The Total Solar Eclipse in Tangier, Morocco

July 30 - August 5, 2027



Trip Highlights

Experience the total solar eclipse on August 2, 2027, directly within the path of totality near **Tangier, Morocco**.

View the eclipse from a special location, with private rooftop access at the **Cape Spartel Lighthouse**, Morocco's oldest lighthouse.

Participate in this weeklong program that explores northern Morocco's role as a crossroads between Europe and Africa.

Explore the historical and cultural depth of **Tangier**, from the **Tangier American Legation**, the only U.S. National Historic Landmark located abroad, to the **Moshe Nahon Synagogue**, a beautifully restored 19th-century synagogue.

Delight in lunch at **Villa Mabrouka**, Yves Saint Laurent's clifftop sanctuary in Tangier, where the fashion designer entertained artists and royalty.

Embark on an excursion to **Chefchaouen**, Morocco's "Blue Pearl," founded in 1471, featuring its entire medina washed in shades of powder-blue, azure, and teal against the Rif Mountains.

Journey to **Tétouan**, the UNESCO-recognized city known as the "daughter of Granada" for its Andalusian heritage, and visit the **Ethnographic Museum of Tétouan** inside an 1830 fortress.

Dear National Trust Traveler,

Recent total solar eclipses have captured the world's attention. On **August 2, 2027**, the eclipse is expected to be one of the longest of the 21st century. The path of totality will pass directly over **Tangier, Morocco**. At 9:44 a.m. local time, the moon will cover the sun, with nearly five minutes of totality, turning mid-morning light into twilight.

From **July 30 to August 5, 2027**, join us in Tangier to witness this celestial event at the crossroads of continents, surrounded by 3,000 years of history. View this total solar eclipse from a special location you won't forget, with private rooftop access at the **Cape Spartel Lighthouse**, Morocco's oldest lighthouse, built in the 1860s at the country's northwest tip.

Tangier provides a strong base for the days around the eclipse, offering natural beauty, cultural immersion, and sophisticated relaxation. Matisse painted here, Paul Bowles wrote here, and the city's harbor, medina, cafés, and old diplomatic quarter showcase its cosmopolitan past.

Enjoy guided tours of sites exploring Tangier's international history, including the early 19th-century **Tangier American Legation**, the first U.S. property abroad, and the late 19th-century **Moshe Nahon Synagogue**, which preserves the city's rich Jewish history. Lunch at the former Tangier cliff-top retreat of **Yves Saint Laurent**, **Villa Mabrouka**, adds a note of glamour, with gardens and sea views.

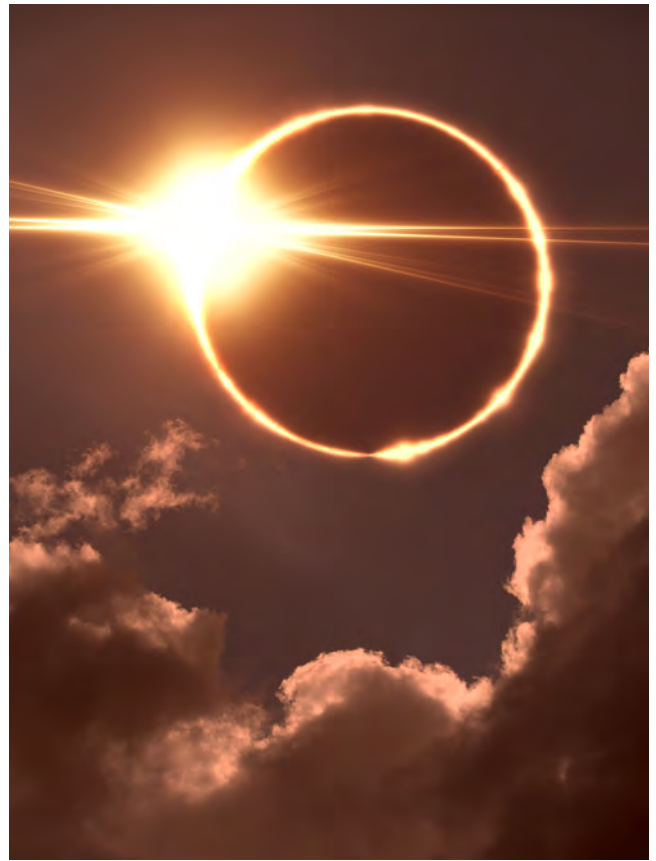
You will also travel into the Rif Mountains to **Chefchaouen**, the famed "Blue City," and **Tétouan**, with its Andalusian-style design, UNESCO-recognized medina, and Ethnographic Museum, housed in an 1830 fortress.

The Total Solar Eclipse in Tangier, Morocco

July 30 - August 5, 2027

Friday, July 30:

Departure

Depart on an overnight flight to Tangier, Morocco.

Saturday, July 31:

Tangier, Morocco

(R)

Arrive in **Tangier** and transfer to your hotel, the **Royal Tulip City Center Tangier**. This evening, gather for a welcome reception with fellow guests.

Sunday, August 1:

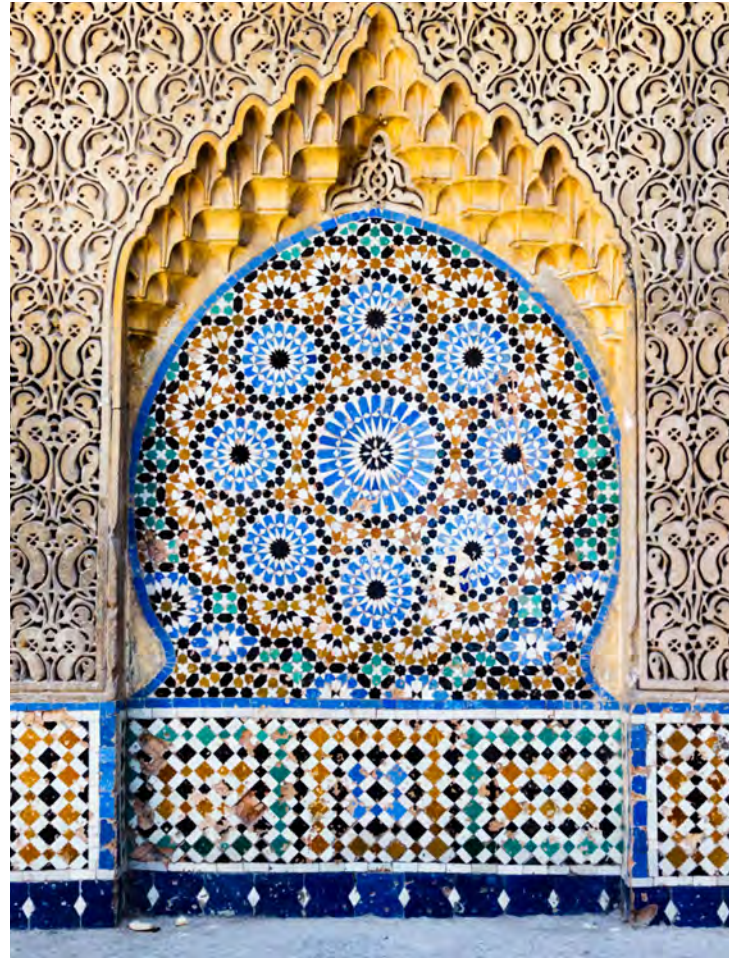
Tangier

(B,L,D)

Rise for a guided morning tour through Tangier's medina. Begin at the **Ibn Battuta Museum**, opened in 2023 to honor the city's greatest explorer. Born here in 1304, Ibn Battuta traveled 75,000 miles across 44 modern countries over 29 years, surpassing even Marco Polo's range. Interactive exhibits re-create his routes from Cairo's bazaars to the sultan's court in Delhi.

Zellij tilework, St. Andrew's Church, Tangier

Continue to the **Tangier American Legation**, the first property the U.S. Government ever owned abroad. This five-story Moorish mansion served as the American consulate for 140 years and stands as the only U.S. National Historic Landmark outside the United States.

Walk through the Beni Idir quarter to the **Moshe Nahon Synagogue**, built around 1878 and beautifully restored in 1994. Lunch awaits at **Villa Mabrouka**, the legendary cliff-top estate of fashion designer Yves Saint Laurent.

After lunch, visit **St. Andrew's Church**, consecrated in 1905 and one of North Africa's oldest continuously operating Anglican churches. Inside, Moroccan craftsmen created carved stucco and zellij tilework, featuring a gilded Lord's Prayer in Arabic script above the chancel arch.

For those interested, an **optional private cooking class with a Moroccan chef** will offer hands-on exploration of the country's culinary traditions. Later, gather for dinner.

Monday, August 2:

Tangier / Cape Spartel (Eclipse Viewing) (B,L,D)

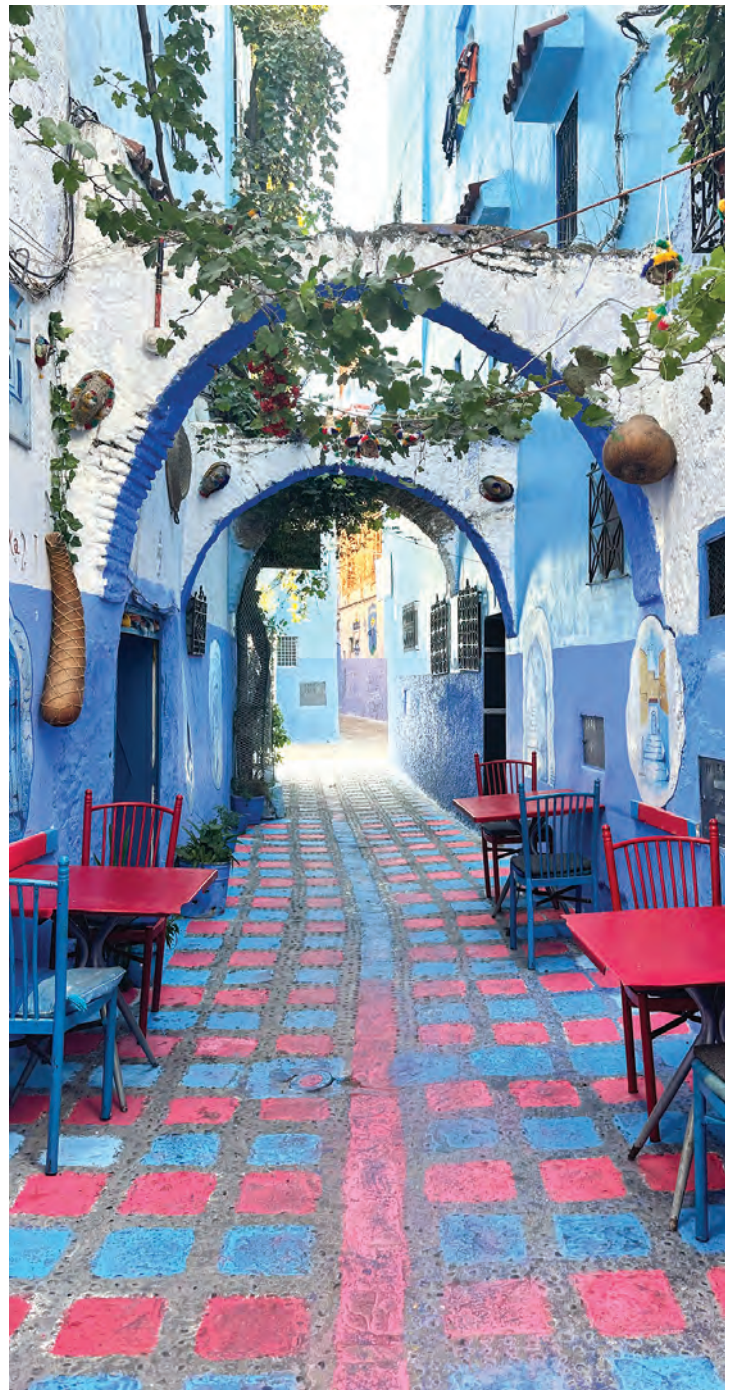
After breakfast, prepare for one of nature's rarest spectacles: **a total solar eclipse** directly within the path of totality. Experience the viewing near Tangier, with private rooftop access at the 19th-century **Cape Spartel Lighthouse**, Morocco's oldest lighthouse. The moon's shadow will sweep across northern Morocco, with nearly five minutes of totality starting around 9:44 a.m. local time.

Built in the 1860s, the lighthouse is recognized for its Maghreb-inspired square minaret form and its panoramic views toward the Caves of Hercules.

As light returns, gather for lunch, with the remainder of the day at leisure.

Chefchaouen

Tuesday, August 3:

Tangier / Chefchaouen

(B,L)

After breakfast, depart for a guided tour of **Chefchaouen**, the "Blue Pearl" set in the Rif Mountains at 1,840 feet. What sets Chefchaouen apart is its entire medina, washed in shades of powder blue, azure, and teal.

At the center of Plaza Uta el-Hammam, discover the **Kasbah**, the original 1471 fortress whose high clay walls with crenelated ramparts contrast with the surrounding blue homes. Enjoy a group lunch in Chefchaouen, with dinner upon return to Tangier.

Wednesday, August 4:

Tangier / Tétouan

(B,L,D)

This morning, depart for an excursion to **Tétouan**, often referred to as the “daughter of Granada” for its Andalusian heritage. Visit the **Ethnographic Museum of Tétouan** (Musée Ethnographique), whose exhibits illustrate the life-styles of northern Morocco through the centuries. After a group lunch, enjoy an afternoon at leisure. This evening, gather for a festive farewell dinner accompanied by a performance.

Thursday, August 5:

Tangier / Return

(B)

After breakfast, transfer to the Tangier airport for your flight home.
