- ✓ Take a challenging hike on an island plateau or a thrilling whitewater rafting trip in Skagafjordur, known for its stunning geologic formations.

Itinerary

DAY 1

REYKJAVÍK, ICELAND/EMBARK

Arrive in Reykjavík, the world's northernmost capital, which lies just below the Arctic Circle. Transfer from the airport to the city and spend the day exploring at your own pace. Check in with the hospitality desk this afternoon before embarking the ship. (D)

DAY 2

DJÚPAVÍK

Enjoy a leisurely morning at sea learning about Iceland and its incredible biodiversity. Join your expedition staff on the bow as you keep watch for the close to 20 different whale species that call the Westfjords home.

Spend the afternoon on the remote eastern side of the Westfjords, boasting spectacular beauty and rich history. The tiny town of Djúpavík earned its place on the map thanks to the herring boom of the early 20th century. In its 1930s heyday, the local herring plant was the largest concrete structure in Iceland. Though the plant closed in 1954, it now serves as a small museum—a lasting reminder of the industry's golden age. Visit to learn about the vital role herring played in shaping Iceland's economy, then choose from a variety of active excursions in the surrounding mountains. (B,L,D)

DAY 3

SKAGAFJÖRÐUR

Skagafjörður is the gateway to North Iceland, known for its glacial rivers, Icelandic horses and saga history. Take a float trip on the Jökulsá River or visit a historic turf farm to understand rural life in Iceland, including the iconic Icelandic horses. Finally, learn about Grettir the Strong and the saga named after him by exploring Drangey Island and spotting the multitudes of birds that call the island home, like kittiwakes, shearwaters and possibly even ravens and gyrfalcons. DAYS 4-5

EAST COAST OF GREENLAND

Cross the Denmark Strait to the remote, rugged shores of Eastern Greenland, where tidewater glaciers calve off the country's vast ice cap. This region offers incredible opportunities to navigate the coastline amongst the ice flowing southward from the North Pole, where Zodiac cruising, kayaking and hiking might all be possible, depending on ice conditions. Designed to offer a glimpse into the dynamic ecosystem Greenland offers, navigate these waters as a modern-day explorer, spend time on the Bridge or at the ship's rail, scanning the landscape and waterline for the unique wildlife that inhabits this remote region. Keep watch for humpbacks, beluga whales and seals as well as the elusive narwhal and polar bear. (B,L,D)





DAYS 6-7

WESTFJORDS OF ICELAND

Explore the serene and scenic Westfjords of Iceland, beginning with a visit to Ísafjarðardjúp and the charming island of Vigur. Here, you'll tour a traditional eider farm and learn about the centuries-old process of collecting and cleaning eiderdown. The island is also home to thriving bird colonies, including a puffin colony supported through a collaborative project between Lindblad Expeditions and the island's owners—an effort to create a safer habitat for the birds and improve research facilities for local scientists. The next day, explore yet another stunning, remote fjord, where expedition activities may include hikes along coastal trails leading to a dramatic waterfall. (B,L,D)

DAY 8

REYKJAVÍK/DISEMBARK

Disembark in Reykjavík and transfer to the airport for flights home. (B)

CAPACITY: 81 outside cabins accommodating 148 guests.

REGISTRY: Bahamas. **OVERALL LENGTH:** 367 feet.

National Geographic Explorer is a state-of-the-art expedition ship. She is a fully stabilized, ice-class vessel, with an ice-reinforced hull, enabling her to navigate polar passages while providing exceptional comfort.

PUBLIC AREAS: Bistro bar; chart room; restaurant; Global Gallery; library; lounge with full-service bar and facilities for films, slideshows and presentations; mudroom with lockers for expedition gear; and observation lounge. An open Bridge enables guests to meet the officers and captain and learn about navigation.

MEALS: Served in single seatings with unassigned tables for an informal atmosphere. Menu is international with local flair.

CABINS: All cabins face outside with windows or portholes, private facilities and climate controls. Some cabins have balconies. Equipped with Ethernet and Wi-Fi connections and USB ports for mobile devices.

EXPEDITION EQUIPMENT: Zodiacs, remotely operated vehicle (ROV), hydrophone, splash-cam, underwater video camera, crow's nest remote-controlled camera and video microscope.

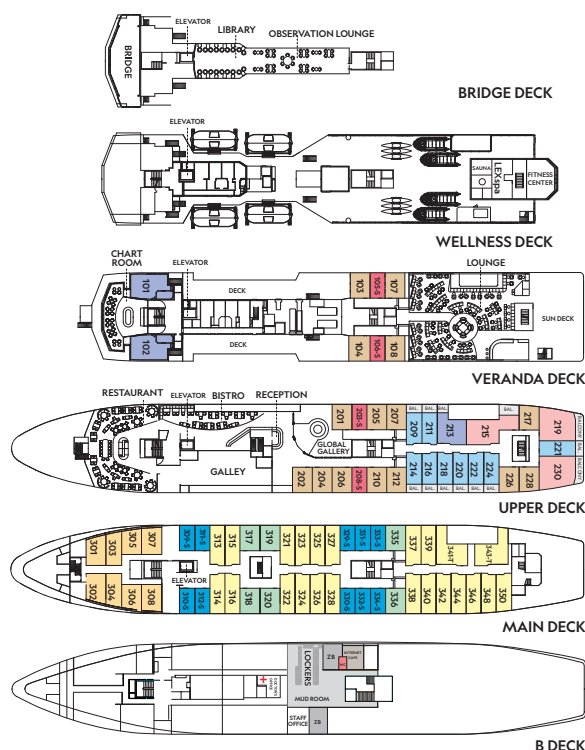

WELLNESS: The vessel is staffed by a wellness specialist and features a glass-enclosed fitness center, outdoor stretching area, LEXspa treatment room and sauna.

Third person rates are available in the designated triple occupancy cabins at one-half the double occupancy rate. Cabins #341, 343, 101, 102, 215, 219 and 230 can accommodate a third person.

PRICING: Prices quoted are subject to change and availability at time of booking. Under normal conditions the total expedition price is guaranteed at the time advanced payment is made. However, our expedition pricing is determined far in advance of initial departure on the basis of then-existing projections of fuel and other costs. In the event of increases in those costs, including but not limited to increases in the price of fuel, currency fluctuations, increases in government taxes or levies, or increased security costs, we reserve the right to adjust the price of your expedition or add a surcharge to cover such unexpected increases. We will always provide an explanation of the reason for increase in costs.

COST INCLUDES: All accommodations aboard ship; excursions and airport transfers, as indicated in the itinerary; all meals as indicated in the itinerary, both aboard and on shore; beer, wine, cocktails and spirits, with premium wines and liquors available for purchase; 24-hour access to snacks, premium coffees and teas, non-alcoholic beverages and filtered water; the guidance and company of the leading expedition team; presentations by the expedition staff; crew gratuities; complimentary heritage jacket and reusable water bottle; the services of a medical professional; 24-hour access to lounges, observation decks, library and other shared spaces; morning stretch classes and access to the fitness center; assistance by the onboard photo instructor and access to the OM System Photo Gear Locker with the latest gear to try out aboard ship; special access permits, park and site entrance fees and port taxes; selection of exploration tools, such as Zodiacs, kayaks and other state-of-the-art gear; basic Wi-Fi, with the option to upgrade. AIRFARE: Airfare is an additional cost. Lindblad will assist in making your air arrangements for a \$50 per person service fee.

RESERVATIONS: To confirm your place, an advance payment of 15% of the cabin fare, per person is required and is payable by Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Discover or check. Receipt of advance payment indicates your acceptance of the terms and conditions.

FINAL PAYMENT: Payment is due 120 days prior to departure.
