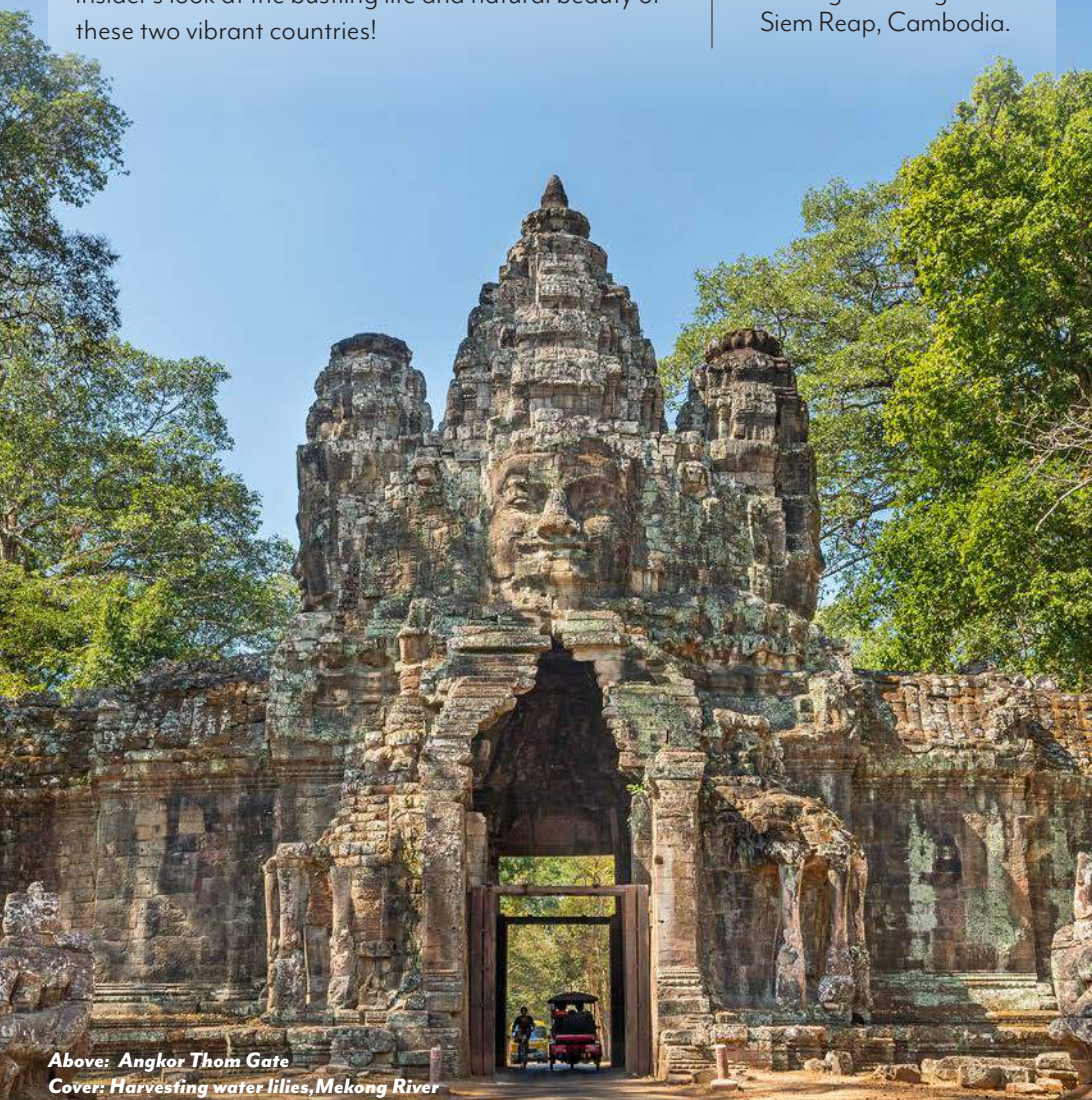

Day 1 | Jan 19

Depart your home city to fly to Siem Reap, Cambodia.

Day 2 | Jan 20

Cross International Date Line.

Day 3 | Jan 21

Siem Reap, Cambodia

Arrive at Siem Reap International Airport, transfer to the deluxe *Borei Angkor Resort & Spa* and check in.

Day 4 | Jan 22 **B-L-R-D**

Siem Reap

Explore Angkor Thom, a great walled city built in the late 12th century. Tour the complex, including the Baphuon, Elephant Terraces, Leper King

Terrace and Royal Palace area. Enjoy a group lunch at an authentic local restaurant. Next, explore the haunting temples of Ta Prohm, a former Buddhist monastery where roots of massive strangler figs and other trees have overtaken the buildings. This afternoon, visit Satcha, a handicraft center supporting local artisans and preserving Cambodian culture. This evening, join your fellow travelers at the hotel for a Welcome Reception and Dinner with a cultural show.

Day 5 | Jan 23 **B**

Siem Reap

Discover breathtaking Angkor Wat, a grand, UNESCO-designated temple and the largest religious monument in the world.

See the extensive gallery of bas-relief murals, among other memorable highlights.

Day 6 | Jan 24 **B-L-R-D**

Siem Reap | Embarkation | Kampong Cham

Embark *Jayavarman* and cruise on the vast Mekong River to Cambodia's sixth-largest city, Kampong Cham. Tour the city, noting its quaint main street, small markets, artisans and craftspeople. This evening, join your fellow travelers for a Welcome Reception and Dinner.

Day 7 | Jan 25 **B-L-D**

Angkor Ban | Prek Bangkong

In Angkor Ban, visit the local monastery and its delightful village, meet monks during their morning class, and engage in

friendly conversations with the villagers. Later, visit Prek Bangkok, known for its silk-weaving community. Observe artisans and weavers, and learn about the intricate silk production process.

Day 8 | Jan 26 **B-L-D**

Kampong Laeang | Kampong Tralach | Phnom Penh

Discover Kampong Laeang, a lovely lakeside village in the vast Tonle region, one of Cambodia's amazing ecosystems. Board tuk-tuks to travel the countryside for an authentic look at rural Cambodian life. This afternoon, an ox-pulled cart will transport you down quiet, winding roads bordered by lush rice paddies. In a small village along the river, visit and learn about a local school and library project.



Day 9 | Jan 27 **B-L-D**

Phnom Penh

Welcome to Phnom Penh, a storied city at the confluence of three rivers, with a history and culture that spans centuries. Despite its rapid development, it has retained much of its rustic charm and elegance. After our tour, return to the ship and savor an al fresco barbecue dinner accompanied by a classic Apsara dance performance.

Day 10 | Jan 28 **B-L-D**

Phnom Penh | Tan Chau, Vietnam

Enjoy a tasty breakfast on board as the ship departs Phnom Penh and begins a full day of sailing. This afternoon, we will cross the border and

arrive in Tan Chau, Vietnam, a pleasant town with diverse Chinese, Kinh and Khmer communities.

Day 11 | Jan 29 **B-L-D**

Tan Chau | My An Hung

Tan Chau is known for its aquaculture, agriculture, vibrant markets and silk-weaving culture. Ride in a xeloi, shop in the market, visit a temple, and visit at a fish farm that has been operated for many years by one family. This afternoon in nearby My An Hung, visit a family vegetable farm. As a local artistic group performs a traditional dragon dance, sample Vietnamese teas and freshly harvested tropical fruits.

Day 12 | Jan 30 **B-L-R-D**

Binh Thanh | Cai Be |
Tan Phong

Today, stop in two Mekong islands and one delta village, and meet locals within the communities. Learn how villagers fashion products from water hyacinths and rice, and visit a family fruit orchard.

Day 13 | Jan 31 **B-L**

My Tho | Disembark |
Ho Chi Minh City

After breakfast, disembark the ship and transfer to Ho Chi

Minh City. On a walking tour, see the city's many fascinating historic landmarks. Enjoy a group lunch and an open-air bus tour before checking into the deluxe *Park Hyatt Saigon*. Spend time this evening exploring on your own.

Day 14 | Feb 1 **B-R**

Ho Chi Minh City

Today choose an included excursion: either a market visit and Vietnamese cooking class or an exploration of the Cu Chi Tunnels. This elaborate tunnel system beneath the city

is centuries old and was used for guerrilla warfare during the Vietnam war. Join your fellow travelers for a Farewell Reception this evening.

Day 15 | Feb 2 **B**

Following breakfast, transfer to the airport for your flight back to your home city.

Ingenious Weaving

Native to the Upper Amazon River basin in South America, the water hyacinth is an invasive species now found in over 50 countries on five continents. Beautiful to behold, with drifting lush greenery and pale purple blooms, it nevertheless wreaks havoc on waterways. It grows into thick floating mats that prevent sunlight and oxygen from penetrating the water, killing off fish and amphibians. The water then stagnates and becomes a breeding area for mosquitoes—and their dangerous diseases.

A fearsome foe, the water hyacinth is extremely adaptable and can thrive in a variety of conditions, even in badly polluted water. And mats of the invasive weed can double in size every two weeks.

In Cambodia and Vietnam, local people have found a solution. They harvest the water hyacinths and dry out their long stems, weaving them into baskets, mats, handbags and other handicrafts. Villagers make money from their efforts, and as the hyacinths are thinned out, the river returns to health and surrounding communities benefit.

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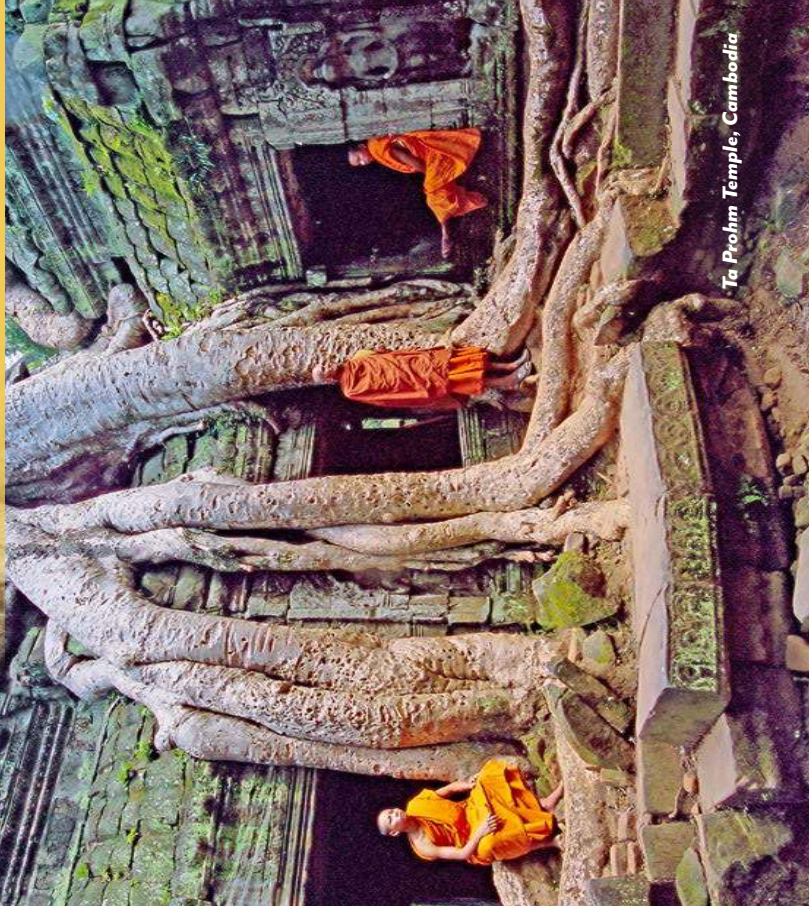
