Historic Leaders, Great Houses & the Bayeux Tapestry

NEW May 9 to 21, 2027 ♦ From \$9,800* per person

The temporary return of the Bayeux Tapestry to Britain, on loan to the British Library, presents to us a rare moment to reconnect with the origins of a nation’s story. This extraordinary artifact, chronicling William the Conqueror’s triumph in 1066, serves as the evocative starting point for a journey that spans centuries of leadership, influence and innovation. From this pivotal turning point, our journey unfolds, tracing the lives and legacies of some of the greatest figures in political, royal, scientific and military history. Through visits to magnificent houses, historic estates and the very sites where defining moments took place, each chapter reveals the human stories behind power and an exploration of the individuals who shaped the modern world. From Sir Winston Churchill’s Chartwell to Henry VIII’s Hampton Court Palace, there is plenty to uncover.

Itinerary

May 9: Depart your home city and arrive the next day in London

May 10: Arrival

Upon arrival at Heathrow Airport, a private transfer will take you to our hotel, Hyatt Regency Churchill, London. In the evening, join the group for a welcome drink and canapés, followed by dinner.

May 11: London & The Bayeux Tapestry

Enjoy a free morning before heading to the British Library for the Bayeux Tapestry Exhibition. On loan from Bayeux in France, this extraordinary embroidery dates from the 11th century and depicts the events of 1064 to 1066.

Later, indulge in a traditional afternoon tea in the elegant Hansom Room at the St Pancras London, Autograph Collection.

May 12: Kensington Palace, Apsley House & Benjamin Franklin House

A private guided tour of Kensington Palace awaits, home to TRH The Prince and Princess of Wales and their family and featuring the beautiful Sunken Garden.

We also step into the grandeur of Apsley House, the London residence of the 1st Duke of Wellington, with an extraordinary collection of art.

Afterward, discover the fascinating story of one of America’s Founding Fathers with a visit to Benjamin Franklin House, set within a Georgian townhouse.

Please note: Benjamin Franklin House is unsuitable for anyone with mobility difficulties.

Osborne House

May 13: Eltham Palace & Down House

We take a guided tour with an expert gardener at medieval Eltham Palace, which boasts a Great Hall from the 1470s and served as a playground for the young Henry VIII.

Next is Down House, the former home of Charles Darwin and where he developed his revolutionary theory of evolution by natural selection.

May 14: Battle Abbey & The Battle of Hastings, Rye & Bodiam Castle

Step back in time with a visit to Battle Abbey and the battlefield of the Battle of Hastings. Here, in 1066, William the Conqueror secured his victory and forever altered the course of English history. He later founded the abbey to commemorate this triumph.

We stop at the enchanting town of Rye before visiting Bodiam Castle, an archetypal 14th-century moated castle with an original wooden portcullis, spiral staircases, tower rooms and battlements.

May 15: Dover Castle & Leeds Castle

We visit iconic Dover Castle, known as the ‘Key to England,’ which has witnessed sieges, royal intrigue and military innovation across the centuries.

Enjoy a traditional Ploughman’s lunch at the moated Leeds Castle, once a Norman stronghold, a royal residence for medieval queens, a palace for Henry VIII and a retreat for high society guests.

May 16: Quebec House & Chartwell

16th-century Quebec House offers a glimpse into Georgian family life and gives insight into General Wolfe, who secured Britain’s victory at the Battle of Quebec in 1759.

Our discovery of Chartwell offers an intimate glimpse into the life of Sir Winston Churchill, filled with his memorabilia. On our specialist guided tour, we learn about his leadership, his legacy and his creative passion for painting.

May 17: Blenheim Palace & Sulgrave Manor

The birthplace of Churchill, Blenheim is an awe-inspiring masterpiece set within magnificent



parkland landscaped by Capability Brown. We discover its grand collections during our guided tour before enjoying lunch here.

We step into American history at Sulgrave Manor, a Tudor home built by Lawrence Washington, ancestor of George Washington, where we learn more about the Washington family.

May 18: Hughenden Manor & Waddesdon Manor

Hughenden Manor was once the cherished residence of Benjamin Disraeli, Queen Victoria’s ‘favorite Prime Minister’, and later used for covert operations during World War II.

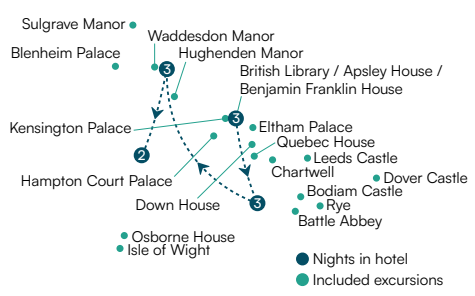
Another highlight today is château-inspired Waddesdon Manor, created by the Rothschild family and boasting an exceptional array of treasures, which we discover on our guided tour. Explore the exquisite grounds before heading to the Five Arrows Hotel for dinner.

May 19: Hampton Court Palace

We visit Hampton Court Palace, where our guided tour illuminates the fascinating world of the Tudor court. Highlights include Henry’s Great Hall, still bearing Anne Boleyn’s falcon badge, the vast Tudor kitchens and enchanting riverside gardens.

May 20: Osborne House & Isle of Wight

Used as a seaside retreat, we take an intimate glimpse of royal family life at Queen Victoria’s Osborne House, wandering through the magnificent Royal Apartments and the walled gardens.



Time and ferry schedules permitting, we hope to discover the charm of the Isle of Wight to round off our tour.

Itinerary

May 12: Depart your home city and arrive the next day in London May 13: Arrival

On arrival at Heathrow Airport, a private transfer will take you to our overnight hotel, the Macdonald Windsor Hotel in Windsor. In the evening, join the group for a welcome drink and canapés, followed by dinner.

May 14: RHS Garden Wisley & Great Comp Garden

We head to RHS Garden Wisley, the Royal Horticultural Society's flagship garden. From beautiful rose and demonstration gardens to tranquil tracts of woodland, Wisley offers a wealth of inspirational ideas and boasts a state-of-the-art Glasshouse. While at Wisley, we also enjoy lunch.

A private guided tour awaits at Great Comp, an RHS Partner Garden surrounding a lovely 17th-century manor. It's full of stunning plants such as salvias, magnolias, azaleas, rhododendrons

and hellebores and also features an Italian Garden, pretty woodland walks plus the Old Dairy Tearooms.

May 15: Great Dixter House & Gardens & Hole Park

We visit Great Dixter today, home of gardener and gardening writer Christopher Lloyd. An experienced horticulturalist treats us to a guided tour of the famous gardens, home to a spectacular mix of topiary, mixed borders, an orchard and a wildflower meadow. We also take a peek around the largely medieval house.

Today also includes Hole Park, owned by the Barham family for generations. We enjoy refreshments and time to admire the garden, discovering the wide range of blooms, bursting with fragrance and set against the far-reaching views over the hills and woodland.

May 16: Sissinghurst Castle Garden & The World Garden at Lullingstone Castle

An exclusive out-of-hours tour awaits at Sissinghurst Castle Garden, created in the 1930s by novelist Vita Sackville-West and her husband Harold Nicolson. Set around the ruins of an Elizabethan manor house, these world-famous gardens are laid out as a series of individually-planted 'rooms'.

We also make our way to Lullingstone Castle today. The World Garden here is home to thousands of rare plants collected from around the world by Tom Hart Dyke, the current heir. We find out more during our captivating gardens tour with a Blue Badge guide.

May 17: Eltham Palace & Greenwich

Today we visit Eltham Palace. Once a medieval palace, then highly popular for Christmas celebrations in Tudor times, it was leased from the Crown and transformed by millionaires into an Art Deco mansion in the 1930s. Outside, we take a guided tour with an expert Gardener, who shows us the Sunken Rose Garden, quiet Rock Garden, idyllic wildflower meadow, medieval embankment and the series of garden rooms.

We also spend time in maritime Greenwich today, home to fascinating attractions including Greenwich Park, Observatory and Royal Naval College.

May 16: Arrival

Upon arrival at Manchester Airport, a private transfer will take you to our hotel, Cottons Hotel & Spa, Knutsford. In the evening, join the group for a welcome drink and canapés, followed by dinner.

May 17: Quarry Bank Mill

Enjoy a guided tour of Quarry Bank Mill, where the Industrial Revolution comes to life through working machinery and vivid stories. Explore the historic cotton mill, visit the Apprentice House where child workers once lived and take time to wander scenic woodland paths and gardens along the River Bollin.

May 18: Brontë Parsonage Museum & Embsay & Bolton Abbey Steam Railway

We visit the charming hilltop village of Haworth, home of the Brontë sisters, and explore the preserved Parsonage Museum. Enjoy a nostalgic

journey on the Embsay & Bolton Abbey Steam Railway through the Yorkshire Dales, then relax with a delightful afternoon tea at a nearby venue.

May 19: Durham Cathedral & ‘The Angel of the North’

Take a guided tour of Durham Cathedral, exploring its rich history before visiting the Cathedral Museum at your leisure. Spend free time discovering Durham’s historic streets, university, or riverside walks. Later, relax on the journey to Alnwick, with a photo stop at the iconic Angel of the North.

May 20: Alnwick Castle & Cragside

We explore Alnwick Castle, the ancestral home of the Duke of Northumberland famed for film and television appearances, and admire its grand State Rooms and gardens. Then visit Cragside, the innovative hillside home of Lord Armstrong, renowned as the first house powered by hydroelectricity, filled with Victorian ingenuity and scenic surroundings.

May 21: Holy Island & Lindisfarne Priory & Castle

Discover the unique Holy Island of Lindisfarne, visiting the ruins of Lindisfarne Priory and its dramatic castle. Reached by a tidal causeway, the island offers a memorable arrival. Once a center of early Christianity and home to the Lindisfarne Gospels, it remains a place of striking beauty.

May 22: Bamburgh Castle & Seaton Delaval Hall

We head to Bamburgh Castle, set dramatically above the Northumberland coast, where we explore its historic halls, collections and stunning surroundings. Continue to Seaton Delaval Hall, a grand Baroque house designed by Sir John Vanbrugh, where exhibitions and restored gardens bring the lively history of the Delaval family to life.

May 23: Vindolanda Fort & Museum, Hadrian’s Wall & Hexham Abbey

Here, at the very frontier of the Holy Roman Empire, we explore Vindolanda on our guided tour, uncovering life along Hadrian’s Wall and viewing remarkable Roman artifacts in the museum. Stop at The Sill Discovery Center for lunch at your leisure and countryside views, then visit Hadrian’s Wall. We conclude at Hexham Abbey, discovering its rich 1,300-year history on a guided tour.

May 24: Raby Castle

Take a private guided tour of Raby Castle, a magnificent fortress shaped by the Neville family. Explore its richly decorated interiors, spanning medieval to Victorian styles, and admire an impressive art collection. Afterward, relax and enjoy a picnic lunch within the historic surroundings of this remarkable estate.



May 25: Blackwell House, Grasmere, Dove Cottage & The Wordsworth Museum

Embark on a guided tour of Blackwell, an Arts and Crafts masterpiece with original features and Lakeland views. Then visit Dove Cottage, home of William Wordsworth, for a curator-led tour showcasing personal items, manuscripts and rare pieces, offering a fascinating insight into the poet’s life and legacy.

May 26: Steam Yacht Gondola, Brantwood & Muncaster Castle

Enjoy a scenic cruise aboard the National Trust-restored Steam Yacht Gondola on Coniston Water, followed by a visit to Brantwood, the former home of John Ruskin. Later, explore Muncaster Castle on a private evening tour, discovering its history, collections, gardens and legends before a special dinner inside the castle. It promises to be one of the most memorable highlights on our tour.

May 27: Lake Windermere Cruise, Holker Hall & Levens Hall

We begin with a relaxing cruise on Lake Windermere, taking in spectacular Lakeland scenery. Upon arrival at Heathrow Airport, a private transfer will take you to the Macdonald Windsor Hotel, Windsor. In the evening, join the group for a welcome drink and canapés, followed by dinner.

June 3: Stamford & Burghley House

Our first stop is the handsome market town of Stamford, often regarded as one of England’s most beautiful stone-built towns. June 4: Belton House & Belvoir Castle

The elegant Belton House, cared for by the National Trust, is one of England’s finest country houses and a striking example of Gothic Revival architecture. Afterward, we continue to the impressive Belvoir Castle, home to the Dukes of Rutland. A guided tour reveals lavish interiors, fine art and historic treasures before we enjoy a traditional afternoon tea.

June 5: Chatsworth, Buxton & the Peak District

One of the highlights of our tour awaits us at Chatsworth House, home of the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire. Set within a magnificent Capability Brown landscape, this celebrated estate is renowned for its grand interiors, outstanding art collection and beautiful gardens. Following a finger buffet lunch, we enjoy the fascinating Duties & Delights guided tour, exploring both the magnificent state rooms and the hidden world of the servants who kept the house running.

Afterward, we journey to Middlethorpe Hall & Spa, a beautiful red-brick country house built at the end of the 17th century and now one of the three Historic House Hotels of the National Trust.

June 7: Fairfax House, York Minster & York

An orientation tour introduces the historic city of York, one of England’s most captivating heritage destinations. Highlights include the medieval Shambles and York Minster, one of Europe’s greatest Gothic cathedrals, which we discover on a guided tour.

We also enjoy an exclusive curator-led tour of Fairfax House, one of Britain’s finest Georgian townhouses. Beautifully restored to its 18th-century splendor, the house offers a fascinating glimpse into Georgian high society. Afterward, enjoy free time to explore York at your own pace.

June 8: Harewood House & York Historical Pub Tour

Set within beautiful Capability Brown parkland, Harewood House is one of England’s finest treasure houses. Following a guided tour, we enjoy lunch and time to explore the gardens and grounds. Later, a fascinating walking tour reveals York’s rich history through its famous historic pubs, uncovering stories of merchants, soldiers and local characters who helped shape the city. The evening is then free to enjoy York at leisure.

June 9: Fountains Abbey & Studley Royal Water Garden, Harrogate

The spectacular ruins of Fountains Abbey stand within the beautiful Studley Royal Water Garden. Together, they form a UNESCO World Heritage Site renowned for its beauty and historical significance. Later, free time in the elegant spa town of Harrogate offers the chance to explore its handsome architecture, gardens and shops at leisure.

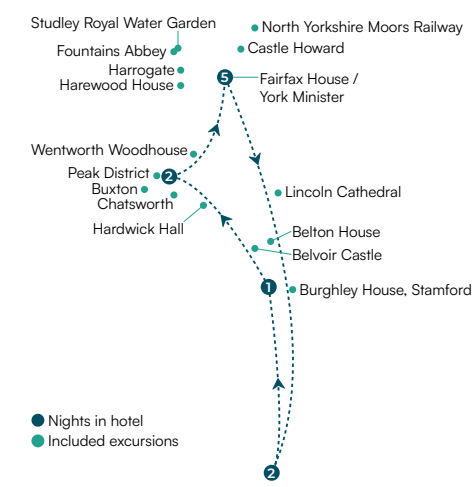
June 10: Castle Howard & North Yorkshire Moors Railway

Home to the Howard family for more than 300 years, the estate is renowned for its richly decorated interiors and extensive collections of art and antiques. We turn from aristocratic grandeur to poetic heritage with a guided tour of Burns Cottage, the thatched cottage where Scotland's national poet was born. Next is Hill House, designed by Mackintosh, where delicate stencilling, stained glass and elegant furniture come together in a harmony of Art Nouveau and Scottish tradition.

June 23: Inveraray Castle & Loch Lomond Cruise

Soak up the views of Loch Fyne to Inveraray Castle, the ancestral seat of the Dukes of Argyll, where the castle's collections span the centuries. We take a private guided tour before having time in Inveraray. We also enjoy the stunning Scottish scenery on a Loch Lomond cruise.

June 24: Scenic Drive – Glencoe, Trossachs National Park & Loch Tay

Sit back and relax on a journey through the spectacular landscapes which Scotland is so famous for.

June 25: Blair Castle, The Queen's Viewpoint & Blair Athol Distillery

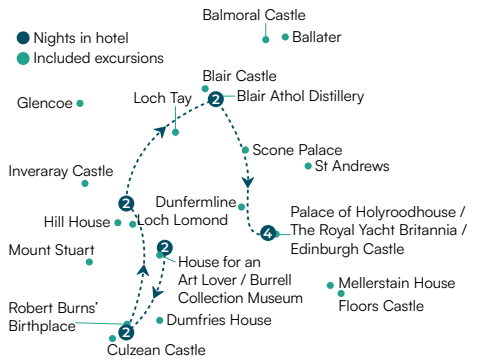

June 23: Arrival

Upon arrival at Manchester Airport, a private transfer will take you to our hotel, the Crewe Hall Hotel & Spa in Cheshire. In the evening, join the group for a welcome drink and canapés, followed by dinner.

June 24: Lyme Park & Chatsworth

June 25: Dunham Massey & Tatton Park

Our visit to Dunham Massey includes the Georgian house, deer park and gardens, where we can explore the history, admire interiors and spot ancient trees and fallow deer. We then head to Altrincham on market day for free time among artisan stalls, street food and independents. Later, visit Tatton Park’s neo-classical mansion and seasonal gardens, enhanced with a guided history tour.

Plas Newydd

June 26: Speke Hall & Chester

We visit Speke Hall, a timber-framed Tudor house near the Mersey, built by the Norris family under Elizabeth I. Discover hidden features like a priest’s hole and whispering gallery, then explore the gardens. In Chester, admire black-and-white architecture, medieval two-tier shopping arcades and landmarks including the cathedral, Roman amphitheatre and historic Town Hall.

June 27: Brynkinalt Estate, Pontcysyllte Aqueduct & Llangollen

Today we discover Brynkinalt Estate, a Grade II-listed hall from 1612. The Trevor family has preserved this historic home, with roots tracing back to Severa, daughter of Emperor Maximus and Gwrtheyrn Gwrtheneu, an ancient British king. We enjoy a guided tour and refreshments, see the UNESCO-listed Pontcysyllte Aqueduct, a real marvel over the Dee, and explore Llangollen.

June 28: Llandudno & Bodnant Garden

Enjoy leisure time in Llandudno, the ‘Queen of the Welsh Resorts,’ known for its golden beach and Victorian charm. Take the chance to stroll the promenade or shop at the Victoria Center. Today’s highlight is Bodnant Garden in Snowdonia’s foothills. Established by Henry Pochin over 150 years ago, it features plants collected by renowned hunters like Ernest Wilson. We explore its National Collections on a self-guided tour.

June 29: Welsh Highland Heritage Railway & Caernarfon

We travel to Porthmadog to board the Welsh Highland Railway for a scenic journey to Caernarfon. Passing through Snowdonia National Park, we enjoy views of mountains, forests and coastline. In Caernarfon, there’s time to explore the royal town, known for Prince Charles’s investiture in 1969. The journey is enhanced by Gold Service aboard the *Snowdonia Star*.

June 30: Plas Newydd, Puffin Island & Penrhyn Castle

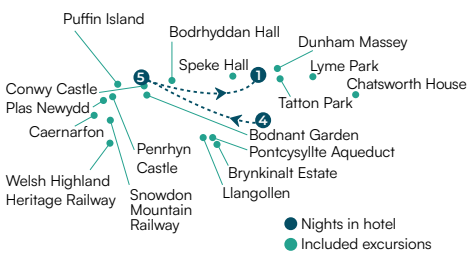
We cross the Menai Bridge to Anglesey to visit Plas Newydd, home of the Marquess of Anglesey, with Rex Whistler-inspired interiors and vibrant gardens. The wonderful sights continue with a memorable wildlife cruise around the nearby Puffin Island, taking in the coastal scenery while keeping watch for Atlantic gray seals and an array of seabirds. As the name suggests, puffins are a seasonal highlight, and with a bit of luck, we may even spot porpoises or dolphins playing in the waters. We then explore Penrhyn Castle, a neo-Norman 19th-century estate featuring grand interiors, art collections, restored kitchens and views of Snowdonia.

July 1: Snowdon Mountain Railway

The Snowdon Mountain Railway offers an unforgettable journey to Wales’s highest peak, Mount Snowdon (Yr Wyddfa). Departing from Llanberis, this historic railway has carried passengers since 1896. As the train climbs, enjoy stunning views of Snowdonia’s valleys and cliffs. On clear days, the summit offers panoramas across Snowdonia and the Irish Sea.

July 2: Conwy Castle, Conwy & Bodrhyddan Hall

We visit the walled town of Conwy to explore Conwy Castle, a UNESCO World Heritage Site built by Edward I in the 13th-century conquest of Wales. Enjoy free time to stroll the quayside



and browse shops before visiting Bodrhyddan Hall, a long-held family home with gardens, fine portrait collections and a 3,000-year-old Egyptian mummy. This evening, enjoy a farewell dinner together at the hotel.

July 9: Arrival

On arrival at Heathrow Airport, a private transfer will take you to the Audleys Wood Hotel. In the evening, join the group for a welcome drink, followed by dinner.

July 10: Highclere Castle & Winchester

On our exclusive access day, Highclere Castle opens its doors solely for guests of Albion and our sister companies, a rare privilege at one of England’s most celebrated country houses. Known worldwide as the setting for *Downton Abbey*, Highclere is first and foremost a living family home, seat of the Earl and Countess of Carnarvon. We explore the opulent interiors featured in the series, discovering the real history of Highclere, remodelled in the 19th century by Sir Charles Barry and used as a hospital during WWI. Downstairs, the fascinating Egyptian Exhibition

tells the story of the 5th Earl of Carnarvon’s role in the discovery of Tutankhamun’s tomb.

Later, time in Winchester offers independent discovery in England’s ancient former capital, with the option to visit Winchester Cathedral or the Great Hall to see the legendary Round Table of King Arthur.

July 11: Beaulieu & the National Motor Museum

The Beaulieu Estate in the New Forest offers an engaging look at aristocratic life, past and present. We enjoy a guided tour of Palace House, once the gatehouse of the medieval Beaulieu Abbey and the ancestral home of the Montagu family since 1538. Remodeled and extended in the 1800s, it is now a fine example of a Victorian Gothic-style country house.

A light sandwich lunch is included before time to explore the wider estate at leisure. Highlights include the fascinating National Motor Museum, housing an extraordinary collection of historic vehicles, as well as the ruins of Beaulieu Abbey.

On departure, a scenic drive through the New Forest showcases a quintessentially English landscape.

July 12: Blenheim Palace

Blenheim Palace, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and birthplace of Winston Churchill, this masterpiece by Sir John Vanbrugh sits within sweeping parkland designed by Capability Brown. A guided tour and included lunch enhance the experience, with access to the magnificent State Rooms. As the seat of the Dukes of Marlborough, Blenheim remains one of Britain’s most powerful aristocratic symbols. Time is also spent in nearby Woodstock for independent exploration.

July 13: Waddesdon Manor & Oxford

Waddesdon Manor, built in the 1870s by Baron Ferdinand de Rothschild, is a spectacular French-style château set in the Buckinghamshire countryside. Created for entertaining, it houses an outstanding collection of French decorative arts, Old Masters and English portraiture.

A guided house tour is followed by time to explore the formal gardens, from the Parterre to the Rococo-style aviary, before departing for Oxford, where the afternoon is free to explore the historic university city at leisure.

July 14: Sulgrave Manor & Broughton Castle

American history comes to life at Sulgrave Manor, the Tudor home of the Washington family and ancestral link to George Washington. Built in the mid-1500s by Lawrence Washington, the manor explores this unique transatlantic connection on a guided visit, having been restored as a memorial of shared heritage between Britain and the United States.

Later, a guided tour of Broughton Castle reveals a beautifully preserved moated manor still owned by the Fiennes family since the 14th century. Rich in portraits and political history, it hosted royal visitors and played a role in the tensions leading to the English Civil War.

July 15: Hatfield House & Hughenden

Hatfield House, one of England’s finest Jacobean mansions, was built in 1611 by Robert Cecil, advisor to Elizabeth I. Still home to the Marquess of Salisbury, it features richly decorated State Rooms, the Grand Staircase and extensive gardens and parkland. Its cinematic legacy includes *The Crown* and *Bridgerton*.

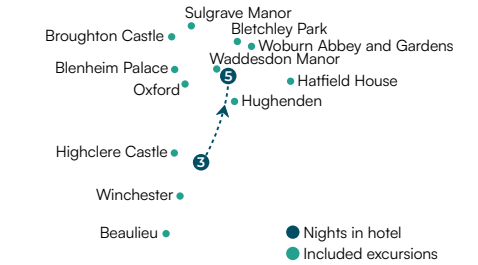
We also visit Hughenden Manor, former home of Victorian Prime Minister Benjamin Disraeli, offering a more intimate look at 19th-century political life within the Chiltern Hills. Tonight’s dinner is served at the historic Grade II-listed Five Arrows Inn.

July 16: Woburn Abbey and Gardens & Bletchley Park

Woburn Abbey, home of the Dukes of Bedford for nearly 400 years, is one of the great Treasure Houses of England. Its State Rooms display an exceptional art collection including works by Reynolds, Gainsborough and Canaletto, set within elegant interiors overlooking landscaped gardens.

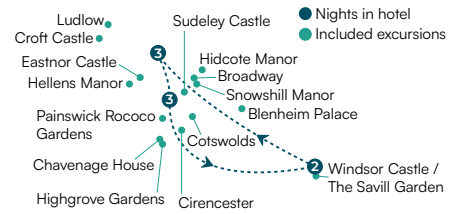

One of the country's finest Jacobean houses and once home to the Boleyn family, Blickling is celebrated for its impressive Great Hall and superb 18th-century Long Gallery. Our next included visit is Chiswick House and Gardens. During our guided house tour, we discover this masterpiece of the Palladian style before strolling the grounds, the birthplace of the English Landscape Movement.

August 20: Osterley Park and House & Hatchlands Park

We delve into 18th-century aristocratic life at Osterley, a magnificent estate with restored formal gardens. The house features stunning interiors that showcase Robert Adam’s neoclassical designs — it’s no surprise that this Georgian gem has appeared in *Bridgerton*.

Today also includes an introductory welcome talk followed by a self-guided audio headset tour of Hatchlands Park, a classic red-brick country house featuring a parterre garden designed by Gertrude Jekyll. The house is crammed with Robert Adam’s fine ceiling decorations and boasts Europe’s largest collection of keyboard instruments.

August 21: Brighton Pavilion & Brighton

On a private guided tour, we discover Brighton Pavilion, built for George IV as a seaside palace and a combination of Regency and Indo-Saracenic styles.

Afterward, enjoy some free time to visit Brighton’s iconic pier and stroll the seafront promenade as wealthy Georgians once did.

August 22: Petworth House & Salisbury Cathedral

Immortalized in Turner’s paintings, 17th-century Petworth House is nestled in a deer park landscaped by Capability Brown and is home to the National Trust’s finest collection of art and sculptures. Fans of *Bridgerton* may also recognize various filming locations here too.

We continue to Salisbury Cathedral, boasting the tallest spire in Britain and the best-preserved version of the 1215 Magna Carta.

August 23: Stourhead

We’re treated to a gardener-led tour of our hotel estate before heading to Stourhead. Our time here includes a guided house tour, discovering its Chippendale furniture and fine Regency library, a walled garden tour and afternoon tea at the Temple of Apollo, which featured in *Pride & Prejudice* (2005).

August 24: Bowood House & Gardens

We take a guided tour of Bowood House, the family home of the Marquis and Marchioness of Lansdowne with Capability Brown surroundings. The ‘Georgian Ladies of the House’ exhibition provides a glimpse into life above and below stairs for 18th-century women here.

August 25: The Roman Baths & Bath Walking Tour

An audio-guided visit brings the history of the Roman Baths to life, where steaming thermal waters still flow through the well-preserved ancient bathing complex.

We continue with a guided walking tour of Regency Bath, with highlights including Bath Abbey, the Pump Room and Pulteney Bridge.

August 26: Bath & No. 1 Royal Crescent, Bath

Enjoy some free time to explore Bath. Later, we visit an iconic address — No 1 Royal Crescent. We’re treated to an after-hours guided tour by a curator of this Georgian townhouse museum, used for the exterior of Lady Featherington’s home in *Bridgerton*. We hear how high society descended on Bath for ‘the season’, while enjoying wine and canapés.



August 27: Sezincote House & Garden, Broadway & the Cotswolds

Soak up the rolling landscapes of the Cotswolds on the way to exotic Sezincote, featuring a weathered-copper onion dome, elegant minarets, an exquisite orangery and more. It was a visit by the Prince Regent here that led him to redesign plans for Brighton Pavilion, and we learn more during our guided tour.

Afterward, enjoy some time in Broadway. Often referred to as the ‘Jewel of the Cotswolds’, this picturesque village is known for its charming streets lined with honey-colored stone buildings, boutique shops and art galleries.

August 28: Painswick Rococo Gardens & Regency Cheltenham

Painswick Rococo Garden awaits, with its playful architecture, winding paths and colorful flowerbeds. We enjoy a guided tour, focusing on its history and restoration.

The afternoon is left free to explore Cheltenham, a celebrated spa town with Regency treasures.

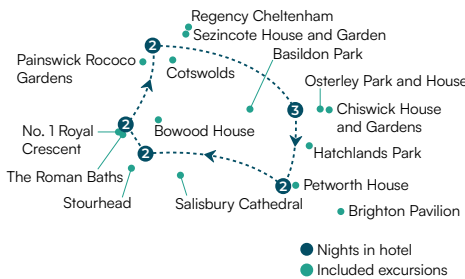

September 23: Dunbrody Famine Ship, Waterford & Mount Congreve Gardens

Ireland's history is brought to life today with a guided tour at the Dunbrody Famine Ship, learning about the bravery of Irish people onboard an authentic replica of an 1840s emigrant boat. After weeks spent dangerously crossing the Atlantic, the emigrants arrived in North America and made up a quarter of the population in Boston, New York City, Philadelphia and Baltimore by 1850.

Afterward, enjoy some free time in the city of Waterford before we continue to Mount Congreve Gardens, a horticultural masterpiece of exotic plants. We are treated to a tour with the Estate Director.

September 24: Kilkenny Castle & Rock of Cashel

Kilkenny Castle is a majestic fortress that has stood since the 12th century. We explore the period rooms and learn more about the significant events witnessed here during our guided tour.

Lunch is served at a traditional Irish pub in Kilkenny before a guided tour at the Rock of Cashel, one of Ireland's top archaeological spots.

September 25: Cork & Titanic Exhibition Cobh

Spend some free time in Cork before we head to Cobh. As the last port of call for the Titanic, our guided tour at the Titanic Experience offers a unique insight into the lives of the passengers who boarded the ship here.

September 26: Blarney Castle & Kinsale

We visit the medieval Blarney Castle, built nearly 600 years ago by a powerful Irish magnate. Millions have flocked here to kiss the legendary Stone of Eloquence but there is so much more to see. The rest of the day is spent at leisure in Kinsale, a pretty harbor town in County Cork.

September 27: Ring of Kerry

Our tour manager takes us on a scenic guided tour of the Ring of Kerry, journeying through an untouched landscape of tranquil lakes and rolling hills.

September 28: Killarney National Park & Bunratty Castle and Folk Park

We head to pretty Killarney, famed for its jaunting cars (horse-drawn carts) operated by the local jarvies. We experience it for ourselves before heading to Bunratty Castle and Folk Park, Ireland's most complete castle. Admire the extensive great hall, atmospheric dungeons and fairytale towers before discovering the surrounding Folk Park, offering a glimpse into 19th-century Irish village life. We also enjoy lunch here.

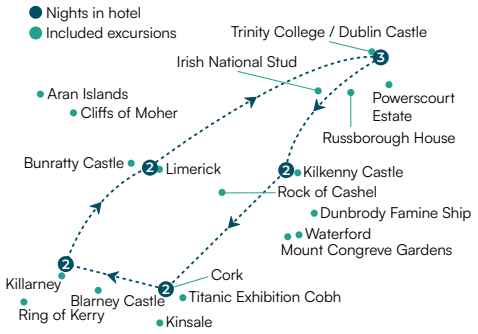
September 29: Aran Islands & Cliffs of Moher Cruise

We catch the ferry to the smallest of the Aran Islands, Inisheer. This charming island is renowned for its rich cultural heritage, pristine beaches and beautiful landscapes, peppered with ancient stone forts and traditional cottages, where the Irish language is still widely spoken. We are treated to a pony and trap tour to take in the highlights of this delightful isle, the old-fashioned way.

We also enjoy a leisurely cruise along the magnificent Cliffs of Moher, enjoying the geological wonders from below, admiring the views of the Aran Islands, listening to the onboard commentary and spotting colonies of cliff-nesting seabirds.

September 30: Limerick & Irish National Stud

We spend some free time in Limerick, then combine the world of horses with serene Japanese gardens with a guided tour at the Irish National Stud. This evening, we enjoy a farewell dinner together at the hotel.



October 1: Departure

A private transfer will take you back to Dublin Airport for your return flight home.

In August 1485, Richard III was killed during the Battle of Bosworth, thus conceding the throne to Henry VII. This changing of the guard ended the 300-year-long Plantagenet rule, established the Tudor dynasty and altered the course of British history thereafter. September 21: Bosworth Battlefield, Leicester Guildhall & Leicester Cathedral

Today we explore the history behind the infamous battle between Henry Tudor and Richard III, beginning with the fascinating Bosworth Battlefield Heritage Center.

Next is Leicester Guildhall, a beautifully preserved medieval building which features exhibits on Richard III, who was killed at the Battle of Bosworth and found underneath a city-center car park in 2012. We can see his tomb at our final stop, Leicester Cathedral.

September 22: Shakespeare's Stratford-upon-Avon & RSC Shakespeare Theatre

An exciting day in Shakespeare's Stratford-upon-Avon awaits. We explore the half-timbered house where he was born, the beautiful garden and exhibition center at Shakespeare's New Place, the Schoolroom where he wrote his first works, Anne Hathaway's idyllic cottage and the iconic RSC Swan Theater, where Shakespeare's plays are regularly performed.

September 23: Charlecote Park & Coughton Court

While Stratford is synonymous with Shakespeare's theatrical success, there lurks in nearby Charlecote Park's history a far less respectable connection; the famous playwright is rumoured to have been caught poaching deer here! Home to the Lucy family for 900 years, this Tudor manor is a real treasure.

We continue to the Coughton Court, boasting a rich history intertwined with Tudor monarchs, where we enjoy afternoon tea and an introductory talk, learning how the priest hole here provides an insight into the country's history of the Catholic faith.

September 24: Baddesley Clinton, Lord Leycester's Hospital & Warwick

Once owned by a powerful Tudor family, Baddesley Clinton is a moated, medieval manor house dating back to the 13th century. We see how the extensive formal gardens provided the setting for some fascinating stories.

Next is Lord Leycester's Hospital in Warwick, renowned for its distinctive timber-framed architecture. We learn about its history on a guided tour before spending a little free time in Warwick, home to one of England's best-preserved collections of black and white timber-framed Tudor buildings.

September 25: Knole House & The Royal Oak Foundation Conservation Studio & Haver Castle

We visit one of Britain's most important historic homes, Knole House, once used by Henry VIII as a hunting lodge. Whilst here, we explore the Royal Oak Foundation Conservation Studio — the first of its kind in the National Trust.

Next is the magnificent Haver Castle, the childhood home of Henry VIII's second wife, Anne Boleyn. Dating back to the late 13th century, this double-moated castle is home to various historic artifacts, including two prayer books inscribed by Anne Boleyn. The castle was lavishly restored by American millionaire William Waldorf Astor, in the early 20th century. We enjoy a guided tour of the castle's elegant interior and its grand exterior, comprising 125 acres of award-winning gardens.

September 26: Sissinghurst Castle Garden & Leeds Castle

An exclusive out-of-hours tour awaits at Sissinghurst Castle Garden, set around the ruins of an Elizabethan manor house.

We continue to the moated Leeds Castle, once home to Henry VIII who transformed it for Catherine of Aragon. Admire the wealth of furnishings, paintings, tapestries and antiques here, followed by a Ploughman's lunch.

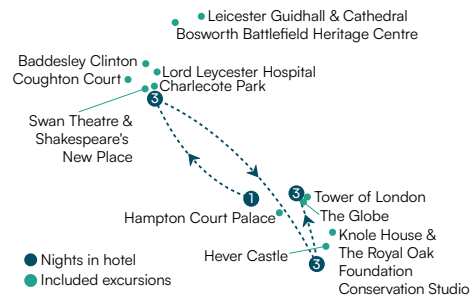
September 27: Eltham Palace & Shakespeare's Globe Theater

Today we see Eltham Palace, where Henry VIII spent much of his childhood. Outside, we are treated to a guided tour with an expert Gardener.

There's also time in Greenwich for lunch at your leisure before we journey down the river on the Thames Clipper. Shakespeare's Globe is our destination, which brings the Bard's timeless works to life in a setting that evokes the atmosphere of his era. We find out more during our guided tour.

September 28: London & the Tower of London

Explore the iconic sights of London at your leisure today. Later this afternoon, we enjoy entrance to the Tower of London, where we have the chance to see the dazzling Crown Jewels. Elizabeth I (prior to her coronation) and multiple wives of Henry VIII were once kept here as prisoners. After our visit, there's an opportunity to find somewhere for dinner before returning to the Tower of London for the time-travelling Ceremony of the Keys.



September 29: Hampton Court Palace

We make our way to Hampton Court Palace for a dive into the fascinating world of the Tudor court and Henry VIII during a guided tour. Believed to have staged some of Shakespeare's plays and one of the greatest surviving Tudor buildings, it is a fitting end to our wonderful tour.

This evening, we enjoy a farewell dinner together at the hotel.

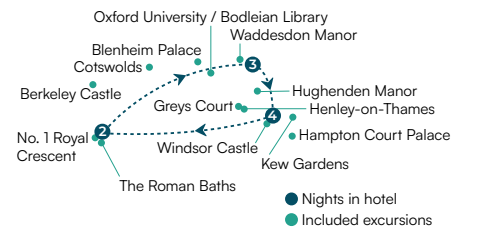

Next is nearby Cathedral Lodge, where we enjoy afternoon tea and an insightful talk about Charles Dickens from a guest speaker.

December 9: Leeds Castle

We make our way to the moated Leeds Castle, which has been a Norman stronghold, the royal residence of six medieval queens and was once home to Henry VIII and Catherine of Aragon. We find out more during our private guided tour before our two-course lunch.

December 10: Penshurst Place & Hever Castle

Today we visit medieval Penshurst Place, used as a hunting lodge by Henry VIII and owned by the Sidney family since 1552. We are treated to seasonal refreshments and a guided house tour, with its medieval and Tudor features, magnificent Great Hall and decorated State Rooms.

Next is Hever Castle, the childhood home of Anne Boleyn, where we enjoy a two-course Christmas lunch. Admire the castle's artifacts, including two prayer books inscribed by Anne Boleyn, and its atmospheric interior, beautifully decorated for the festive season with fairy lights, log fires and twinkling trees.

December 11: Bateman's, Bodiam Castle & the Kent & East Sussex Railway

We visit Rudyard Kipling's Bateman's, where the ground floor is decorated for an Edwardian family Christmas with a roaring fire, a traditionally decorated tree and a table set for dinner.

Today also includes Bodiam Castle, an archetypal 14th-century moated castle which offers a glimpse of medieval splendor. Just imagine medieval revelers enjoying a cup of festive Wassail here!

We complete our day with a journey on the Kent & East Sussex Railway from Tenterden, watching the scenic Kent countryside pass by to the sounds of Christmas carols.

December 12: Polesden Lacey

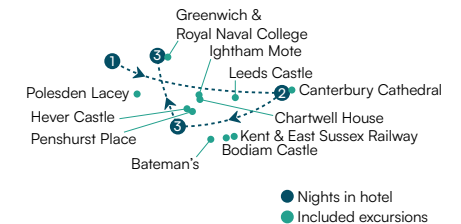
We visit one of the National Trust's most popular properties, Polesden Lacey, described as a 'delicious house' by the Queen Mother on her honeymoon and home to an extensive collection of art and ceramics, with immersive scenes creating a festive atmosphere.

This countryside retreat is most closely connected to Dame Margaret Greville, who entertained royalty and celebrities of her time with lavish parties.

December 13: Greenwich, Christmas Carols at the Royal Naval College & River Thames Sightseeing

We spend some time at leisure in Greenwich, home to fascinating attractions. Later, a festive treat awaits at the Royal Naval College, Greenwich, where we enjoy a Christmas carols concert in the Chapel of St Peter and St Paul, performed by the award-winning Trinity Labin Choir. Afterward, enjoy some mulled wine and a mince pie before exploring the Painted Hall, known as 'Britain's Sistine Chapel'.

From Greenwich, we journey up the river on the Thames Clipper to Westminster Pier. This is the perfect chance to see landmarks illuminated after dark, from the skyscrapers of Docklands to historic icons such as the Tower of London.



December 14: London

How do I make a booking?

When are payments due?

When you confirm your booking with us, a non-refundable deposit of \$1,000 per person is required to secure your place. The final balance payment must be paid to us no later than 120 days prior to the tour departure date. Of course, full payment can be made at the time of booking if you prefer and for bookings made less than 8 weeks before the tour departs this will be a requirement.

How can I pay?

We accept debit and credit cards for deposits and full payment.

What paperwork will I receive?

When your booking is confirmed, we will email you a booking confirmation document along with a copy of our full Terms and Conditions and the reading list. Approximately 28 days prior to the tour, we will prepare and send you our Travel Pack with your finalized information and tour itinerary details.

Do I need travel insurance?

Yes, this is essential; we can only accept a booking on the basis that you have taken out a full and comprehensive travel insurance policy to cover the full duration of your trip. We will ask you to confirm this to us. If you choose not to take out travel insurance, this is done so against our advice and at your own risk; we will ask you to sign a declination form indemnifying us from any responsibility or cost in the event of medical emergency or repatriation. National Trust Tours makes travel insurance available to its customers through USI Travel Insurance Services. Information will be sent to you upon request or with your confirmation letter from National Trust Tours.

Do I need a passport and visa?

It is your responsibility to ensure you have a full passport and we recommend that it is valid for 6 months after the return date of your trip. Tourist visas are not required for US citizens visiting the UK or Republic of Ireland, however for travel to the UK a new Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA) will now be required.

Electronic Travel Authorisations (ETA) are being introduced for visitors to the UK who currently do not require a visa for short stays, they are digitally linked to a traveller's passport and ensure more robust security checks are carried out before people begin their journey to the UK, helping prevent abuse of immigration systems.

An ETA costs £10 and permits multiple journeys to the UK for stays of up to 6 months at a time and is valid for 2 years or until the holders passport expires — whichever is sooner.

An ETA does not permit entry to the UK — it authorises an individual to travel to the UK. British & Irish citizens do not need an ETA.

Apply for an ETA

Applications can done via a smartphone app — UK ETA app or on line at Apply for an electronic travel authorisation (ETA) — GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

This is a simple process, and decisions are usually communicated within 3 days.

It remains your responsibility to ensure you have the correct travel documentation for your trip.

Are there single traveler room supplements?

Yes, all our featured hotels charge single supplements and prices are shown on the tour pages. Please book early as single rooms sell fast.

Are room upgrades available?

All of the hotels on these tours have been handpicked for their high quality of accommodation and service. However, in some instances room upgrades are available and we would be happy to assist you to arrange these should you be interested.

Yes, if you decide to arrive a few days before the start of the tour or leave a few days after the end of the tour, we are happy to arrange extra nights' accommodation. However, this service is only available at our featured hotels and a \$35 administration fee is charged.

Are meals included?

All breakfasts are included on all tours. Certain lunches and dinners are also included and you should study the tour itinerary in this brochure to determine what meals are included on your chosen tour. Meals not mentioned are not included and all beverages are at your own expense throughout the tour.

What do I do about any dietary requirements?

Please inform us at the time of booking, we will pass your information on to the hotel, property or restaurant who will do their best to accommodate your requirements.

How many passengers will be in the Albion Journeys tour group?

Typically, between 10 and 30.

What is the role of Tour Directors?

Our friendly Tour Director will meet you for a welcome dinner at the beginning of each tour. Their role is to facilitate the smooth organization of all operational aspects of the tour. If you have any queries or experience any issues during the tour, they are there to assist you.

Will the excursions change?

Please note that we plan our tours far in advance and the order and availability of excursions may be subject to change. In the event of a property not being available to visit, we will substitute with a similar visit,

and you will be informed of the full details. Note also that tours described as being led by property owners, curators and head gardeners are always subject to availability of the individuals concerned.

How much walking will there be on these tours?

Any included guided tours will operate at a fairly relaxed pace, but with many historic houses you may experience some uneven flooring along the way, and some rooms and levels may be inaccessible other than by stairs. You will, however, usually have the option to explore any venue by yourself at your own pace. Due to the distances covered, garden tours and guided city walking tours will often require slightly higher standards of mobility. It is essential that you inform us of any concerns at the time of booking, so that we can assess the suitability of your chosen tour in line with your specific requirements.

What are the arrangements for luggage?

The standard luggage allowance is one item of hand luggage and one suitcase per person restricted to a maximum weight of 20kgs (44 pounds). Unless stated otherwise we do provide portage at each of the hotels used on our tours, however, as with all things of a personal nature, it is your responsibility to ensure your suitcase is loaded onto the vehicles we use throughout the tour.

What clothing should I bring?

Comfortable leisurewear is recommended for the daytime. In the evening many participants prefer to wear smarter dress for dining. While gentlemen may choose to wear a jacket in the restaurant in the evening, at most hotels this is not obligatory, we will of course inform you if any hotel does have a dress code. It is advisable to bring layered clothing and a light waterproof jacket. We recommend sturdy footwear when visiting gardens as the ground may be soft underfoot. Many historic properties request ladies do not wear high heels which may damage flooring.

Can you arrange my flights to the UK?

Albion Journeys do not arrange your air travel for our tours; this is your responsibility and gives you the flexibility to decide on your own routing.

What should I budget for tipping?

While it is not compulsory, it is customary to tip the coach driver and Tour Director as well as offering a small gratuity to the transfer drivers to acknowledge the services they have provided. As a guideline we suggest a rate of £5 (about \$6.50 as of this printing) per day for your coach and transfer drivers and £10 (about \$13 as of this printing) per day for your Tour Director. Gratuities for hotel staff and the tour guides you may meet at properties are at your discretion.

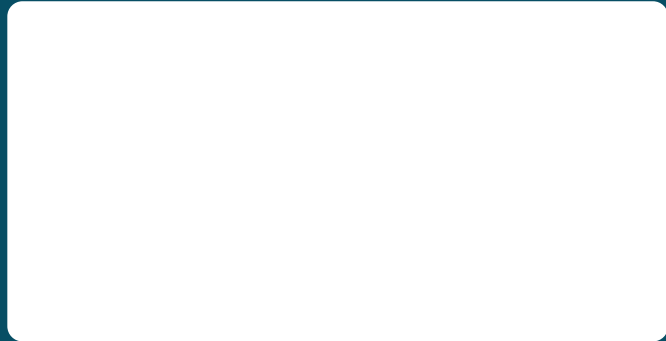
