Experience the best of New Zealand and its three main islands, the North Island, South Island, and Stewart Island, on this unforgettable 14-day cruise aboard the Kiwi-owned and operated *Heritage Adventurer*. This spacious and comfortable vessel contains a full fleet of 14 Zodiacs, allowing all passengers ample opportunity for exploration.

Begin with one night in Queenstown, the country's adventure capital, then embark on a 10-night cruise from Fiordland National Park to Auckland, calling at Milford Sound, Doubtful and Dusky Sounds, Stewart Island, Dunedin, Christchurch, Marlborough Sounds, Wellington, and Rotorua. A diverse menu of excursion options offers generous access to the island nation's dramatic glacial fiords, geothermal wonders, cultural richness, and untamed wilderness. On naturalist-led Zodiac expeditions, observe some of the world's rarest wildlife species in their natural habitats. Visit the rarely accessed Stewart Island and take a guided walk in Rakiura National Park, with its stunning coastal rainforest. In the breath-taking Marlborough Sounds, walk ashore on the Queen Charlotte Track, ranked one of the top ten walks in New Zealand.

You will be joined by expert study leaders throughout this program who will offer a series of illustrated lectures and informal discussions along the way. There will also be opportunities to join a pre-trip extension in Queenstown and a post-trip extension to the Bay of Islands. Highlights

- **VISIT** Fiordland National Park over two full days with time in the iconic Milford Sound, the stunning and remote Doubtful Sound, as well as the largest and most spectacular of the fiords, Dusky Sound.
- **ACCESS** seldom-visited Stewart Island for guided walks in the pristine coastal rainforests of Rakiura National Park.
- **OBSERVE** some of the world's rarest wildlife in their natural settings, including the Royal Albatross and Yellow-Eyed Penguin.
- **MARVEL** at sheer cliffs punctuated by crashing waterfalls and native species on naturalist-led Zodiac expeditions.

Queenstown

Tuesday-Wednesday, November 11-12

DEPART U.S.

Depart the U.S. on overnight flights to Queenstown, located on New Zealand's South Island. Lose one day crossing the international date line. (MEALS ALOFT)

Thursday, November 13

QUEENSTOWN, NEW ZEALAND

Arrive in Queenstown and transfer to Novotel Queenstown Lakeside Hotel, ideally situated in the heart of Queenstown. This evening, gather for a welcome orientation and casual reception to meet fellow travelers.

Friday, November 14

BLUFF

This morning enjoy a walking tour of Queenstown with local guides, including a scenic gondola ride to the top of Bob's Peak for spectacular views of Queenstown, Lake Wakatipu, and the surrounding mountain ranges. In the afternoon depart by motorcoach for a 3.5-hour drive to Bluff, where you will embark *Heritage Adventurer*. Gather on deck for cocktail hour as the ship departs for Fiordland National Park, and later, attend the Captain's welcome reception and dinner.

Saturday-Sunday, November 15-16

**FIORDLAND NATIONAL PARK:
DOUBTFUL, DUSKY & MILFORD SOUNDS**

Spend two full days exploring the incredible wilderness of Fiordland National Park, New Zealand's wildest, most remote region, by Zodiac and by foot. Cruise the iconic Milford Sound, a spectacular fiord in the shadow of Mitre Peak. HERITAGE ADVENTURER (2B,2L,2D)

Monday, November 17

STEWART ISLAND

Zodiac ashore to seldom-visited Stewart/ Ulva Islands, an ornithologists' delight. Follow local naturalist guides on bush walks in Rakiura National Park and then enjoy free time to explore the small village of Oban.

HERITAGE ADVENTURER (B,L,D)

Tuesday, November 18

DUNEDIN

Learn about and see nesting Northern Royal Albatross at the Royal Albatross Centre, the only mainland breeding colony of these incredible birds. Journey to OPERA (Otago Peninsula Eco Restoration Alliance) to encounter rare and endangered yellow-eyed penguins up close in their rehabilitation center, learn about the organization's conservation efforts, and take a nature walk through the reserve. After lunch enjoy a guided tour and free time to explore the exhibits at Tūhura Otago Museum, showcasing the unique

nature, culture, and history of Southern New Zealand. *HERITAGE ADVENTURER* (B,L,D)

Wednesday, November 19
LYTTLETON / CHRISTCHURCH

Anchor in Lyttleton and travel by coach to Christchurch with a quick stop at the Cardboard Cathedral, followed by an Ōtautahi Culture Walk through the city's revived central district, led by guides who will share traditional Māori and Settlers stories and ways of life. At the Kate Sheppard House, learn how the pioneering suffragist and her fellow campaigners organized their movement to secure the vote for women, resulting in New Zealand becoming the first country in the world to grant women the right to vote in 1893. Lunch will be off the ship at Riccarton House, a unique heritage site, and there will be some free time at the Arts Centre to shop and explore. *HERITAGE ADVENTURER* (B,L,D)

Thursday, November 20
MARLBOROUGH SOUNDS

Take Zodiacs to Ship Cove and choose from different hike options on New Zealand's famed Queen Charlotte Track. Here scout for rare birds and other native wildlife. This evening arrive in Wellington and either join an optional post-dinner Zealandia by Night Tour to search for nocturnal species (added cost) or explore the nightlife of New Zealand's capital city independently. *HERITAGE ADVENTURER* (B,L,D)

Friday, November 21
WELLINGTON

Today take guided walking tours of Wellington of varying lengths, ride the cable car to the lookout perched high above the city, and then stroll down the hill through the beautiful Botanic Gardens established in 1868. Enjoy a guided tour and free time at the renowned Te Papa Tongarewa National Museum. *HERITAGE ADVENTURER* (B,L,D)

Saturday, November 22
AT SEA

Today at sea, relax and take advantage of the ship's many amenities as the educational program continues. *HERITAGE ADVENTURER* (B,L,D)

Sunday, November 23
TAURANGA (ROTORUA)

Disembark in Tauranga and drive to Rotorua, the rich heartland of Māori culture. Learn about Māori customs and traditions at Te Pā Tū, a village nestled within a native Tawa forest. Meet tribal leaders, enjoy a cultural performance of song and dance, and dine on a Māori fusion lunch. Visit Waitapu Thermal Wonderland to see some of Rotorua's famed geothermal features, where boiling mud pools and colorful hot springs provide remarkable evidence of the still-hot magma just beneath the earth's surface. Back on board, celebrate your New Zealand adventure with fellow travelers during the Captain's Farewell reception and dinner. *HERITAGE ADVENTURER* (B,L,R,D)

Monday, November 24

Disembark in Auckland and transfer to the airport for flights home or extend your stay in Auckland. Recover one day upon return. (B)

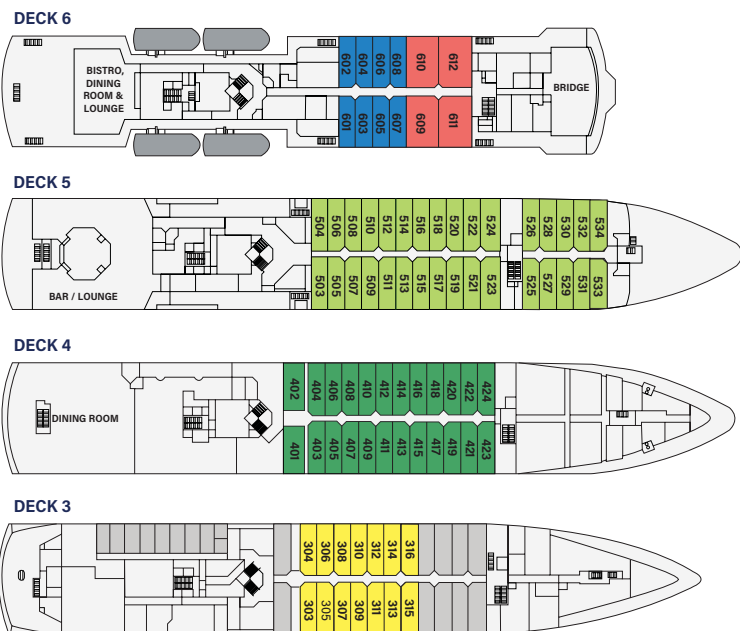

The *Heritage Adventurer*, formerly known as MS *Hanseatic*, was originally designed to accommodate 184 guests, but has since been reconfigured to **welcome just 140 passengers**, providing plenty of space for a comfortable voyage. A full fleet of 14 Zodiacs allows for all passengers to maximize their time to explore.

All cabins aboard *Heritage Adventurer* offer living and sleeping areas with a king or two single beds, ample storage, a writing desk, and a modern ensuite bathroom. Public spaces and open decks abound, including two separate bar and lounge areas featuring 180-degree views and the open-topped Observation Deck for 360-degree views. Meals are served in the gourmet restaurant and in the indoor/outdoor bistro—both options offer plenty of seating and large picture windows. Additional amenities include an open-air saltwater pool that can be heated or chilled, a hot tub encased in glass for all-weather use, a dry-heat Finnish sauna, a European steam room, a well-equipped gym, and a spa.

WHAT TO EXPECT

We consider this program to be moderately active. Much of the touring is done by motorcoach, but some excursions may require standing for long periods of time and/or walks that range from one to three miles, often on uneven terrain where stairs may be unavailable or not have handrails. You will need to climb into and out of Zodiacs for excursions (there will be staff and crew members on hand to assist). Participants should be fit and in active good health. All participants will be required to follow safety and sanitation protocols set forth by the tour operator, local staff, and host country laws. By forwarding the deposit for passage, the participant certifies that s/he does not have any physical or other limitation that would create a hazard for her/himself or other travelers.

GROUP SIZE

This program is limited to 128 participants and is co-sponsored with other organizations.
