

GUEST SPEAKER

DR. PÁLL EINARSSON

Dr. Páll Einarsson, Professor Emeritus in Geophysics at the University of Iceland, has had a long and award-winning career as a teacher and scientific researcher. He attended the Reykjavík Conservatory of Music, majoring in cello and music theory, then earned a B.A. equivalent in physics, with minors in mathematics and chemistry, from Germany's University of Göttingen. He went on to receive a master's degree and Ph.D. from Columbia University, studying seismology, geology and physics. He has published numerous scientific papers in international journals. His main research topics are earthquake prediction, volcanoes and volcanic eruptions and crustal structure.





The lush, green archipelago of 18 islands known as the Faroes were formed by volcanic activity over a few million years, some 55 million years ago. Glaciers carved its captivating cliffs, waterfalls and rocky coastlines. These little-known islands, tucked between Norway and Iceland, were settled by the Norse in the ninth century, and remained isolated for centuries. The Faroese language spoken today derives from Old Norse, which was spoken by the Norsemen who settled the islands 1200 years ago.

The name Føroyar, or Faroe, is Old Norse for sheep, which continue to outnumber residents by nearly two to one. The steep cliff faces — a hallmark of the islands' geography — are home to thousands of seabirds, and hikers and birdwatchers are drawn to the archipelago. Today, the self-governing Faroe Islands — now part of the Danish realm — continue to attract visitors with their authentic Faroese culture, warm hospitality and breathtaking natural beauty.

Depart Home City Day 1 | June 11

Depart your home city for Bergen, Norway.

Bergen, Norway Day 2 | June 12

Arrive at Bergen Flesland Airport. Transfer to the deluxe **World Traveller**. Settle in and enjoy dinner on board the ship tonight. (D)

Lerwick, Shetland Islands, Scotland

Day 3 | June 13

Enjoy a delicious breakfast on board this morning, and every morning of the cruise. Disembark in Lerwick, for a coach tour to the island's southernmost point. En route, pass the magnificent Mousa Broch — the tallest and best-preserved broch in the world — and St. Ninian's

Isle, where the famous Pictish hoard of silver, dating from the ninth century, was found in 1958. Next, embark on a guided visit to the remarkable archaeological site of Jarlshof. This extraordinary settlement embraces more than 4,000 years of human history. Look for sightings of Shetland's famous ponies as you travel back to the ship. Tonight, join your fellow passengers for a Welcome Reception and Dinner on the ship. (B,L,D,R)

Tórshavn, Faroe Islands, Denmark

Day 4 | June 14

Explore the island of Streymoy. Begin in the municipality of Tórshavn, founded by Norsemen in the 10th century. Navigate the narrow, historic lanes of Tinganes, which are bordered by traditional grass-roofed houses. Transfer to Kirkjubøur to visit the ruins of St. Magnus Cathedral and the 900-year-old Roykstovan, the oldest wooden house in Europe. After lunch at a local restaurant, continue to Kollafjørður to view a traditional Faroese church and visit the Dúvugarðar, a national heritage museum, located in the remote village of Saksun.(B,L,D)

At Sea Day 5 | June 15

Spend today cruising toward lceland. Enjoy the amenities on the ship, perhaps indulging in a sauna or a dip in the hot tub. Spend some time on deck with a book or watching the horizon. Savor three delicious meals on board. (B.L.D)





Seyðisfjörður, Iceland Day 6 | June 16

Seyðisfjörður boasts mountainous scenery, lively cafes, a bounty of local handicrafts and traditional Icelandic architecture. Enjoy a specially arranged cultural and musical performance, featuring Icelandic songs. Take advantage of time at leisure to explore more of the town. Witness the picturesque Blue Church with its trademark rainbow pavement leading down to the street. Return to the ship for lunch onboard. Spend your afternoon cruising and marveling at the passing coastline. (B,L,D)

Akureyri Day 7 | June 17

The 100-foot-wide horseshoe-shaped Goðafoss waterfall is a spectacular

sight. The falls are fed by the Skjálfandafljót River, which runs across a lava flow created several thousand years ago by a volcanic eruption. Gaze across the plain and at the thundering falls — whose name means Waterfall of the Gods — perhaps feeling rising mist and thrumming from the rushing water as it falls 40 feet into a placid pool below. Travel to Namaskard, a high-temperature thermal field where the sulfur cauldrons, fumaroles, mud pots and land colored by minerals in shades of red, yellow, green and orange create an otherworldly landscape. Continue to Dimmuborgir to admire and walk among dramatic lava rock formations. The lava field, filled with pillars, towers, caves and other structures, was created by a volcanic eruption

about 2,000 years ago. The strange dark shapes resemble a dark castle, or *Dimmuborgir* in Icelandic. Tonight, join your fellow passengers for a Farewell Reception and Dinner on the ship. (B,L,R,D)


At Sea Day 8 | June 18

Reykjavík, Iceland **June 19 to 21, 2025** (Program Ends: June 21)

Explore the captivating city of Reykjavík and its surrounding natural wonders. Begin with a city tour, stopping at the iconic Perlan museum and the National Museum. Then on a full-day excursion to the legendary Golden Circle, visit the UNESCO-listed Þingvellir National Park, which is both geologically dramatic and historically significant. Gaze at the Strokkur geyser and behold breathtaking Gullfoss, a spectacular double waterfall. *Parliament Hotel Reykjavík*.
