

Santa Fé Island/ San Cristóbal Island Day 6 | Feb. 7

This morning on Santa Fé Island, choose between snorkeling, swimming or taking a glass bottom boat ride — whatever your choice, you are sure to encounter amazing wildlife! You might see playful sea lions, colorful fish, sharks and stingrays. After lunch on board, sail to San Cristóbal Island and visit Galapaguera de Cerro Colorado, an important tortoise reserve and sanctuary. (B.L.D)

San Cristóbal Island Day 7 | Feb. 8

On a guided nature walk, meet and learn about a raucous group of bachelor sea lions. Encounter hardy plants that thrive on the volcanic lava, and an impressive bird population — notable since three species of boobies happily co-exist here. After lunch on board, take a Zodiac ride along



the cliffs, with stops for nature walks on shore. Keep your eyes peeled for graceful rays, sea turtles, Sally Lightfoot crabs and a multitude of bird species. (B,L,D)

Española Island Day 8 | Feb. 9

During this morning's guided walk, experience two notable natural wonders. This area is the breeding site for nearly all the world's waved albatrosses. The birds, who have the largest wingspan in the Galápagos,

Disembark ship/Baltra Island/Guayaquil Day 9 | Feb. 10

This morning after breakfast on board, disembark La Pinta. Stop at the Charles Darwin Research Station, learning about conservation efforts and observing awe-inspiring giant tortoises, as well as land iguanas and birds. Take your included flight to Guayaquil. Transfer to the *Hilton Colon* Guayaquil Hotel. After settling into the hotel, spend the evening exploring the area, and make your own dinner plans.(B)

Guayaquil/Depart for Home City

Day 10 | Feb. 11

After breakfast, check out of the hotel and transfer to the airport for your return flight home.

La Pinta is designed to navigate the narrow channels, shallow bays and environmentally sensitive waters of the Galápagos Islands.

Employing the latest in sustainable cruising technology to protect the archipelago's delicate ecosystem, the ship maintains the highest international safety standards.

All luxury accommodations are ocean-view with a floor-to-ceiling window and air-conditioning. Included meals, featuring international and Ecuadorian specialties, are served in the ship's restaurant. Between excursions, guests may enjoy leisure time in the ship's bar, outdoor dining terrace, observation deck, natural history library with Wi-Fi access, fitness center, two hot tubs and two lounges.
