





## DISCOVERING CRYSTAL BRIDGES

A World-Class Oasis of Art & Architecture in Arkansas featuring John Meffert March 30–April 3, 2025



Crystal Bridges is one of the most important museums opened in America in the last 50 years, boasting an excellent art collection built by Walmart heiress Alice Walton and dynamic architecture by Moshe Safdie.

- Discover the fantastic art collection and cutting-edge architecture of Crystal Bridges, the museum which launched Bentonville, Arkansas to national cultural stardom.
- Explore Crystal Bridges' ancillary sites, including Frank Lloyd Wright's Bachman Wilson House and The Momentary, an old cheese factory turned contemporary art and cultural space downtown.
- Visit the nearby town of Eureka Springs, a Victorian-era spa resort town that still preserves dozens of fine buildings from the 1870s through the 1930s. A special walking tour will focus on the town's brightest architectural jewels.
- Admire the dramatic, stunning architecture of the contemporary Thorncrown Chapel and the Mildred B. Cooper Memorial Chapel, designed by local architect E. Fay Jones and situated amongst great natural beauty.

## Preservation and Perseverance in the Motor City

May 6-10, 2025



Detroit's rise to industrial prominence coincided with the height of Art Deco's popularity in the early 20th Century. Detroit has undergone a remarkable renaissance in recent years and Art Deco remains a hallmark of the city's character and downtown ambience.

- Take a guided walking tour of some of downtown Detroit's Art Deco gems including the magnificent Guardian Building, one of the nation's most extravagant Art Deco skyscrapers; and Albert Kahn's Fisher Building with its three-story arcade adorned with mosaics, marble, brass, and frescoes.
- Explore Detroit's vibrant art and design scene, including visits to the prestigious Cranbrook Educational Community and the Detroit Institute of Arts.
- Be welcomed by members of Detroit's Art Deco Society for a cocktail reception at Cliff Bell's, a restored Art Deco jazz club that continues to offer live jazz performances.
- Tour the Pewabic pottery and tile manufactory, founded in 1903 and still in operation. Pewabic was a leader in the Arts and Crafts movement and its striking iridescent tiles adorned buildings throughout Detroit.
- Travel with Study Leader Kim Rusinow, former president of the Detroit Area Art Deco Society.

# Historic Homes & Gardens of the Gilded Age

June 1–6, 2025



Venture into to the beautiful hills of Western Massachusetts and Northwestern Connecticut and discover why this area—the Berkshires—became the playground for Gilded Age writers and artists.

- Tour fascinating historic properties including Edith Wharton's The Mount; Herman Melville's Arrowhead where he wrote *Moby Dick;* the lavish Gilded-Age estate of Naumkeag; and Ventfort Hall, a "Save America's Treasures" initiative of the National Trust and the National Park Service.
- Visit the area's best art venues, including Mass MoCA, the Clark Art Institute, the Norman Rockwell Museum, and Chesterwood, the studio of sculptor Daniel Chester French, a National Trust Historic Site.
- See the fabulous private studio and garden of Bunny Williams, a renowned interior designer.
- Take a guided tour of Tanglewood, the summer home of the Boston Symphony Orchestra and the crown jewel of the Berkshires music scene.
- Stay in Stockbridge's iconic Red Lion Inn, a beautifully restored property and member of the National Trust's Historic Hotels of America program.
- Travel with Study Leader John Dickson, former board member of the Berkshire County Historical Society and author of *Berkshire County's Industrial Heritage*.

### **General Terms and Conditions**

**Activity Level:** Moderate, good overall mobility required for all walking tours.

**Deposits:** A deposit of \$1,000 per registrant is required to reserve space on each tour, of which \$500 is nonrefundable for ISDI's registration and planning fee unless the tour is cancelled due to low enrollment. This deposit may be paid by check or by Visa, MasterCard, or American Express.

**Final Payment:** Final payment is due 100 days prior to the tour start date and must be paid by check to International Seminar Design, Inc. Registrations are accepted after this date on a space-available basis.

**Flights:** Airfare is not included in the tour price. Participants are responsible for their own air arrangements. Please do not purchase airline tickets until the operation of the tour is confirmed by ISDI.

Tour Exclusions: Airline tickets, airline taxes and surcharges, and baggage fees; airport porterage; airport transfers (unless otherwise indicated in "Inclusions"); meals other than those specified in the itinerary; gratuities for hotel housekeeping; personal items such as telephone calls, room service, valet service, à-la-carte orders, specialty wines and liquors, laundry charges, travel extensions, or tour deviations; travel insurance; any other items not specifically included in the itinerary.

**Cancellations & Refunds:** There is a non-refundable registration and planning fee of \$500 per person regardless of cancellation date.

Written cancellation received by ISDI on or before 100 days prior to tour start date: full refund minus \$500 per person registration and planning fee. Written cancellation received by ISDI between 99 and 45 days prior to tour start date: refund of all monies paid to ISDI minus 50% of tour cost per person cancellation fee (includes registration and planning fee). Written cancellation received by ISDI on or after 44 days prior to tour start date: no refund.

Tour registration is non-transferable. In the case of cancellation, substitutions are not allowed. After the tour has commenced, no refunds will be issued for any reason including, but not limited to, unused portions of tour.

If the tour is cancelled by ISDI or National Trust Tours due to low enrollment, active registrants will receive a full refund of all tour payments.

**Terms & Conditions:** Upon receipt of registration, ISDI will send registrant a Participant Tour Agreement detailing the full terms and conditions for each tour. This document must be signed and returned to ISDI before participant's registration is considered complete and any arrangements can be confirmed.

**Travel Insurance:** Travel Insurance is not included in the tour cost, but participants are strongly encouraged to purchase a travel protection plan in conjunction with this tour, including coverage of trip cancellation, trip interruption, emergency evacuation/repatriation, medical expenses, lost or damaged baggage, and other expenses and/or losses incurred due to unexpected situations. Should a participant cancel at any time after registering for the tour, ISDI must strictly abide by the cancellation policy outlined herein.
