Traveling With *You*

Christopher Noey is an art historian, author, and Emmy Award-winning producer of films on art and culture. He has traveled to Egypt for research and lectures for over four decades. At The Metropolitan Museum of Art, he created video installations for a wide range of exhibitions and served as series director for the innovative online features *82nd & Fifth* and *The Artist Project*. An authority on Asian and Islamic art, he has taught at Williams College and the City College of New York.

Trip Highlights

Cruise the Nile over four nights aboard **Sanctuary Nile Adventurer**, a deluxe 30-cabin riverboat, stopping at temples from across the sweep of Egyptian history.

Gain exclusive after-hours access to the newly opened **Grand Egyptian Museum**, with a special inside look at its complete 5,000-object collection of **Tutankhamun's funerary treasures**, appearing together for the first time since Howard Carter's 1922 discovery.

Enter the **Royal Mummies Hall** at Cairo's **National Museum of Egyptian Civilization** to encounter 20 New Kingdom rulers, then go behind the scenes of the museum's restoration laboratory.

Behold the incomparable **Great Pyramids** and go beyond the protective barriers for a special look at the **Great Sphinx**, the colossal limestone guardian carved around 2,500 B.C.

Descend into the **Valley of the Kings** to explore the tomb of **Tutankhamun (KV62)**, the only royal burial found almost intact, revealing the extraordinary wealth buried with New Kingdom pharaohs.

Fly by private charter to **Abu Simbel**, the colossal rock-cut temple that was relocated in the 1960s in an unprecedented international campaign to save the monument from the rising waters of the High Dam.

On this journey from **December 29, 2026, to January 9, 2027**, experience Egypt's treasures by privately chartered plane and a four-night cruise along the legendary Nile River aboard the elegant **Sanctuary Nile Adventurer** riverboat.

Join **Christopher Noey**, an Emmy Award-winning filmmaker and art historian who has researched and traveled to Egypt for decades. Witness how pharaohs, priests, and artisans created monuments designed to endure forever. The centuries melt away, and ancient Egypt comes to life.

In **Cairo**, a highlight will be **exclusive after-hours access** to the billion-dollar **Grand Egyptian Museum (GEM)**, the world's largest archaeological museum.

"For a century, hundreds of these pieces have been in storage, never displayed to the public. Now, they're united in a vast, climate-controlled wing."

Later, cruise aboard the deluxe, 30-cabin **Sanctuary Nile Adventurer** from **Luxor** to **Aswan**, the perfect way to reach remote temples and tombs along the Nile.

"We'll explore remarkably well-preserved temples like the **Temple of Horus in Edfu**," says Chris, "but the most moving experience is the great Nile River, whose life-giving waters allowed a great kingdom to flourish for over 3,000 years."

Great Sphinx

Tuesday, December 29: *Departure*

Depart on an overnight flight to Cairo, Egypt.

Wednesday, December 30: *Cairo, Egypt*

(R)

Arrive in **Cairo** this afternoon and transfer to the **Four Seasons Hotel Cairo at Nile Plaza**, your home for the next four nights. After introductory remarks from Chris Noey, gather at the welcome reception.

Thursday, December 31: *Cairo / Giza*

(B,L,D)

This morning, arrive at the Giza Plateau to see the awe-inspiring **Great Pyramids**, built around 2550 B.C. At the **Great Sphinx**, walk beyond the protective barriers to approach this guardian carved from the bedrock.

This evening, ring in the New Year along the Nile with a **festive dinner and celebration**.

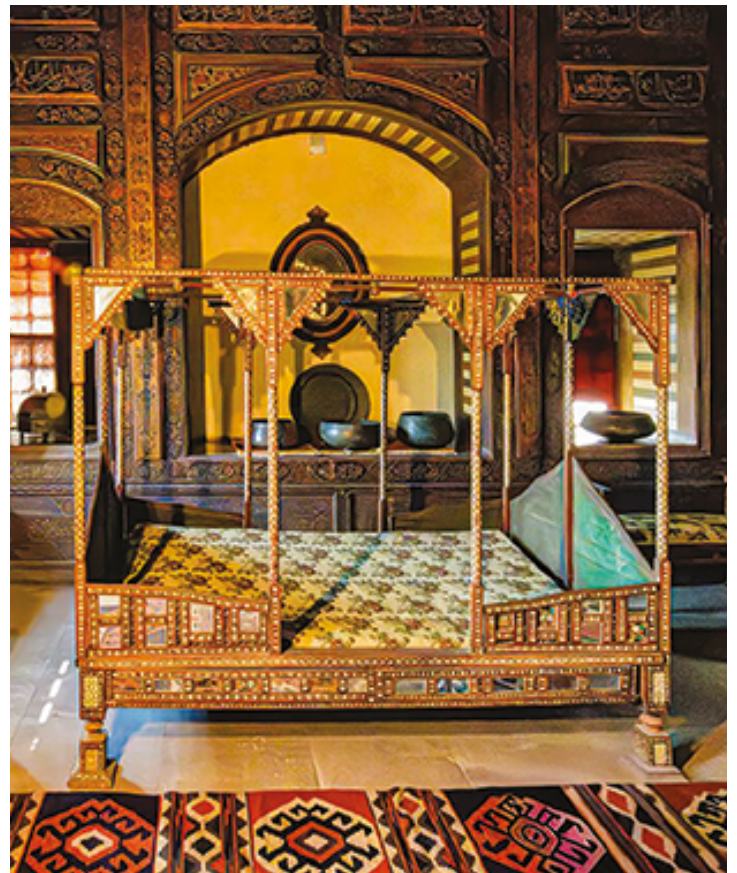
Friday, January 1:

Cairo

(B,L,D)

Rise this morning for a guided tour of the **National Museum of Egyptian Civilization**. In the museum's **Royal Mummies Hall**, designed to evoke the Valley of the Kings, encounter the preserved remains of 20 New Kingdom rulers. Go behind the scenes of **the museum's restoration laboratory**.

After lunch, explore **Islamic Cairo**, stopping at the **Gayer-Anderson Museum**, which houses a collection of treasures from ancient Egypt, the Islamic world, and China; the ninth-century **Ibn Tulun Mosque**; and the splendid **Mosque-Madrassa of Sultan Hassan**, a Mamluk-era wonder known for its intricate calligraphy. Gather for dinner this evening.



Gayer-Anderson Museum, Cairo

Saturday, January 2:
Cairo / Giza / Sakkara / Cairo

(B,D)

This morning, head to **Sakkara** and the **Step Pyramid of King Djoser**, designed by Imhotep around 2670 B.C. Descend into the subterranean network of tunnels and chambers extending some 3.5 miles beneath the pyramid.

Visit **the painted tomb of Wahytje**, a high-ranking priest who served around 2415 to 2405 B.C. The nearly intact tomb was discovered in November 2018 to great fanfare. Lunch is at leisure.

After an early dinner this evening, enjoy an exclusive after-hours visit to the newly opened **Grand Egyptian Museum**, which houses the world's largest collection of ancient Egyptian artifacts. The museum presents the complete funerary treasure of Tutankhamun, a collection of more than 5,000 objects, for the first time since the tomb's discovery in 1922.

Luxor Temple

Sunday, January 3:
Cairo / Luxor

(B,L,D)

This morning, board a privately chartered flight to **Luxor**, the site of ancient **Thebes**. Check into the **Hilton Luxor Resort & Spa** for an overnight stay. This afternoon, walk the **Avenue of Sphinxes**, the 1.7-mile processional road connecting Karnak to Luxor Temple.

Continue to **Karnak**, the largest religious complex ever constructed, covering over 247 acres and developed over 2,000 years. Enter the **Great Hypostyle Hall**, the world's largest religious hall. Gather for dinner this evening.

Monday, January 4:
Luxor / Embark Sanctuary Nile Adventurer (B,L,D)

Enjoy a guided morning tour of the **Luxor Museum**, whose collection focuses on artifacts from the Theban temples and necropolis.

Make your way to *Sanctuary Nile Adventurer*, enjoy lunch on board, and settle in. Later, at sunset, explore **Luxor Temple**, built primarily by Amenhotep III in the 14th century B.C. Gather for dinner aboard the riverboat this evening.

Tuesday, January 5:

Luxor (B,L,D)

Cross to the **West Bank**, the ancient Theban necropolis. Stop to view the twin **Colossi of Memnon**, each standing 60 feet tall and carved from single blocks of quartzite sandstone.

Enter the **Valley of the Kings**, where nearly every ruler from Thutmose I to Ramesses X carved tombs deep into the limestone. Explore **the tomb of Tutankhamun (KV62)**, then view **the tomb of Seti I (KV17)**, whose walls display some of the finest painted reliefs in the valley.

At **Deir el-Bahari**, view **Queen Hatshepsut's mortuary temple**. Return to *Sanctuary Nile Adventurer* for lunch and a leisurely afternoon before gathering for dinner this evening.



Kom Ombo

Wednesday, January 6:

Edfu / Kom Ombo (B,L,D)

Arrive in **Edfu** to explore the **Temple of Horus**, built during the Ptolemaic period and dedicated to the falcon god.

After lunch aboard *Sanctuary Nile Adventurer*, continue to **Kom Ombo**, where the temple's design is symmetrical, with duplicate courts, halls, and sanctuaries dedicated to two gods: Sobek, the crocodile deity, and Horus the Elder. This evening, gather for a festive Egyptian dinner.

Thursday, January 7:

Aswan (B,L,D)

From **Aswan**, travel by local boat to the island-set **Temple of Philae**. Built primarily during the Ptolemaic and Roman periods, the complex blends Egyptian pylons with Hellenistic colonnades.

Next, visit the **Nubian Museum** and its collection of over 3,000 artifacts. Alternatively, venture to the **Unfinished Obelisk** in Aswan's ancient granite quarries. Gather for a festive farewell dinner this evening.

Friday, January 8:

Aswan / Disembark / Abu Simbel / Cairo (B,L,D)

Depart by privately chartered flight to **Abu Simbel** and view the temples of Ramesses II, which were carved directly from a mountainside between approximately 1264 and 1244 B.C. These temples were relocated in the 1960s to save them from submersion due to the building of the High Dam.

After lunch, continue by private plane to Cairo, where you will gather for dinner this evening at the hotel.

Saturday, January 9:

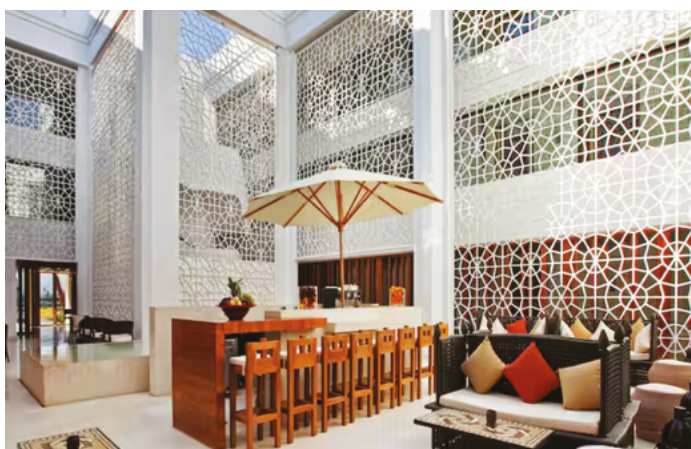
Cairo / Return (B)
