

Day 1: En Route from U.S.

Sunday, September 13, 2026

Day 2: Arrive in London, England

Monday, September 14, 2026 (R,D)

Upon arrival to London's Heathrow Airport an Orbridge representative will be waiting to assist with your transfer to the hotel.

The afternoon is yours to enjoy at leisure followed by a special welcome reception and dinner this evening.

Overnight: Brown's Hotel

Day 3: Stonehenge | Avebury

Tuesday, September 15, 2026 (B,L)

Set out on a scenic two-hour journey through England's countryside to discover one of the world's most iconic and mysterious archaeological sites—Stonehenge.

During a guided tour around this UNESCO World Heritage Site, learn about speculations and theories surrounding the engineering of these Neolithic ruins. Stop at the impressive visitors center to view a variety of permanent exhibitions, which offer a glimpse into the unique nature of the Stonehenge site.

After a traditional English lunch at a local pub, survey the lesser-known site of Avebury. While Stonehenge is the most architecturally sophisticated prehistoric stone circle in the world, Avebury is the largest. Similar to other megalithic monuments in the British Isles, Avebury is a composite construction that was added to and altered during several periods. As the site currently exists, the great circle consists of a grass-covered, chalk-stone bank that is 1,396 feet in diameter and 20 feet high.

Return to London where dinner and the remainder of the evening are at leisure.

Overnight: Brown's Hotel

Day 4: London | Fly to Cairo, Egypt

Wednesday, September 16, 2026 (B,L,D)

Enjoy breakfast at the hotel before transferring to an exclusive terminal at London Stansted Airport to board your privately chartered jet.

After take-off share a celebratory welcome toast and become acquainted with the dedicated crew. Get settled in your lieflat leather seat and plug into in-flight entertainment and convenient charging stations. Pillows and amenity kits are available for additional comfort.

Lunch will be served during this relaxing, approximately five-hour flight. In-flight meals are served directly to your seat with fine china and cutlery and include a selection of beverages.

Upon arrival transfer to your five-star hotel to refresh and unpack before rejoining the group for dinner.

Overnight: Marriott Mena House, Cairo

Day 5: Giza

Thursday, September 17, 2026 (B,L,D)

Today's adventures include a visit to the pyramids of Giza, the only remaining Wonders of the Ancient World still standing. Stand in awe before the massive structures as local guides, who are certified Egyptologists, provide insightful information into the history of these incredible creations.

The Great Pyramid, 700 feet long on each side, is Egypt's largest and represents an astonishing structure completed more than 4,500 years ago. Approximately 2.3 million blocks of stone were cut, transported and assembled to create the 5.75-million-ton marvel. Its four sides are accurately oriented to the cardinal points of a compass.

Next set out for the Great Sphinx of Giza. This enigmatic stone carving—designed entirely from a single outcrop of limestone bedrock—depicts a lion's body with a man's face. The Sphinx faces the rising sun, and represents strength and wisdom.

Enjoy lunch and time at leisure.

This evening visit the Grand Egyptian Museum, a newly opened complex described as the largest archaeological museum in the world and host to more than 100,000 artifacts. Tour the extensive exhibits of royal tombs, portraits and pre-historic relics, and view various items in King Tut's treasure collection. Afterward gather for an exclusive private dinner at the museum.

Overnight: Marriott Mena House, Cairo

Day 6: Cairo | Fly to Aqaba, Jordan | Wadi Rum | Petra

Friday, September 18, 2026 (B,L,D)

Following breakfast return to your private jet for the 60-minute flight to Aqaba, Jordan, on the Red Sea.

Upon arrival meet with local guides, transfer to a motor coach and set out for Wadi Rum for a four-wheel drive desert excursion. Nicknamed the "Valley of the Moon," encounter Wadi Rum's visually striking landscape with sweeping red sand dunes and massive rock formations.

Traversing through Wadi Rum is a voyage through the geological evolution of Earth. Many of the topographical features are older than the Dead Sea Rift that forms the western border of Jordan. Stone Age petroglyphs and a continuing nomadic presence offer a rare window into humanity's earliest beginnings.

After a lunch of Jordanian specialties transfer by motor coach to the city of Petra with time to freshen up at your five-star accommodations before dinner.

Overnight: Mövenpick Resort Petra

Day 7: Petra

Saturday, September 19, 2026 (B,L,D)

This morning discover ancient Petra, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Known as the "Rose City" for its red rock carvings, this alluring place was once the thriving capital of the Nabataean Kingdom and a major caravan center during the Roman period. Over time, however, Petra was largely forgotten until the 19th century.

During a guided tour explore elaborate tombs, monuments and religious high places. Along a wide path known as the Bab Al Siq observe the Obelisk Tomb, a structure that stands as a testament to the rich history and cultural heritage of the region. Step inside to discover a resting and dining hall with three benches once used for feasts to honor the dead. Stairs lead to burial halls with interesting light and shadows for photo opportunities.

Those who wish to enjoy lunch and continue exploring Petra may do so while others may choose to return to the hotel for a restful afternoon.

This evening rejoin the group for dinner at the hotel.

Overnight: Mövenpick Resort Petra

Day 8: Agaba | Fly to Delhi, India

Sunday, September 20, 2026 (B,L,D)

Early this morning return to your private jet to depart for the next exciting destination—Delhi, India.

During this approximately five-hour flight, sit back, relax and take advantage of the well-appointed onboard facilities. Enjoy a nap, get lost in a book or mingle with fellow travelers at the stand-up bar and lounge.

Lunch will be served on board. The jet will touch down in Delhi by early evening.

Upon arrival transfer to your five-star hotel. Take time to unpack then gather later for dinner.

Overnight: The Oberoi, New Delhi

Day 9: Old and New Delhi | Agra

Monday, September 21, 2026 (B,L,D)

No journey of the world's iconic destinations would be complete without time in the heart of colorful India.

India's capital city, New Delhi, offers a captivating blend of old and new—an amalgam of tombs, temples and monuments existing side-by-side amidst modern suburbs and skyscrapers.

Drive past the Red Fort—Delhi's most iconic monument and one of several UNESCO World Heritage Sites. Massive red sandstone walls standing 75-feet high enclose a complex of palaces, gardens and a mosque.

Across the road stands Jama Masjid, one of the finest examples of Mughal architecture in India. This mosque was built by Emperor Shah Jahan, who also commissioned the Taj Mahal.

Next experience renowned Chandni Chowk, Old Delhi's main thoroughfare and oldest market—a sensory delight teeming with a myriad of goods, colors, fragrances and flavors.

Continue to New Delhi, a grand city featuring wide boulevards, manicured formal parks and notable landmarks including Rashtrapati Bhavan, the official residence of the president and India Gate, a 138-foot-tall arch that bears the names of thousands of Indian soldiers who perished in conflicts such as World War I and the Third Afghan War. Admire the arched façade of Humayun's Tomb built in the mid-16th century. This regal mausoleum is considered the architectural forerunner of the Taj Mahal.

Following lunch at a local restaurant continue the journey to Agra situated beside the Yamuna River—home to the Taj Mahal and Agra Fort, both UNESCO World Heritage Sites.

Overnight: The Oberoi Amarvilas, Agra

Day 10: Agra

Tuesday, September 22, 2026 (B,L,D)

Depart early for a sunrise visit of Taj Mahal. Built between 1631 and 1648 by order of the Mughal emperor Shah Jahan in memory of his favorite wife, the Taj Mahal is an immense mausoleum of shimmering white marble that appears to change color depending on the light. This complex is one of the most outstanding examples of Mughal architecture, combining Indian, Persian and Islamic influences. Strolling the grounds, admire the calligraphy, minarets and intricate lattice screens adorning the structure.

Return to the hotel for breakfast before delving into Mughal history at Agra Fort. This colossal red sandstone fortress houses exquisite palaces, mosques and halls. Get a glimpse into the lifestyle of royalty and learn about the Mughal emperors who once resided here.

Following lunch at the hotel, relish in an afternoon at leisure with extended time to take advantage of the property's magnificent five-star amenities.

Before dinner at a local restaurant there will be another opportunity to visit the Taj Mahal for a unique sunset experience.

Overnight: The Oberoi Amarvilas, Agra

Day 11: Agra | Jaipur

Wednesday, September 23, 2026 (B,L,D)

After breakfast and check-out, board your motor coach for the ride to Jaipur.

En route visit Fatehpur Sikri Fort, a UNESCO World Heritage Site featuring a blend of Islamic, Hindu and Persian architectural styles. Explore monuments including Jodha Bai's Palace, Panch Mahal and the tomb of Salim Chishti.

Continue to Jaipur (known as the *Pink City*)—a UNESCO World Heritage Site that was carefully planned and arranged in a grid pattern of eight units around a central square. Its historic buildings were painted terra-cotta pink—a symbolic color of hospitality in honor of a visit by Prince Albert in 1876. A law passed in 1877 declared that any new buildings constructed must also bear this particular color.

Settle into your award-winning five-star hotel with time to refresh before rejoining the group for an informative lecture from a guest speaker.

Overnight: The Oberoi Rajvilas, Jaipur

Day 12: Jaipur

Thursday, September 24, 2026 (B,L,D)

During a panoramic city tour see the iconic Amer Fort (or Amber Fort), one of India's most well-known and frequently visited sites. Massive ramparts, successive gates and a zig-zagging cobblestone path leading up a hillside reveal four courtyards, palaces, halls and gardens. Learn about the history of Jaipur and the dynasties that ruled it at this extensive complex.

Continue to City Palace—an impressive collection of courtyards, gardens and buildings. See structures from different eras, some dating from the early 20th century. It's a striking blend of Rajasthani and Mughal architecture, with surfaces adorned by carvings, silverwork or opulent textiles.

Adjacent to City Palace's entrance is Jantar Mantar observatory, constructed by Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II between 1724 and 1730. Singh's passion for astronomy was even greater than his prowess as a warrior. Before construction began Singh sent scholars abroad to study foreign examples of such structures.

Jantar Mantar is the largest and the best-preserved of Singh's observatories. See what has captivated the attention of architects and art historians worldwide at this site packed full of interesting instruments.

Return to the hotel for lunch and an afternoon at leisure, or you may choose to join one of the following optional activities (no additional fees apply):

Interactive Cooking Class: Join a local family as they share the secrets of crafting authentic Indian cuisine, guiding you through recipes during a hands-on experience to create a complete meal. Then be seated with your hosts to dine on the delectable dishes, accompanied by laughter, stories and refreshing drinks. *NOTE: This activity is in lieu of the scheduled lunch on the itinerary.*

Bollywood Dance Presentation: During a demonstration and dress performance led by certified instructors, learn about the origins, intricate steps, graceful movements and expressive gestures that define Bollywood dance.

Bagru Block Printing Workshop: Embark on a journey into the heart of Bagru's rich heritage and intricate block printing techniques. Learn from skilled artisans, explore the workshop and create your own unique printed textiles. Discover the history and cultural significance of Bagru block printing, the types of natural dyes used and the detailed steps involved in the craft. (*This activity is weather dependent.*)

Jhalana Wildlife Sanctuary Safari: This captivating wildlife experience features opportunities to see leopards, blue bulls, hyenas, monitor lizards, and a diverse range of avian species.

This evening celebrate your time spent in India with a special themed dinner.

Overnight: The Oberoi Rajvilas, Jaipur

Day 13: Jaipur | Fly to Siem Reap, Cambodia

Friday, September 25, 2026 (B,L,D)

After breakfast return to the airport to board your private jet. Today you will journey far east across southern Asia to Siem Reap, Cambodia.

The approximately four-hour flight presents an opportunity to relax, recharge and reflect on recent sites and experiences with fellow travelers. Enjoy lunch and refreshments at your seat or in the company of others at the stand-up bar and lounge.

Upon arrival transfer to the hotel to unpack before dinner with the group. Tomorrow's adventures begin at dawn.

Overnight: Sofitel Angkor Phokeethra Golf & Spa Resort

Day 14: Angkor Wat

Saturday, September 26, 2026 (B,L,D)

Early this morning travel to Angkor Wat by Tuk Tuk to witness a dramatic sunrise over the UNESCO World Heritage Site. One of the most famous temples in the world, Angkor Wat is home to a number of impressive religious structures and monuments dating back to the 12th century. The complex is also an architectural and engineering feat. King Suryavarman II's architects, for example, conceived of cooling corridors for heat relief and the formation of a system of reservoirs and waterways for irrigation.

After exploring Angkor Wat gather for a private Khmer breakfast at a traditional Khmer Wooden House at Sra Srang located adjacent to Angkor's reservoir.

Continue to Angkor Thom and Prasat Bayon, which is known for its iconic stone faces carved into its towers. The temple was built in the late 12th century by King Jayavarman VII and is a significant part of the Angkor archaeological site.

Lunch at Lum Orng Farm to Table Restaurant is next, followed by an afternoon of included optional experiences (no additional fees apply). Both options include an immersive visit to Psar Cha, the local market in the center of town. Take in the daily life of Cambodian vendors offering hand woven silks, silver and wooden products and jewelry, plus a diverse variety of fresh fruits and vegetables, desserts and spices.

Bodia Spa Treatment: Choose from a variety of treatments to pamper both body and soul using only natural Cambodian-made products.

Satcha Handicraft Center: Visit six Cambodian arts and crafts workshops. Satcha's mission is to preserve traditional handicraft techniques and educate and empower local artisans, mixing traditional knowledge with contemporary design to showcase Cambodian talents to local and international visitors while having a sustainable social, economic and environmental impact.

Tonight dine at Malis—a restaurant renowned for authentic Khmer cuisine and genuine hospitality.

Overnight: Sofitel Angkor Phokeethra Golf & Spa Resort

Day 15: Siem Reap

Sunday, September 27, 2026 (B,D)

Today's itinerary allows for a variety of touring options (no additional fees apply) or a full day of leisure to indulge in the hotel's luxurious amenities.

Jeep Safari: Join an expedition through Siem Reap's countryside, past rice paddy fields and local villages. Stopping in San-Day Village visit an organic vegetable farm providing the local ingredients for your lunch of traditional Khmer dishes.

ATV Adventure Safari: Discover the countryside and remote villages around Siem Reap by all-terrain vehicle. Led by your quide, navigate through rice fields and small villages, and experience village life.

Kulen Elephant Forest Experience: Kulen's mission is dedicated to preserving natural habitat for elephant conservation and education. Walk with the resident elephants living on 1,100 acres of protected forest.

Grand Temples Vespa Tour: Return to Angkor Wat by Vespa with time to explore Preah Khan and Neak Pean. Then enjoy an exhilarating ride around the rest of the Grand Circuit Road with a stop at Sra Srang.

Alternatively enjoy the facilities of the hotel, whether relaxing by the swimming pool, taking advantage of the fitness center, playing a round of golf at the best golf course in Cambodia, or indulging in Sofitel Spa's wellness and beauty treatments (additional fees may apply for services).

Tonight a special dinner experience awaits to round out the remarkable time spent in Cambodia.

Overnight: Sofitel Angkor Phokeethra Golf & Spa Resort

Day 16: Siem Reap | Fly to Hanoi, Vietnam

Monday, September 28, 2026 (B,L,D)

Board your private jet for the approximately 90-minute flight to Hanoi, the capital of Vietnam. Enjoy a light sandwich and snack service en route.

One of the most ancient cities in the world, Hanoi offers examples of both classical and contemporary architecture right in the city center.

After lunch set out on a panoramic tour of Hanoi including an inside visit to the notorious prisoner-of-war camp, Hoa Lo Prison, also known as "Hanoi Hilton." This property was used for political prisoners during the French colonial era and later for American prisoners of war during the Vietnam War. Today it serves as a museum and a reminder of Vietnam's turbulent history.

Return to the hotel and freshen up before heading out to a unique dinner at the remarkable Hanoi Grand Opera House. Erected between 1901 and 1911, the Hanoi Opera House is one of three opera houses built by the French colonial administration.

Overnight: Sofitel Legend Metropole Hanoi

Day 17: Ha Long Bay

Tuesday, September 29, 2026 (B,L,D)

Journey east by motor coach to the mountainous Quang Ninh province for Ha Long Bay on Vietnam's coast. This UNESCO World Heritage Site, meaning "Land of the Descending Dragon," displays pristine natural beauty. The bay includes some 1,600 islands and islets plus a spectacular seascape of limestone pillars surrounded by turquoise blue waters—making it a popular locale with the Vietnamese and international visitors.

Arriving at the bay, board a private charter boat for a luncheon cruise through the tranquil waters.

Return to Hanoi in the afternoon with time to refresh before dinner at the hotel's restaurant, Le Beaulieu—honored with inclusion in the prestigious Michelin Selected List for 2024.

Overnight: Sofitel Legend Metropole Hanoi

Day 18: Hanoi | Fly to Muscat, Oman

Wednesday, September 30, 2026 (B,L,D)

Your private jet is ready for the next destination—the Sultanate of Oman on the Arabian peninsula's southeastern coast.

The Sultanate of Oman is strategically located on the southeastern coast of the Arabian Peninsula at the confluence of the Persian Gulf and Arabian Sea. Its prime location has been, and remains, important for controlling or having a strong presence in the Persian Gulf. Enjoy staying the next two nights in its capital, Muscat, known for its blend of traditional and modern architecture, the rich history and culture found in the city's old and new towns, the hospitality of its people, and its beautiful beaches and lush landscape.

During this approximately seven-hour flight take pleasure in another first-class meal and the exceptional services of your now familiar crew.

After landing and clearing arrival formalities transfer to the hotel to settle in before rejoining the group for dinner at the property.

Overnight: Kempinski Hotel Muscat

Day 19: Muscat

Thursday, October 1, 2026 (B,L,D)

After breakfast you may opt for time at leisure at the property or choose to join one of two optional excursions (no additional fees apply):

Wadi Shab: This spectacular canyon-like valley offers a tranquil and adventurous escape. Lush greenery contrasts dramatically with rugged cliffs and crystal-clear turquoise pools. During a leisurely hike through the wadi, see various cave systems that lead to hidden waterfalls.

Bandar Al Khairan: This coastal gem is a pristine area known for its natural beauty and marine life. A series of small islands, secluded coves and dramatic cliffs emerge from emerald-green waters. The area is home to vibrant marine species, including tropical fish and occasionally dolphins. Enjoy snorkeling or kayaking adventures to discover the coral reefs and underwater life.

Later set out on a guided panoramic tour of Muscat, passing notable landmarks including the Royal Opera House, Mutrah Corniche—a scenic promenade along the waterfront, Al Jalai and Al Mirani Forts, and the National Museum of Oman.

Next visit Mutrah Souq located near the Corniche. This vibrant market is one of Muscat's oldest and most colorful attractions. The souq is a sensory delight with narrow, winding alleyways filled with the scents of frankincense, myrrh and exotic spices. Traditional Omani music often plays softly in the background. Browse for Omani silver jewelry, intricately designed khanjars (ceremonial daggers), pashmina shawls, antiques and vibrant textiles.

Tonight celebrate this extraordinary around-the-world adventure of iconic destinations with a special Omani dinner.

Overnight: Kempinski Hotel Muscat

Day 20: Muscat | Fly to London, England

Friday, October 2, 2026 (B,L)

Following breakfast tour the Sultan Qaboos Grand Mosque—Oman's tallest structure and largest mosque. Imposing and glorious, this piece of modern Islamic architecture was a gift to the nation from Sultan Qaboos to mark his 30th year of reign. The mosque can accommodate 20,000 worshippers, including 750 women in a private *musalla* (prayer hall).

See the beautiful main prayer hall and hand-loomed prayer carpet that took 600 women four years to weave. Equally impressive are extensive manicured gardens, fountains, elegant walkways and one of the world's largest chandeliers. This 24-carat, gold-plated fixture is trimmed with 600,000 Swarovski crystals and houses 1,122 bulbs.

After touring return to the airport to board your private jet one final time for the approximately eight-hour flight to London. Delight in lunch, convivial camaraderie and a traditional English afternoon tea service during the journey.

Transfer to your hotel and enjoy the remainder of the evening at leisure.

Overnight: Fairmont Windsor Park

Day 21: London | Depart for U.S.

Saturday, October 3, 2026 (B)

Following breakfast guests departing during the suggested times will take a complimentary transfer to the airport for flights home.

For a trip of this scale, traveling by chartered aircraft adds a layer of sophistication and ease. Your Boeing 767 is limited to only 62 passengers, and can operate out of many regional and most major international airports. You'll fly direct and avoid layovers, maximizing your time touring on the ground.

While in the air, enjoy the experience and attention of two pilots, an engineer, a flight manager, a chef and between six to eight cabin crew members. This enthusiastic team strives to create an environment that ensures you'll enjoy the journey as much as each destination.

Lie-flat reclining leather, VIP-style seats are outfitted with a center console, leg rest, and four-way headrest, offering supreme comfort for travel between destinations.

A wireless in-flight entertainment system allows you to access a library of movies, magazines and more from your personal tablet, smartphone or laptop. Each seat has a convenient power port for charging your device(s). NOTE: Electronic devices and headphones/earbuds are not provided.

While the jet is not equipped with Wi-Fi or internet service, you can download a free in-flight messaging app to your smartphone PRIOR to your flight. This app allows you to send emails and text messages via native SMS applications or with WhatsApp.

The exclusive onboard lounge offers additional space for convivial conversation and mingling with fellow travelers.

While in flight, enjoy complimentary beverage service featuring non-alcoholic options plus select beer, wine and spirits. All in-flight meals are served directly to your seat with fine china and cutlery.



All such persons and entities are independent contractors. As a result, Orbridge is not liable for any negligent or willful act or failure to act of any such person or entity, or of any other third party.
