DEAR NATIONAL TRUST TOURS TRAVELER,

Cannes... Monaco... Cinque Terre... Lucca... the Isle of Elba... These are names that conjure up images of medieval history, sun-drenched beaches, glamorous seaports, and rich masterpieces of art and architecture—in short, the quintessential Mediterranean journey. And how better to experience the voyage than under sail aboard the incomparable *Sea Cloud II*, which combines the seafaring elegance of a bygone era with the highest modern standards of luxury?

We combine a three-night luxury hotel stay on the French Riviera with a relaxed four-night cruise aboard the *Sea Cloud II* from Nice to Livorno, with port calls in Portovenere (for the Cinque Terre), the Isle of Elba, and Livorno (for choice of a day trip to Lucca or Florence). The short distances along this route allow for two half-days under sail, one at the start of the voyage and one at the end, to maximize the special experience of cruising aboard this majestic windjammer. May is the perfect time of year, with verdant gardens and landscapes awash with blossoms, and moderate temperatures.

A journey aboard the 47-stateroom *Sea Cloud II* is an incomparable experience on one of the most elegant and luxurious vessels afloat. In the grand tradition of the world's finest sailing vessels, guests experience this marvelous ship under sail, as the skilled crew hand-sets over 30,000 square feet of canvas. The ship's small size also allows us to moor centrally in the most scenic harbors, and anchor offshore of Portovenere for a visit to the Cinque Terre.

A post-tour extension will be offered to Tuscany, at the Castello di Spaltenna, a 5-star enchanting castle set in in the Tuscan countryside near Siena.



STUDY LEADER

GRACE GARY's relationship with the National Trust began when, while in graduate school, she was chosen as a National Trust Maritime Intern. She's hard to pin down on how many years ago that was, but she admits to having served as a lecturer on more-than eighty Trust tours over a span of more-than thirty years. She is also the author of two titles in the Trust's "Information" series and served as director of the Trust's Mid-Atlantic Regional Office. She also served as executive director of Preservation Pennsylvania, Longue Vue House and Gardens, Colonial Williamsburg's Tourism Leadership Program, and Nemours Mansion and Gardens. While at Nemours she oversaw an \$80 million restoration program, which received the highest award from the AIA ever bestowed on a restoration project. She and fellow National Trust Tours lecturer Dwight Young also co-authored "Nemours: A Portrait of Alfred I. DuPont's Home," which was published by Rizzoli. She is a graduate of Randolph-Macon Woman's College and has a Master's in architectural history from the University of Virginia, where she had the privilege of living on the Range in one of the original, Thomas Jefferson-designed rooms.

ITINERARY

Thursday-Friday, May 7-8 HOME / NICE, FRANCE

Depart home on overnight flights to Nice, France, arriving on Friday, May 8. Transfer to nearby Cannes and check in to the glamorous Hotel Carlton, an icon of the French Riviera since 1913. Meet your fellow travelers at a private welcome reception and dinner in the hotel's elegant dining room. CARLTON CANNES (B,D)

Saturday, May 9 CANNES / ANTIBES / SAINT-PAUL-DE-VENCE / GRASSE

Begin today with a welcome orientation before setting out with local guides on one of three excursion options: 1) Picasso Museum and Walking Tour of Old Town Antibes. In 1946. Picasso worked for two months in a studio at the Grimaldi Castle, now home to the Picasso Museum, which features several of his works. You will also have free time to explore the Old Town of Antibes. 2) Saint-Paul-de-Vence, Matisse Chapel, and Maeght Foundation. Start at the Matisse Chapel, and continue to the fortified village of Saint-Paulde-Vence, visiting the Maeght Foundation with its sculpture garden and collection of modern and contemporary art. 3) Visit the gardens of Villa Fort France in Grasse and Domaine de Manon to learn about the cultivation of exceptional fragrant flowers, primarily grown for the Christian Dior perfume house. Enjoy the evening at your leisure, with plenty of dining and entertainment options to choose from. CARLTON CANNES (B,L)

Sunday, May 10 CÔTE D' AZUR / MENTON / SAINT HONORAT ISLAND

Venture out for a day of discovery, traveling through scenic landscapes on the way to one of three distinct auided experiences. 1) Biot and the Fernand Léger Museum. Visit the medieval hilltop village of Biot for a glassblowing demonstration. Continue to the Fernand Léger Museum, dedicated to the modern art pioneer who lived and worked in the village. 2) On this day, visit two remarkable gardens in Menton: the Clos du Peyronnet and the Serre de la Madone. 3) Travel by boat to the small Île Saint-Honorat, just off the coast from Cannes, Eniov a wine tasting and time to explore the island by foot during a guided tour. The afternoon is at leisure to explore the area at your own pace, strolling along the Boulevard de la Croisette and taking in your last evening in Cannes. CARLTON CANNES (B,L)

Monday, May 11 NICE / MONACO / EMBARK

1) The Marc Chagall Museum: Visit the Marc Chagall National Museum in Nice, dedicated to the renowned Russian-French artist known for his vibrant,



dreamlike works. 2) Monaco, including the Old Town. Witness the changing of the guard and visit the State Apartments of the Prince's Palace, where stunning Italian Renaissance frescoes await. 3) Visit a garden featuring the award-winning designer James Basson's work, specializing in sustainable, ecological gardens. Late this afternoon, embark the Sea Cloud II in Nice and bid adieu to France as you sail toward Italy. Enjoy your first dinner aboard the elegant and iconic yacht. Sea Cloud II (B,L,D)

Tuesday, May 12 PORTO VENERE / CINQUE TERRE, ITALY

Anchor off Porto Venere and experience the Cinque Terre. Perched between steeply terraced vineyards and the Ligurian Sea, this UNESCO World Heritage Site and protected marine area is characterized by tiny villages and hidden coves. **1)** Visit the splendid Church of St. Peter, which towers from the promontory of the Bocche, and enjoy



the breathtaking view. Then, transfer to Manarola, the first of the five villages that make up the Cinque Terre, clinging to cliffs above the Mediterranean. 2) Enjoy an exclusive visit with the owner of the Caneva Gardens, a picturesque and serene green space located in the town of Sarzana. Continue to the Villa Marigola a historic villa offering stunning views of the Gulf of Poets. This evening, delight in dinner at a trattoria in Porto Venere to savor local dishes and wines. Sea Cloud II (B,L,D)

Wednesday, May 13 LIVORNO / FLORENCE OR LUCCA

After docking in Livorno, embark on a full day of exploration, with three exceptional touring options to choose from, each offering delightful trattoria gourmet lunch experiences. 1) Drive to Florence and take a guided walking tour of the historic center. In Piazza della Repubblica, discover the city's origins as a Roman settlement. Continue to see the Duomo and the iconic Ponte Vecchio. 2) Explore Lucca, the birthplace of composer Giacomo Puccini and a treasure chest of Tuscany's ancient silk trade. Stroll around the elliptical central piazza. Visit a textile workshop where artisans use traditional tools to create intricate fabrics. **3)** Visit Villa Reale di Marlia, a magnificent historic villa located near Lucca. This grand estate, dating back to the 16th century, is renowned for its exquisite architecture, lush gardens, and rich history. *Sea Cloud II* (B,L,D)

Thursday, May 14 PORTOFERRAIO, ELBA

Follow in the footsteps of the Argonauts and Napoleon, call at the tropical Isle of Elba. Take a panoramic drive with superb views of the coastline, visit Napoleon's summer residence during his exile on the island, and stop for a wine tasting at a 17th-century country wine estate, with vineyards nestled among ancient olive trees. Return to the ship for a leisurely afternoon of cruising and a final opportunity to experience the ship under sail. Gather this evening for one final celebration at

the captain's farewell reception and dinner. *Sea Cloud II* (B,L,D)

Friday, May 15 LIVORNO / HOME

After breakfast, depart for the Florence airport for flights home or begin the optional extension in Tuscany. (B)

AIR ARRANGEMENTS

U.S. domestic and international airfare is not included in the program rates. Valerie Wilson Travel, Inc., can help with airline arrangements for this trip and can be reached at (877) 376 1754. You are also welcome to book your air transportation through your local travel agent, an online travel site, or the airline of your choice. Further information about making flight arrangements will be sent to confirmed participants.

WHAT TO EXPECT This is a moderately strenuous program, at times physically demanding and busy, with considerable walking at some sites. The ship does not have an elevator, so you will need to navigate stairs, possibly while on choppy seas. Daily activities can involve up to three miles of walking, often on cobbled streets and uneven terrain; elevators may not be available and stairs may not have handrails. Participants should be fit and in active good health. Limited medical facilities are available on board the Sea Cloud II. All participants will be required to follow safety/sanitization protocols set forth by Criterion Travel, local staff, and host country laws.

GROUP SIZE This program can accommodate 78 participants, including travelers from National Trust Tours, the American Horticultural Society, Carlton Alumni Adventures, and Dartmouth Alumni Travel.


