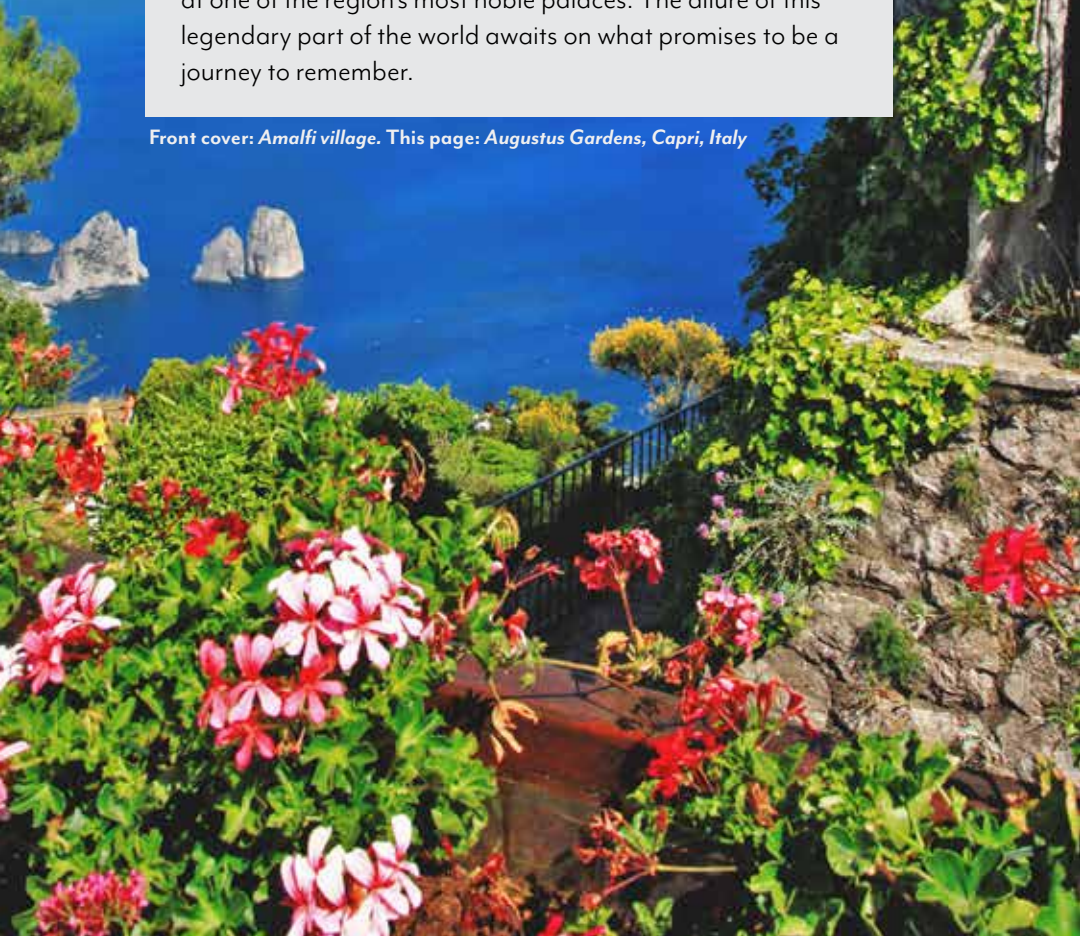

Dwight David Eisenhower II

Grandson of General and President Dwight D. Eisenhower, Dwight David Eisenhower II is a noted historian of World War II and the Cold War. His 1986 bestseller, "Eisenhower: At War 1943–1945," was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in History. Eisenhower received a B.A. in history cum laude from Amherst College. Following graduation, he served in the United States Naval Reserve for three years as an officer on the USS Albany; shortly afterward, he earned his J.D. cum laude from The George Washington University Law School. Today, Eisenhower is Senior Fellow of the Foreign Policy Research Institute and a Public Policy Fellow at the Annenberg School of Communication and the School of Arts and Sciences at the University of Pennsylvania, where he teaches "Communication and the Presidency."

Historical Museum of the Landing in Sicily 1943

Meet Professor Eisenhower on a specially arranged visit to the **Historical Museum of the Landing in Sicily 1943**, which chronicles the Allied battles on the southern coast of Sicily in July 1943. The fragrant aroma of bougainvillea and lemon blossoms fills the air as you travel along Italy's divine Amalfi Coast, a UNESCO World Heritage site. According to Greek legend, it was on these spectacular shores that Hercules chose to bury his beloved Amalfi, a nymph who died at a young age. Enjoy jaw-dropping views of the opulent villas, terraced vineyards and sun-drenched beaches that make it so famous on a panoramic drive along the Tyrrhenian Sea. The cliffside villages that dot this picturesque coastline flourished from Roman occupation in the fourth century through the Middle Ages to modern times, resulting in a vibrant *mélange* of culinary traditions and architecture. Your Amalfi Coast excursion includes a visit to the medieval town of Amalfi, often referred to as the "Pearl of the Mediterranean." After a short orientation tour, you will have some time to peruse the village's artisanal boutiques or enjoy its seaside vistas. Have your cameras ready for a morning of breathtaking beauty amid a resort ambiance like no other.

Day 1 | June 27

Rome, Italy/Embark Ship

Day 2 | June 28

Arrive in Rome, Italy. Embark the *World Navigator*. (D)

Sorrento for Pompeii

Day 3 | June 29

Enjoy breakfast with views of Sorrento, the scenic gateway to Mount Vesuvius and Pompeii. Explore the ancient petrified city of Pompeii on foot to see the wealthy Vetti family estate, the extraordinary amphitheater and Temple of Jupiter. Later this afternoon, immerse yourself in Sorrento's local traditions on a walking tour through the historical old town that includes a chance to learn the secrets of limoncello and experience

a tasting of the popular Italian liqueur. Later this evening you may enjoy a traditional tarantella performance, featuring traditional Neapolitan songs and dance. Join fellow guests tonight for the Captain's Welcome Reception. (B,L,R,D)

Amalfi Coast/Amalfi/ Isle of Capri

Day 4 | June 30

Admire the natural splendor of the Amalfi Coast on a scenic drive to the medieval village of Amalfi, where you may enjoy time on your own to explore the charming boutiques and cafes. Later this afternoon we sail to Capri — the island where, legend has it, Homer's Odysseus resisted the alluring call of the sirens. Visit the Augustus Gardens, a series of

serene, flower-filled terraces that afford breathtaking panoramas. You will also see the ancient perfumery of Carthusia — the smallest fragrance laboratory in the world. (B,L,D)

Palermo

Day 5 | July 1

Visit Palermo's Baroque square and the 12th-century Duomo of Cefalù cathedral. Step inside the Palatine Chapel, a 12th-century masterpiece that reflects Sicily's diverse origins with European, Sicilian, Byzantine and Arab influences. At the Capo market, see revered Palermo street food and admire colorful stalls. After a tasting nearby, visit the UNESCO-designated Cathedral of Monreale — one of the greatest examples of Norman architecture and known for its Byzantine mosaics. (B,D)

Giardini Naxos/ Taormina/Catania

Day 6 | July 2

Be on deck this morning as we cruise past the Aeolian Island of Stromboli, the “Lighthouse of the Mediterranean.”

Travel to Taormina, where a guided walking tour takes you along the Corso Umberto to the archaeological site of the Roman Odeon, built in 21 B.C. Visit the remarkably preserved Greco-Roman Theatre, the most dramatically sited Greek theater in the world that’s still in use today, and explore the 14th-century Corvaia Palace. Return to the ship for lunch on board, followed by an excursion with Guest Speaker Dwight David Eisenhower II to visit the Historical Museum of the Landing in Sicily 1943 in nearby Catania. (B,L,D)

Syracuse

Day 7 | July 3

Discover the city’s ancient past on a visit to the Neapolis Archaeological Park, containing some of Syracuse’s most important ruins. See the Altar of Hieron II, a monument dedicated to Zeus and used for public sacrifices, and the Ear of Dionysius, a limestone cave carved out of the Temenites hill. Later you will travel to the small island of Ortigia for a walking tour that includes the sixth century B.C. Temple of Apollo, a cathedral containing the ruins of a fifth century B.C. temple dedicated to the goddess Athena and the Piazza Archimede. Enjoy a wine tasting on a visit to one of the most noble palaces in the area, hosted by Baron Beneventano, a leading wine producer. (B,L,D)

Valletta, Malta

Day 8 | July 4

Disembark for an excursion that includes a stroll through the 16th-century Barrakka Gardens. Also visit the Grandmaster’s Palace, the former residence of the Order of the Knights of St. John, and the St. John’s Co-Cathedral with its two large bell towers. Admire the lavishly ornamented interior and see Michelangelo Merisi da Caravaggio’s only signed work, the dramatic “Beheading of John the Baptist.” Later this evening, attend the Captain’s Farewell Reception. (B,L,R D)

Valletta/Disembark Ship/Return to Home City

Day 9 | July 5

Transfer to the airport after breakfast for a return flight to your home city. (B)

Rome

June 24 to 28, 2025 (Program Begins: June 25)

Begin your Mediterranean tour with three nights in the UNESCO-inscribed “Eternal City” of Rome, which features spectacular Baroque landmarks from centuries as a nucleus of culture, religion and political power. Travel to the Colosseum, one of the new Seven Wonders of the World, followed by a tour of the Roman Forum. Immerse yourself in Vatican City, the smallest country in the world and home to the opulent Vatican Museums, on a tour that includes a visit to Michelangelo’s Sistine Chapel. Stroll the Piazza Trinita, see the iconic Spanish Steps and toss a coin into the legendary Trevi Fountain.
